**Delegates from Leixlip, Ireland visit Niles**



Thirty-four delegates from Leixlip, Ireland, arrived in Niles on Friday, October 6 for a six day visit. The purpose of their visit was to participate in a formal signing ceremony establishing Leixlip and Niles as Sister Cities. Leixlip will become the third Sister City to Niles. The other cities are Pisa, Italy and Napfion, Greece. The delegation was led by the Mayor of Leixlip, Catherine Murphy and Paul Kelly, Chairman of the Town Twinning Association. Leixlip is located about ten miles west of Dublin,

Ireland, and has a population of 15,000. Two American plants, Hewlett Packard and Intel are located in Leixlip.

The formal signing ceremony took place on Sunday, October 8, at the Niles Village Hall. Approximately 100 persons attended the event. Music was provided by the Notre Dame/Resurrection High School Band and the Emerald Society Pipe Band. An exchange of gifts followed the signing. Leixlip was presented with a bronze plaque to put in their town square, and Niles was given the Leixlip town flag and a silver plate.

During the week, the delegation had the opportunity to tour municipal buildings, library, park district, and, at their request, our waste and recycling plants. They also had the opportunity to meet many of our residents, Village Board members and Sister Cities Association members. Discussions were held on ideas for ex-

changes between the two towns that would benefit both communities. Suggestions were given for establishing a Lions Club in Leixlip, a student email exchange, intern exchanges for municipal government and park districts, cultural exchanges and the possibility of athletic and economic development exchanges in the future.

A special thanks is due to all the Sister Cities Association members who acted as hosts for the visit, Dominick's at Civic Center Plaza, who donated the cakes for the ceremony and the many others who gave of their time and efforts for the delegation's visit. The group departed on Thursday, October 12, after a farewell dinner held the previous night.

**The importance of voting to retain judges**



Among the 77 Cook County judges who are helping educate the public about judges running for retention in the November general election are a number of judges who reside on Chicago's North Shore, including (standing, from left) Moshe Jacobius, James Fitzgerald Smith, Lee Preston, Alan J. Greiman, Michael B. Bolan, James D. Egan, and (seated, from left) Richard F. Walsh, Carole Kamin Bellows, Stuart A. Nudelman, Margaret O'Mara Frossard, and Garritt E. Howard. Voters will have the opportunity to vote "yes" or "no" on the green ballot for the retention judges when they vote for other candidates for public office on Tuesday, November 7. Retention judges must receive at least a 60 percent "yes" vote of those cast to remain in office.

It is essential that Cook County voters take the time to learn about the First District and Cook County judges running for retention on November 7, according to Gino DiVito, an attorney, former appellate court justice and chair of the Committee for Retention of Judges in Cook County, 2000.

"There are 77 non-partisan retention judges whose names will appear on the green ballot," DiVito said. "As a group, they are among the finest judges in Cook County and include some of the most highly-regarded judges of the county's circuit and reviewing courts. Most have outstanding individual records and should be retained."

A supreme court judge, three appellate court judges, and 73 circuit court judges - including four who are assigned to the appellate court - are up for retention. They preside over hundreds of thousands of cases filed annually in Cook County. Those cases cover the wide range of issues confronting our justice system, including child custody, divorce, criminal, and all the others that protect citizens and vindicate their rights.

Voters will have an opportunity to vote "yes" or "no" for the retention judges on the green retention ballot when they vote on Tuesday, Nov. 7 for other candidates for public office.

Among ways to become informed about a judge's record are through the news media and by the evaluations of the candidates by the bar associations. The bar associations rate each judge's experience, legal acumen, temperament, compassion, integrity, independence, fairness and freedom from bias. Results can be obtained directly from each bar association or by coverage given by the media.

In addition, DiVito pointed out, biographical information about each retention judge can be obtained on the Internet, at www.retentionjudges.com.

**Niles West Mascot Revisited**

Niles West High School opened in 1958 housing just freshman and sophomores. Juniors and seniors continued to attend Niles East. In 1959 Niles West became a traditional four year high school necessitating selection of a mascot and school colors.

Shortly after classes started at Niles West High School in 1959, the student body was given the opportunity to vote on their new school's colors and mascot. A process of elimination culminated in a vote between the Blue and White Lancers or the Red and White Indians. The vote came down heavily for Blue and White Lancers.

The administration, however, overruled the vote declaring that a tradition existed with Red and White Skokie Indians and that their say was final. I doubt many of the students knew anything about Skokie Indians.

I graduated from Niles Public School Spring 1959 and attended Niles West when this vote took place. I find it ironic that once again a decision is being made on this subject. I wonder if the voice of the students will be listened to this time.

Incidentally, a similar problem arose recently at a high school where I now live. Our Arapahoe High School faced the exact same accusations that I read about in "The Bugle." The image of the mascot was made more respectful and members of the Arapahoe Nation were invited to instruct the student body in Native American History and folklore. The result was greater mutual respect, increased education, and ongoing cultural exchange.

### Avoiding the bad taste of food poisoning

Even the healthiest foods can become unhealthy if improperly handled, cooked or stored. In the United States approximately 10,000 people die each year from food poisoning, and many more become ill and require medical attention.

**What is food poisoning?**  
"Food poisoning can be caused by several different bacteria, such as salmonella or botu-

lism," says Dr. Brian Aldred, an emergency physician and representative of the Illinois College of Emergency Physicians. "Although certain types of food poisoning can be fatal, most cases run their course in a couple of days."

Food poisoning symptoms usually begin from two hours to two days after eating the tainted food, said Dr. Aldred. The symptoms are similar to those of the flu and should be treated the same. They include headache, nausea, diarrhea and/or vomiting. However fever is more likely to occur with the flu.

**Is food poisoning serious?**  
Certain symptoms may signal a more serious case of food poisoning. Seek immediate medical treatment if you experience such severe vomiting that you become dehydrated. Most adults can handle one day without nutrition, but after that, continued vomiting requires medical attention. High fever also can indicate a more serious illness.

**What foods should I avoid?**  
"Any food can carry bacteria," says Dr. Aldred, "but meat, poultry and shellfish are the worst offenders, so you should

always use special care when preparing or storing these foods." He also warns that infants can get botulism from honey, even a small amount. "Adults can easily combat the botulism in honey, but infants are still susceptible," he added.

To help prevent food poisoning, always follow recommended precautions for food handling and preparation. Check dates on food labels, refrigerate raw foods and leftovers promptly, and thoroughly wash hands and utensils immediately after handling raw foods.

**What should I do if I get food poisoning?**

"To prevent dehydration," Dr. Aldred says, "it's important to begin sipping water or diluted juice as soon as active vomiting has decreased. Be aware, adults can handle dehydration much better than small children."

"If symptoms continue for more than 24 hours, or if you are unable to tolerate any fluids, contact your primary care doctor or visit the emergency department," advises Dr. Aldred.

## Learn the Polish Art of 'Wycinanki'

"Wycinanki," pronounced "Vee-chee-non-key" is one of the oldest art forms in Poland; it is the decorative art of papercutting, which drew inspiration from tapestries and painted decorations found in wealthy homes and then duplicated in paper for village dwellings. Today it is considered one of the most beautiful examples of folk art in the world. To preserve and pass on this tradition, Council 9 of the Polish Women's Alliance (PWA) is sponsoring a "Wycinanki" workshop at 1 p.m. on Sunday, November 19, at their National Headquarters, 205 S. Northwest Highway, Park Ridge.

Doris Sikorsky, a well-known folk artist, who will explain the history behind this form of art and its variations reflecting the different regions of Poland, will conduct the workshop. She will also teach participants how to make their own versions of "Wycinanki," which makes ideal Christmas cards. The program will feature three basic designs: the geometric square or "Kwadrat," a manger scene using the "Kurpie" technique and a Christmas tree in the multicolored "Lowicz" style.

Enrollment in the workshop is limited to 30 participants and a \$4 fee is required to cover the cost of the material; participants are asked to provide their own scissors. **Security firm gets 5-year "nod" from Niles H.S.**

An agreement is in place to provide security for both Niles Township high schools for the next five-year period.

American Heritage will provide around-the-clock security at Niles North and Niles West high schools. The cost of this service will be \$773,361 in the current school year, escalating to \$868,000 in 2004-05.

For the first time security personnel will be on duty 24 hours a day, and seven days a week. American Heritage employees working events like football games will receive a rate of \$24 an hour in the first contract year and \$30 per hour by the contract's final year.

The security plan for 2000-01 calls for 16 personnel on duty at each school - more than double the number used last year. District 219 also uses some in-house security personnel, including a small number of officers from the schools' support staff union.





### Strokes and mini-strokes on the rise

Results were announced recently at the American Stroke Association's 25th International Stroke Conference. The American Stroke Association is a division of the American Heart Association.

According to researchers at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn., there were 751,000 strokes in the United States in 1999 and another 500,000 transient ischemic attacks (TIA), or "mini-strokes,"

affecting a total of more than 1.2 million people.

The American Heart Association estimates about 600,000 new and recurrent strokes occur in Americans each year. That figure does not count TIAs.

"When we applied our findings to 1999 estimated Census data, we found about 1.2 million strokes or TIAs occur in Americans each year - and that's a conservative estimate," says the study's lead author, Robert D. Brown, Jr., M.D., associate professor of neurology at the Mayo Medical School and a staff neurologist in the department of neurology at the Mayo Clinic. "The new data are important in our understanding the overall burden of stroke in the population."

Using population data from Rochester - an important source of health information for several decades - investigators found stroke incidence hadn't changed over the past 15 years, suggesting pervasively published numbers of strokes per year may be too low.

Incidence is the number of new cases of a disease that develop in a population during a specific time period, usually a year.

Mayo Clinic researchers have collected detailed health data regarding stroke in residents of Rochester that have occurred since 1935. Brown says that data show a decline in stroke incidence from the 1960s until the mid-1970s when the decline began to level off. The largest research shows that not only is the incidence of stroke in Rochester no longer declining, but is actually slightly higher than 10 to 15 years ago.

Examining data from 1990 through 1994, Brown's group found the total incidence of all stroke types - including first, second, and all subsequent strokes occurring in Rochester residents during the five-year period - was 256 per 100,000 each year.

When Brown and his team added together the number of strokes and the number of TIAs, they calculated it to be an incidence of 481 per 100,000 per year.

Counting TIAs is difficult, say the investigators, because the symptoms - such as weakness or numbness - are variable and are sometimes ignored by patients.

"When we cite incidence rates, we are referring to the first lifetime event of that particular type, such as a first stroke or a first heart attack," says Brown. "To obtain a better estimate of the overall burden of a disease in the population, it is important to consider second, third, and other recurrent events. Those recurrent result in significant health care expenditures, and greatly increase the burden of the disease."

Brown's group used data from Rochester and added to research by Dr. Joseph Broderick of the University of Cincinnati.

Broderick's research - published in the February 1998 issue of Stroke: Journal of the American Heart Association - counted first-ever recurrent strokes and included a more racially-diverse population that other studies from Rochester and Framingham, Mass. Broderick's team estimated that 731,000 Americans have strokes each year. "Combining the data from Broderick's study - which estimates the number of blacks having strokes, with our new figures on whites gives us the most detailed data available," says Brown. "Even though



### What do ACT test scores mean? Free information for teachers and schools

ACT is offering free information to teachers and schools for translating scores from the ACT Assessment. An informational poster indicates what students are likely to know when their college entrance exam scores fall within certain ranges. In other words, what does it mean when a student gets a 21 on an ACT test, or a 30? What is that student ready to learn next?

The informational poster is part of ACT's "Standards for Transition," a set of instructional guides that translate ACT scores into descriptions of student skills in English, reading, mathematics and science. The score

translations apply to both the ACT Assessment and PLAN, an assessment for tenth graders which is on a comparable score scale as the ACT Assessment.

"Students can use the Standards to identify the knowledge and skills they likely have and those they likely need to develop," said Sherri Miller, ACT's director of elementary and secondary school programs.

"Teachers can also use the Standards to identify their students' strengths and weaknesses and modify their instruction accordingly. Parents and policymakers may find the information useful as well."

The guides also include "Pathways for Transition." The Pathways list the kinds of classroom activities students should benefit from. Teachers who want to help students improve their skills need only guide them along the Pathway that leads to the level they need to reach to be successful in high school and after.

### Edward Jones: Diversification Can Help Protect You From Sudden "Slumps"

Technology has been the word for some investors over the past couple of years. But when tech stocks short-circuited in the spring of 2000, investors whose portfolios weren't well-diversified learned a hard lesson.

Some investors mistakenly believed the technology sector had unlimited growth potential. But when it fell, it fell hard. The Nasdaq Composite Index, home to many technology stocks, dropped 13 percent in the second quarter of the year -- its largest drop in a decade. Then, in July, the Nasdaq fell another 10 percent.

Market experts attribute this rapid decline to several factors. For one thing, many technology stocks had become tremendously expensive -- too expensive for investors' liking. Also, investors began to get nervous over the lack of earnings exhibited by many of the dot.com companies.

The reasons behind the market meltdown are actually less important than the fact that some people had large percentages of their portfolios tied up with technology stocks. As a result, they got burned.

Were these people foolish to put their investment dollars in technology stocks? Not necessarily. Several areas of technology offer attractive prospects for growth. However, too many people put too much money in technology, leaving themselves over-exposed to just one sector -- and that's an invitation to trouble. It's never a good idea to put a large majority of your investment dollars into one particular market segment, no matter how strong it may look at a given time. As the events of this past spring showed, it takes very little time for a soaring market to plunge.

Sometimes, you can become over-concentrated in one area without even being aware of it. For example, rapid or sustained growth in the total value of a particular group of stocks can contribute to "unbalancing" a portfolio.

That's why it's important to periodically review your holdings and, if necessary, "rebalance" your portfolio. If you're too heavily weighted in an area, think about ways you can diversify. By spreading your dollars across many different industries and types of investments, you'll reduce the risk of having most of your assets exposed to a sudden downturn in one area. And, by having your money invested in a variety of areas, you'll have more chances to take advantage of upswings.

Furthermore, you can diversify in more ways than one. First, of course, you can invest in different industries. Then, you can invest in different types of companies within each industry. Some industries may offer you more investment possibilities than others, but all industries will give you some choices. And striving for maximum diversification is generally a good idea.

There's not much "sizzle" in diversification; it's a basic, common-sense approach to investing. But when the winds of change cool off the "hot" sectors, you'll probably be glad to have a well-diversified portfolio.

## Healing with Herbs - Safely

More and more people are searching for their health remedies in the garden of herbal medicines. Plant-based teas, supplements, and remedies -- such as St. John's wort, ginseng, and ginkgo biloba -- have moved from health food stores to supermarket shelves.

Some herbs are touted as remedies for particular diseases or conditions, while others are suggested as supplements to keep you in peak condition. Here are a few pointers on taking part in the herbal trend safely.

**Talk to your doctor**  
Herbal supplements and medi-

cines affect your body -- if they didn't, you wouldn't take them! Talk to your doctor or pharmacist about herbal products that you are using or considering. It is especially important to consult with your doctor if you are taking prescription medications, are pregnant or breastfeeding, since herbal medications can have dangerous side effects that might harm your baby.

**Mixing drugs**  
Some herbs can interact with prescription or over-the-counter drugs and make them more toxic or ineffective. For example, taking ginkgo biloba while taking warfarin (brand name Coumadin) can cause serious internal bleeding.

The popular herbal remedy St. John's wort can reduce the effectiveness of many drugs, including indinavir (Crixivan), an antiviral drug that is often prescribed for patients with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection. Using St. John's wort while taking indinavir could allow the infection to worsen or the virus to develop resistance to the drug.

If you take St. John's wort, your birth control pills, seizure medicines, or anticancer drugs

may not work properly. Combining St. John's wort with the prescription medicines piroxicam (Feldene) or tetracycline (Sumycin) could make your skin very sensitive to sunlight and increase your chance of severe sunburn.

**Natural doesn't necessarily mean safe**

People often assume that natural products won't harm them. But tigers, arsenic, and earthquakes are natural, and we know they can do damage. Just because a product is natural doesn't mean it won't cause problems.

Unlike prescription medications and over-the-counter drugs, herbal supplements don't go through the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) rigorous safety tests. However, since 1992, the FDA has been on the lookout for herbs that may cause disease or death. It advises against using several herbs, including chaparral, comfrey, and germander, which can damage the liver. The French Ministry of Health banned germander after a hepatitis outbreak that resulted in at least one death.

**Are they effective?**  
You could jeopardize your

health if you take an ineffective herbal remedy for an illness instead of a tested prescription or nonprescription drug. Makers of prescription and over-the-counter medications must prove that the drugs are effective for a reasonably high number of users. A manufacturer can't say that a drug will cure cancer if it hasn't proven it to the FDA. Be cautious of herbal remedy claims, since these don't require testing.

As herbs become more popular, scientists are testing their effectiveness for different ailments. We have proof that St. John's wort is effective for depression and good evidence that saw palmetto reduces symptoms in men who have noncancerous enlarged prostates. In the future, we'll probably see more proven benefits for herbs.

**Beware of con artists and mail fraud scams**

The Niles Police Department wants to remind everyone not to fall victim to con artists and mail fraud scams. Once again mail fraud scams are appearing in noticeable numbers because people continue to indulge in the "it's too good to be true." One of the most recent scams is a letter out of Nigeria from a supposed executive accountant with the Nigerian National Petroleum Corp. who insists that he purposely over-invoiced a foreign firm to the tune of 25.5 million dollars and he wants to give you 30% of it. But, all he needs is your bank's name, address, telephone and fax number as well as the name of your beneficiary, company name, address and account number and of course the confidential telephone and fax number of your beneficiary.

that you were unaware of, and bring them to the attention of the credit reporting company.

The bottom line is when in doubt, check it out! Never act immediately on offers, if there is a deadline to an incredible offer, one that will not allow you to validate the offer, that's usually because the scam artist knows he will be discovered. If you fall victim to this type of crime the Niles Police Department asks that you call and report the crime, don't allow these criminals to continue to hide in the mail and defraud others.

The suspect is a gang member who has served time in the state penitentiary. The attack is not believed to be random, police said.






