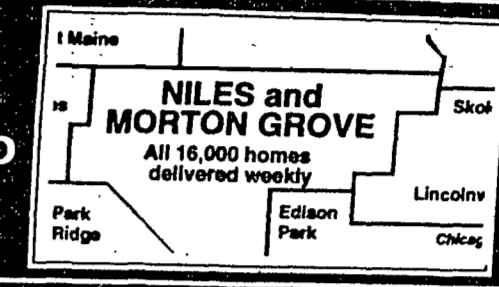

### District 64 asks for 7.5 percent additional tax

District 64 wants 7.5 percent more in revenue from property taxes than it requested in 1999, it was disclosed recently.

The board that serves Park Ridge-Niles District 64 approved a tentative levy of \$33.9 million for 2000, to include this increase. Since the Cook County Collector adjusts most school district properties downward before disbursing funds, the district only expects to realize an additional four percent from this increase, or a total of about \$33.6 million.

The levy is determined by the 1999 assessed value of all property in the district, plus the dis-

The Niles Police Public Information Officer has confirmed the department is shopping for an in-car video system for its fleet.

## Niles residents return after Nicor mercury clean up

Nicor's testing of Niles homes is just about finished. Out of 2,735 homes, 2,722 have been inspected. Seven tested positive for mercury contamination, four have been cleaned and the remainder are in the process of being decontaminated.

The Bugle spoke with two Niles residents who shared their very different experiences and subsequent attitudes about Nicor. "It's been a nightmare," said Bob Hubbard, who contacted us after our October article on Nicor. He and his wife were evacuated and their dog kenneled after their home on the 8600 block of Oriole tested positive for mercury.

In late September, Hubbard contacted Nicor to test his home, which had suffered from repeated gas leaks. Inspectors found high

levels of mercury in his basement but had to delay closing the house for clean up until tuck-pointing

## NPW ready for decorating

Public Services Director Jun Noriega expects his troops to be out there soon, stringing those lights, hanging those garlands and snowflakes.

While the preparation and move into the new headquarters delayed this seasonal activity by two weeks or so, preparations have begun, said Noriega.

## Pace improves Routes 411 and 413 in Niles

Pace, the suburban transit service, made service improvements to Route 411 Niles Local Service and 413 Niles South End Special on Sunday, October 29, to better serve Niles passengers.

The two routes operate daily between several destinations within the village, and the services are provided to passengers for free due to a subsidy from the Village of Niles. Weekday service on each route runs from early morning to the early evening, while weekend service operates from the late morning to the early evening. Service frequency is generally every half hour every day.

Route 413 will be improved to serve Pointe Plaza at Touhy and Central avenues. The bus will make convenient stops there at Wal-Mart and Cub Foods. Minor schedule adjustments also are planned to accommodate the service extension. Other destinations along Route 413 include Aldi Foods, Leaning Tower YMCA, Costco, Target and the Village Square Shopping Center.

Route 411 will experience a small routing change for trips operating eastbound on Dempster Street between Ozanam and Ozark avenues. To avoid the left turn on to Dempster, the bus will head west on Dempster to Milwaukee Avenues, and then take eastbound Dempster to continue its regular routing. The same bus

## 'Emergency 911 Beacon' lights

The Village of Niles has just come up with a brighter idea as they have found a way to shed light on emergencies. The village will be selling "Emergency 911 Beacon" light bulbs to the public. The Emergency 911 Beacon is a multipurpose light bulb designed to aid in emergencies by saving precious seconds when help is needed, by guiding responders to your location. It can turn a typical porch light into a flashing strobe so that police officers, ambulance drivers and firefighters can find an address more quickly. It looks and operates the same as a 60 watt household light bulb and is sim-

ply placed in the porch light fixture. When an emergency arises and residents have phoned fire or police to respond to their location, they can simply activate the emergency beacon by turning their light switch on, off and on again, which will cause the light bulb to act as a bright flashing beacon until it is turned off, which automatically resets the device to operate once again as a normal light bulb.

The "Emergency 911 Beacon" light bulb is endorsed by the National Crime Prevention Association and beginning on October 25th, 2000 residents will be able to purchase this incredible de-

vice from the village for \$5 each, a fraction of the suggested \$19.95 retail cost. The Emergency 911 Beacon will be available for purchase at the following Village of Niles facilities:

### IRS seeks volunteers to provide free tax assistance

Do you like to help people? If so, IRS has just the program to match your skills with the needs of many Illinois residents.

The IRS is looking for both volunteer individuals and organizations to help prepare tax returns free of charge under the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA) during the 2001 filing season. This well-established program helps people who are unable to prepare their own simple tax returns or cannot pay for professional tax assistance. Now in its thirty-first year, nearly 2,000 volunteers helped almost

71,000 Illinois taxpayers at 420 locations throughout the state last year.

New volunteers are trained by IRS tax specialists. They should have some time available in January to take a three to five day training course on individual tax laws. Good computer skills are helpful and organizations should be willing to participate in the VITA "e-file" (electronic filing) program.

Day, evening or weekend classes can be arranged. After completing the class, volunteers

### Not Whoooo! but whaaat?

Residents around Touhy and Lehigh are not happy about those high-pitched sounds they began hearing sometime in September.

It's described as an "eerie, high-pitched whistling." Neighbor Doug Vesperman says, "The pitch and volume of the noise change with the intensity of the wind." Vesperman, who lives on the 7100 block of Mason Avenue, hears the sound at least 10 to 12 times a week, he said.

Residents wonder if the strange noise comes from the glass building under construction at Lehigh and Touhy. They mention the large glass

screen as the possible source. The building is the future home of Halo Branded Solutions designed by architect Helmut Jahn, whose State of Illinois building also held unwanted surprises.

The Vespermans live in Chicago, so they may contact Alderman Brian Doherty about the situation.

Meanwhile Chuck Ostman, Director of the Niles Code Enforcement Department, is aware of the problem and has already begun investigating the complaint. "One of my inspectors sort-of heard it," Ostman said.

Rhonda Mork, Vice President of External Affairs for the builder, CenterPoint Developers, said she is unaware of the problem.

Halo spokesperson Stephanie Laesch said her firm has been made aware of the problem, but assigns the problem to the builder and architect.

### Small fire at John Crane Packing Co.

A fire discovered in the John Crane Packing Co., 6400 Oakton in Morton Grove was contained by firefighters within minutes of their arrival.

The Morton Grove Fire Department responded to a call reporting smoke in the 300,000 square foot building at 8:26 a.m. on Oct. 24. According to a press release, they arrived on the scene two minutes later and called for back up aid from Niles, Glenview, North Maine, Skokie and Park Ridge departments when flames were discovered in a 10 x 20 foot loft on the building's East side.

An estimated \$15,000 of damage was caused by the fire, which was under control by 8:45 a.m., though workers remained on the scene to contain smoke damage throughout the complex and monitor the building for toxic gases. No such emissions were reported.

Investigators believe that the fire was caused when electronic equipment in the storage area overheated.

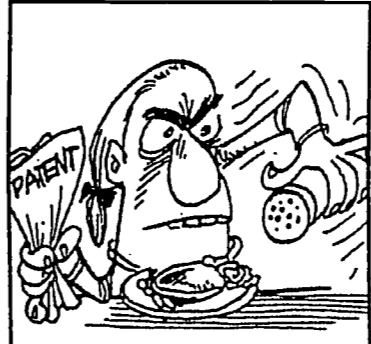

## Poor shopping practices can lead to food poisoning

It won't be on your grocery list, but that doesn't mean you can't pick up a little salmonella the next time you go to the store.

"It's easy to get harmful organisms in your food while you're shopping," says Patricia K. Welch, a food safety expert at Southern Illinois University Carbondale.

"For example, if you have ready-to-eat grapes in a perforated, open bag next to a leaky package of uncooked meat or poultry and the juices get onto the grapes, then you might have contaminated grapes."

Hoping to teach folks safer shopping strategies, Welch and some of her colleagues are waging a public information campaign that includes handouts with shopping and cold storage pointers and a 30-second TV spot produced by SIUC students which aired on 200 Illinois stations in February and March.

The media blitz is part of a multi-year, \$775,000 food safety initiative headquartered at SIUC and funded by the Council on Food and Agriculture Research, a statewide coalition of more than 50 organizations sponsoring projects aimed at solving real-world problems. In addition to education and outreach activities, the safety initiative includes a study of particular strains of food-borne bacteria, the development of simple, inexpensive food-testing tools and the creation of training materials designed for food service workers, food sellers and on-farm food handlers.

Consumers became a lot more savvy about food-borne illness several years ago, after reading in their newspapers about tainted fast-food burgers that were sickening and even killing those who ate them. But most of the publicity and the resulting educational efforts focused on the kitchen.

"People don't think about what they do with their grocery carts," Welch says.

"We live in a different environment now," Welch notes. "We're getting food products from all over the world, many from places that don't have the same food safety requirements we do. As your risks go up, your vigilance should go up, too. It's better to be safe than sorry."

## Get Ready for Cold and Flu Season

You know it's coming. Sniffling, sneezing, stuffy heads. First, the guy at the next desk -- your school-age child -- starts sneezing. Then you notice a tickle in your throat and soon the whole family's sick! It's cold and flu season, and there's no where to hide.

**Cold or Flu?**

Both the common cold and the flu (influenza) are caused by viruses -- but by different types of viruses. The rhinovirus is the most common cause of a cold, while the influenza virus causes the flu.

You can usually tell whether you have a cold or the flu based on your symptoms.

- A fever is rare with a cold, but common with the flu.
- Headaches, muscle pains, weakness, and fatigue are rare or mild with a cold, but more common or severe with the flu.

Both the common cold and the flu can lead to complications. The common cold can cause sinus congestion and earaches. The flu can lead to more severe problems, such as bronchitis and pneumonia.

**A shot of prevention**

Fortunately, you can prevent the flu and its complications by getting a yearly flu shot. These shots are 70-90 percent effective. Flu shots are particularly recommended for people over

these tips in mind:

- For a stuffy nose, choose a product that contains decongestant, such as pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine.
- For a runny nose, try a product that contains an antihistamine, such as diphenhydramine, or amantidine (Symmetrel). But you must start taking these drugs within 48 hours of your first flu symptoms to get the relief.
- Early information suggests that taking Relenza or Tamiflu during flu season may help prevent the flu, but neither works as well as a flu shot.
- A week or seven days
- Unfortunately, no vaccine or medicine can prevent the common cold or reduce its duration. But medicines can help relieve cold and flu symptoms.
- Colds can cause a variety of symptoms, including fever, headache, nasal congestion, runny nose, sore throat, and coughing. If you have several of these symptoms, it may be more convenient to use a multi-symptom cold product. If you have only one or two symptoms, choose a product that only treats those symptoms. That way you can avoid ingredients -- and side effects that you don't need. Keep

take them by mouth (orally) or apply them with nose drops or sprays (topically). Oral decongestants commonly contain pseudoephedrine (brand name Sudafed), phenylephrine (Dristan Cold), or phenylpropanolamine (Afrin), naphazoline (Naphcon Allergy Relief Eye Drops), phenylephrine (Neo-Synephrine Regular Strength Nasal Drops), or xylocetazoline (Otrivin nasal spray).

Oral decongestants may keep you awake at night. Try taking them earlier in the day so they wear off by bedtime. Nose or eye drops are less likely to keep you awake, since they don't get into the bloodstream. Don't use nose drops and sprays for more than three days in a row, or "rebound effect" may actually make congestion worse.

You can also try nasal strips, such as Breathe Right, at night. They're bandage-like products that hold your nostrils open to relieve congestion.

Antihistamines relieve runny nose, sneezing, and watery and itchy eyes. You can get antihistamines over the counter and by prescription. Antihistamines such as diphenhydramine (Benadryl) and clemastine (Tavist-1) are sedating and are best used at

night. Over-the-counter antihistamines that contain chlorpheniramine (Chlor-Trimeton) and brompheniramine are less likely to cause drowsiness and are best used in the daytime. Prescription antihistamines are even less likely to cause drowsiness.

In any case, a cold will usually subside after about a week. But keep some cold medications on hand -- the average adult can expect another two or three colds before the spring!

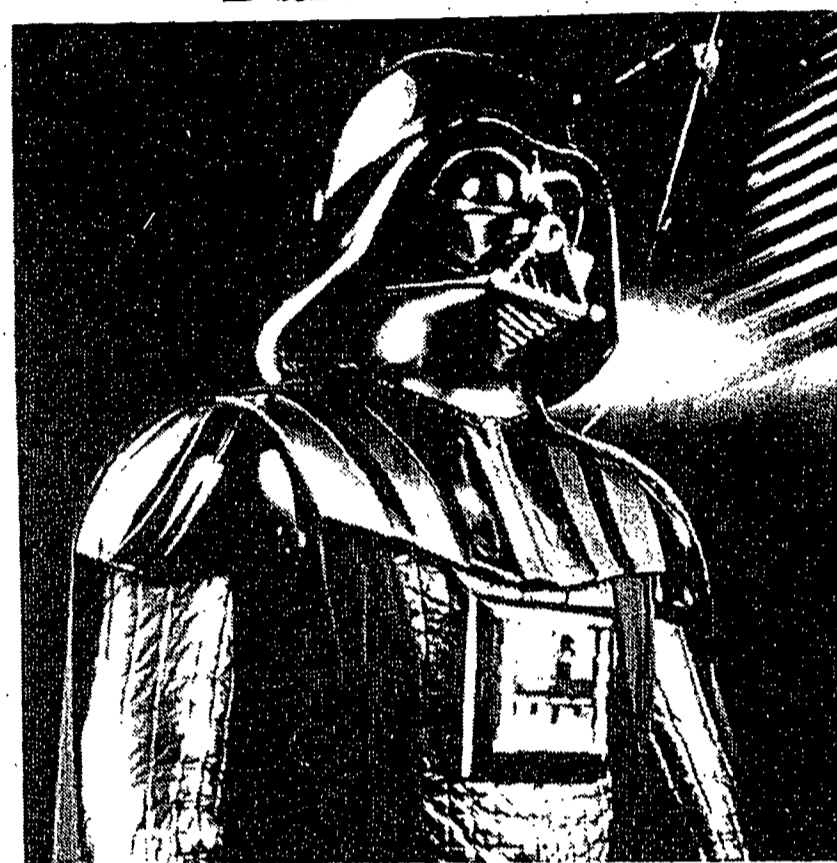

**Maine Township offers Energy Assistance Program**

Income qualified individuals in Maine Township can now schedule appointments to review their needs and eligibility for the Energy Assistance Program (LI-HEAP). The winter assistance program started earlier this Fall for Seniors and Disabled persons, but effective November 1 is open to all residents.

The program offers assistance in paying heating (electric or gas) costs to income-qualified individuals. A person may apply for assistance if they either pay their own heating bills or have it included in their rent. Assistance is also available for telephone bills to qualified persons.

The income eligibility guidelines are as follows:  
1 person in household: Gross monthly income of \$870.  
2 persons in household: Gross monthly income of \$1,172.  
3 persons in household: Gross monthly income of \$1,474.  
4 persons in household: Gross monthly income of \$1,776.  
5 persons in household: Gross monthly income of \$2,078.  
6 persons in household: Gross monthly income of \$2,380.

The following documents will be needed at the appointment:  
1. State of Illinois photo ID or driver's license for all adult mem-

bers in the household (18 years or older)

2. Hard copy of Social Security number for all members of the household (e.g. Social Security card, Social Security Benefits award letter or Social Security printout).

3. Proof of income for all members of the household (income documentation must cover 30-day period prior to the date of application. Acceptable proof may be Social Security benefits award letter, Social Security printout, public aid medical card or pay stubs).

4. Most recent itemized utility bills (electric, gas and oil bills). No final notices or shut-off notices are accepted. Note: applicant must be the consumer listed on the utility bills.
