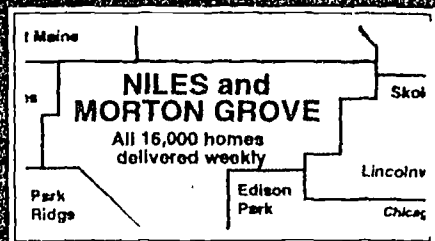

Niles Animal Hospital's founder, Ted Lafeber, passed away January 14. He was a pioneer in the treatment of ailing cockatoos and parakeets which dates back to the 1950s and was one of the first persons to become involved in avian medicine.

Dr. Peter Sakas, present director of the Niles Animal Hospital and Bird Medical Center, said Lafeber gained his long-standing reputation from his study of birds. The bird center in the 7200 block on Milwaukee Avenue was among the first in the United States.

Lowe's decides against site at Dempster Plaza

The owners of Dempster Plaza have learned that the Lowe's home improvement chain has decided against taking up the anchor store spot vacated when K-Mart relocated nine months ago.

Jim Devine of Newcastle Properties, the mall owners, recalled when Lowe's had announced last year that it would make a "market entry" to the Chicago area by opening a number of stores, with one in the former K-Mart site at Dempster and Greenwood. Devine said that on Newcastle's end the deal was "fairly well along," and added that he didn't know why Lowe's had pulled out.

It's estimated that the sales tax revenue is lessened by \$9,000 per month from the vacancy.

Devine knows of no other plan at present, but he expects that the opening of the Brede-mann Auto Center across Dempster Street will be good for Dempster Plaza as well.

Local home robberies decline

The rash of residential burglaries plaguing local communities has tapered off in the past two weeks.

At least half a dozen robberies have occurred weekly since September in Morton Grove, Skokie and Niles. Since Jan. 7, only two incidents have been reported in Niles and one in Morton Grove (information from Skokie was unavailable at press time).

On Jan. 12, miscellaneous jewelry was stolen from a condominium at the 7400 block of Waukegan in Niles. A screwdriver or similar tool was used to pry the door jam and remove the dead-bolt from the lobby's front door.

The deadbolt was found on top of a dresser inside of the burgled residence.

Robbers were unable to gain

Area code controversy heats up again

We've been threatened with it on and off for a few years now, and here it comes again.

Area code 847 is exhausted, we've been told. Although the Illinois Citizens Utility Board disagrees with that conclusion, we probably won't get out of it this time.

Beth Bosch, spokeswoman for Illinois Commerce Commission, confirms that a 224 area code will soon be distributed to telephone companies requesting it. "I think it will be several months before (the new code) will be in use. That's the information that came out this week from the commission," she said.

The 224 code will share the same geographic boundaries as

847. This means that while one user has an 847 code, a new neighbor will have a 224 code. Calling next door in that case will require dialing 11 digits.

For its part, the ICC is still playing devil's advocate. "There are plenty of phone numbers left in 847, if only the phone industry

Niles Public Library carefully watching budget

In hindsight, stockpiling reference materials for the Niles Public Library with surplus funds has turned out to be a bad idea.

After using approximately 62 percent of funds budgeted for library materials in the first six months of the fiscal year, the li-

brary currently finds itself \$52,465 below budget for year-to-date spending.

"If spending doesn't slow down, the budget will be out of money by April," cautioned Library Business Manager Joe

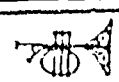



Contract Carpets owner passes away

Philip A. Kerr 75, a pioneer in the development of rehabilitation programs for the deaf died January 19 at home.

In 1950 he became a counselor for the Illinois Dept. of Vocational Rehabilitation. A son of deaf parents he was the first Rehabilitation Counselor for the Deaf (RCD) in the United States. Through 30+ years he helped over 3,000 deaf clients find gainful employment, improved education and in job training and job replacements. Due to resource restraints an additional 1,000 placements went unrecorded. He also served as an interpreter and witness, including the famed Schuster/Peterson trial of the 3 teenage boys found murdered in a Chicago Forest Preserve in the 1950's.

Born the son of a professional boxer he later graduated from Lane Tech High School. He enlisted in the army and joined the 81st Airborne Division as a paratrooper during World War II. He wrote several articles on the harrowing experiences jumping out of airplanes. He later survived a fatal plane crash where several of his squad members perished. Upon return from the war he attended Wilbur Wright College. While working as a counselor he founded The Carpet Mart which later became Contract Carpets when it relocated to Niles where it remains nearly 40 years later.

He had incredibly stamina simultaneously working 2 careers for over 30 years. He still worked 45+ hours a week at age 75 at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife Elizabeth and his children Michael, Mary, Ellen, Phil, Jack, Kathy, David and Jonathan and 21 grandchildren.

Cars burglarized at Golf Mill Ford

Police are investigating the burglaries of eleven cars parked overnight at Golf Mill Ford in Niles.

The crimes occurred between 9 p.m. Jan. 17 and 4 p.m. Jan. 18 in the southeast parking lot. Six of the vehicles had been brought in for service, and at least three others were unsold cars owned by the dealership.

While dashboard stereos were the focus of the thefts, other items were reported stolen including a garage door opener, car phone charger, and filled tool box from a 1999 Ford Taurus.

Two vehicles reportedly sustained exterior damage when the fog lights were removed from a 1998 Ford Eddie Bauer Expedition, and the front grill emblem was pried off of a 1995 Ford Mustang. The Mustang's trunk and hood were also found open.

The interior of a Ford Winstar Van was ransacked, but the owner did not report anything missing.

Radios were taken out of the dashboards of the 1985 Ford Mustang, 1994 Ford Taurus, and 1983 Mercedes SEL owned by the dealership.

The offender(s) apparently did not use force to gain entry to the cars, which may have all been left unlocked.

No suspects have been named as of press time.

Rep. Thompson dumped; Rifkin loses slate spot

Maine Township's Republican Superintendent Mark Thompson didn't know he was a marked man when he showed up at Maine East High School for slate elections.

But as events took shape, Thompson, a Maine Township board member for 20 years, was stunned to realize he had been voted off the slate. This, despite assurances from Maine Township committeemen, Republican Bob Darr, within days preceding the meeting, that Thompson would head a Republican slate that would include all incumbents.

Elected to Thompson's place is Bob Dudycz, 52, older brother of the state senator, Walter Dudycz. Thompson called the vote result--far from close with a count of 251-50--"dirty politics."

"They stacked that place with people I've never seen before," he said of the caucus, adding that many who attended the meeting were from Rosemont, and that on arrival, "the Rosemont people" were directed to "sit over there."

Darr defended Rosemont's right to participate. Maine Township has six precincts in Rosemont, said Darr, and "we always reach out to bring people to the caucus."

However, a Republican who asked to not be identified described the action as well-orchestrated, adding that "this has been going on for six months." There seems to be agreement that personality was

an issue, that Dudycz was regarded as more outgoing and Thompson as too reserved.

Election deadlines were also considered in the strategy--by the time the votes were taken, the deadline for Thompson to run as an independent had passed.

Along with Thompson's defeat, trustee Anita Rifkin was also bypassed.

Lacking the fireworks of the Republican caucus, the Democrats chose Mike Yesner of Maine Township for its supervisor spot on the April 3 slate.

Andrew Przybylo described the Maine Township Democratic caucus proceedings as "peaceful; everything was status quo."

Additionally, Laura Morask, a state's attorney from Park Ridge, Corky Morales, a Des Plaines printer, Cammy Fortuna, an executive assistant from unincorporated Glenview, and Dennis O'Donovan, a Niles municipal executive, were chosen for trustee spots.

The caucus also chose John Colletti for highway commissioner, Ben Velyathumall from unincorporated Maine Township for clerk, and Sherwin Weinberg for collector. Przybylo said, adding that he is very enthusiastic about the selections.

Dist. 63 Supt. Williams sums up first year

As Kathleen Williams, superintendent of East Maine School District 63, looks back on her first year here, she recognizes many issues she dealt with at her former post in Lawrence, Kansas.

In a recent interview, Williams drew the comparison. Construction projects, policy issues, and goal setting all ring a familiar bell, as she deals with construction at Gemini Jr. High and urges the school board to rewrite policies and to develop long-term goals.

But some issues are new. "I've developed a number of areas that, in my mind, need a great deal of attention, and as I uncover those areas, I always try to look for the positive potential that exists," said Williams.

There is potential for improving relationships, Williams said. She cited long-standing "nasty relations" between the teachers association, the administration and the board of education, as well as strained relations between the board and the community.

Williams says she has swapped jobs for a day with several staff members, the better "to walk in staff member's shoes."

The policy rewriting effort concerns the way the board governs and the tools it has available.

Thus far, the board has been most accepting of her suggestions, Williams says, adding that she is happy with the cooperation.

9 Lifesaving Facts About Prostate Cancer

It's the second leading cause of cancer death among men, the third greatest killer overall. Doctors aren't sure what causes prostate cancer exactly, but here's what is known:

1. Having a father or brother with prostate cancer doubles a man's risk of developing the disease.

2. Prostate cancer is about twice as common among African-American men as it is among

white American men.

3. Results of most studies suggest that men with diets high in fat and low in fiber, fruits and vegetables have a greater chance of developing prostate cancer.

4. Recent research suggests that a diet high in calcium and low in fructose (fruit sugar) may also increase risk.

5. Lycopenes, pigments that are most abundant in cooked or

Making a visit to the dentist easy - for children and adults

If a parent is nervous or anxious about their child's trip to the dentist, you can almost be certain that the young patient will be scared and the visit will be long remembered - and not positively.

A trip to the dentist requires a team effort involving the parent, child and dentist. To avoid conflict at the dentist's office, parents should do some advance planning, according to Alice Boghosian, DDS, general dentist who practices in north suburban Niles.

"Parents can turn the visit into a positive experience by contacting the dentist ahead of time to discuss any concerns or anxieties, rather than waiting until the visit. As a result, the dentist can explain what is going to happen during the visit and the parent may be more relaxed on the day of the appointment," Dr. Boghosian added.

"I've had parents tell their children to 'be brave' or say, 'I'm glad it's you and not me' during a visit to my office. What they are doing is transferring their fears to the children - who pick up on things like this," said Dr. Boghosian. "I tell my patients upfront that this is going to be fun to help set the tone for the visit."

What can parents do to avoid conflict at the dentist's office?

"Develop a relationship with your dentist that is built upon trust," said Dr. Boghosian. "It's imperative that parents trust their dentist's diagnosis and recommendations for treatment. Ask the dentist questions and peek in on the dentist or sit with the child during the appointment."

The Chicago Dental Society and Dr. Boghosian provide some simple advice to provide that a trip to the dentist is painless for the child and the parents:

• **Arrive on time for the appointment and don't be rushed or in a hurry.** Kids need time to relax and be given the opportunity to learn - while not being rushed through the experience.

• **Don't bring other children to the appointment.** Make this a special day for you and your child. Plan a fun activity following the appointment. Build a positive experience around the dental visit.

• **If you feel your child has a problem, bring in the child for an appointment.** It is difficult for a dentist to make a diagnosis over the phone. The child must be seen so that the dentist can make a

correct diagnosis.

• **Don't show anxiety or fear in front of your child.** Many kids are calm about the dental visits but pick up fear from the way their parents are acting - such as expressions on their faces, body language or comments.

• **Let the dentist take control during the appointment.** "Children need to have rules set by the dentist in a firm, yet positive way," said Dr. Boghosian. "Most dentists are very patient and know how to manage an overactive or unruly child."

Sometimes the parent's presence can interfere with care, and the parent may need to leave the room. The dental appointment is a great time for children to learn to be on their own.

• **If you have a dental emergency, call the office immediately to discuss with the dentist.** The goal is to make sure the child gets appropriate treatment and is not suffering from pain or experiencing an infection. If possible, call the dentist's office as soon as there is a problem so it doesn't turn into an emergency.

"Parents need to realize how important it is that a child have a good visit at the dentist," said Dr. Boghosian. "All it takes is one negative experience to leave a lasting impression on the child. If parents work with the child and dentist in advance, everyone will be happy and the dentist can deliver the best care possible."

Stretching Dos and Don'ts

Touch your toes or reach for the sky. Stretching for just 20 minutes a day reduces muscle tension, improves circulation and builds muscle tone. Just remember a few simple rules:

Do warm up for 3-5 minutes before stretching. Run in place, for instance. Why? Warm muscles are less likely to tear than cold ones.

Don't bounce. Doing so may cause ligament or tendon sprain. Guidelines: Gradually stretch to the point where you feel mild tension, then hold for 10-30 seconds. Repeat 3-4 times.

Do breathe slowly and deeply during each stretch. It helps your muscles relax and promotes saf-

er, more effective stretching. Don't overdo. Stretching should never go beyond the point of feeling a mild tension in your muscles. If you start to feel uncomfortable, ease up slightly.

Do stretch after you exercise as well as before. It's essential to avoiding cramping, tightness and reduced range of motion.

Don't forget, research shows that you're never too old to get flexible. Example: In one study, both young and old men were able to reverse joint stiffness with equal ease.

Do try to stretch 3-5 times a week. Done correctly and regularly, it just plain feels good.

raw tomatoes, grapefruit and watermelon, seem to lower prostate cancer risk, as does the mineral selenium.

6. Regular physical activity and maintaining healthy weight may help reduce prostate cancer risk.

7. Citrus flavonoids found in citrus juice - especially those found in orange and tangerine juice - appear to have some effect against prostate cancer in laboratory studies.

8. Some studies suggest that taking 50 milligrams of vitamin E daily can lower risk of prostate cancer by 32 percent, while others show no benefit. Since reasonable doses of E pose no significant side effects, taking this vitamin may be a "can't-hurt-could-help" strategy.

9. A man's best bet against prostate cancer is early detection and treatment. Talk to your doctor about regular screening, including a digital rectal exam and PSA blood test.

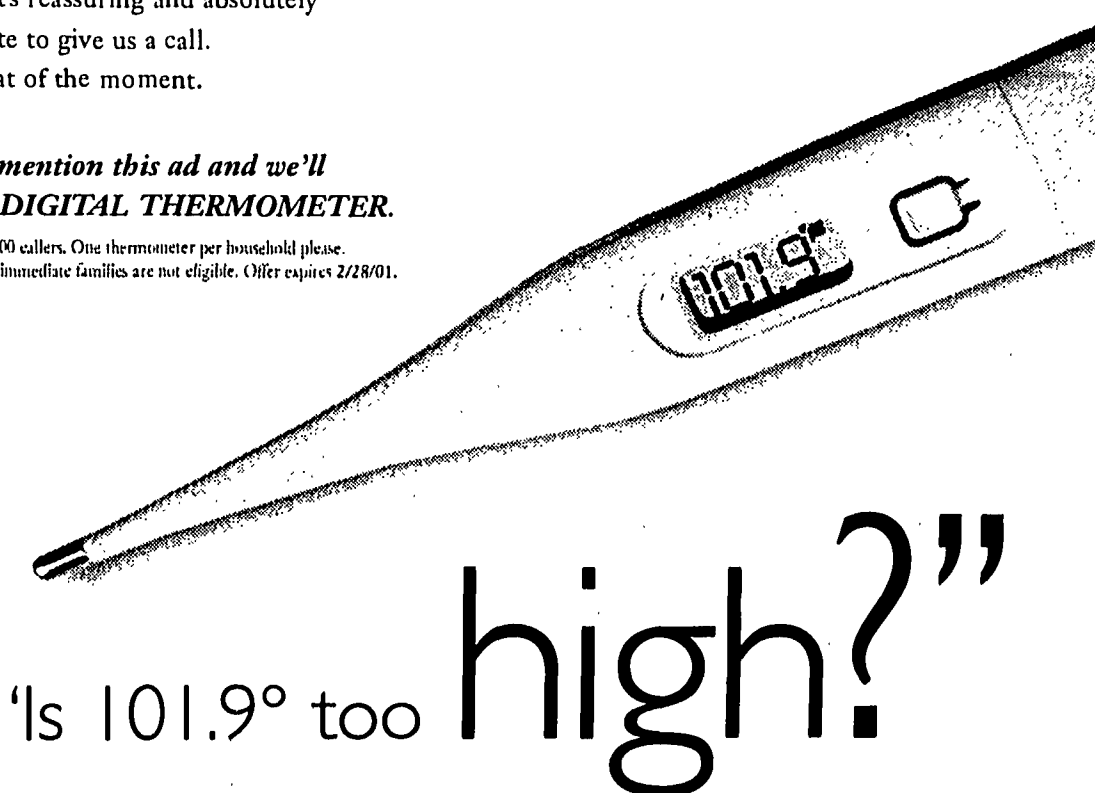

Are Your Bones About to Break?

Osteoporosis, the thinning of bones, affects 28 million Americans, mostly women. How it happens: Calcium is needed for the heart, muscles and nerves to function properly, and for blood to clot. When you're not getting enough, your body robs the bones of calcium, causing them to become porous and thin.

How much calcium do you

need? Most people should get 1,000 - 1,500 mg every day -- that's 3-5 tall glasses of milk or fortified orange juice. If you take a calcium supplement, make sure it contains vitamin D, which helps your bones absorb calcium. Osteoporosis is known as a silent disease, but there are certain signs to watch for.

7 Signs Your Bones Are at Risk

- You're thinner than normal. Low body weight means your bones may be thin, too.
- You have persistent back pain. A constant backache may mean you have a spinal fracture, one of the symptoms of osteoporosis.
- You shrank. Although a natural result of aging, loss of height can also be a sign of spinal fracture.
- You break a bone. It doesn't always mean you have osteoporosis, but breaking a bone could be a sign that your bones are weak.
- You use steroids. Taken over 2-3 months at any time during your life for conditions such as arthritis or asthma, these medications can cause rapid bone loss that can lead to osteoporosis. (Other drugs can thin your bones too, so always ask your doctor about side effects).
- You smoke. Smoking doubles your risk of suffering a fracture caused by thinning bones.
- You can't drink milk. People who are lactose intolerant may not get enough calcium but may be able to tolerate cheese and yogurt. Or consider taking a calcium supplement instead.

Final word: If any of these warning signs apply to you or you're at all concerned, speak to your doctor about bone density testing. It could be a lifesaver.

Pickwick series features the Organic Theater Company's "Romeo & Juliet"

Pickwick Live, the new performing arts series at Park Ridge's Pickwick Theatre, presents the Organic Theater Company in a co-production of Shakespeare's *Romeo & Juliet*. Running from January 31 through February 9, the romantic classic will be performed in a somewhat abridged version on both weekdays, for school groups, and on the weekend before Valentine's Day.

Organic Artistic Director Ina Marlowe, who recently directed *The Merchant of Venice* for the Tony Award-winning Utah Shakespearean Festival, will direct the Organic-Pickwick production of *Romeo* at the Art Deco theatre, which opened in 1928 as both a cinema and vaudeville house, and which has presented a wide variety of live performances ever since. The Pickwick has been on the National Register of Historic Places since 1975, and the Pickwick Theatre Council, which was founded in 1999 to preserve the theatre, is mounting live shows at the Pickwick this year as part

The Organic Theater Company, which has been located in Evanston for the past two years, is one of the Chicago area's best known and most highly regarded off-Loop theatre companies. Organic helped create what has become famous around the world as the "Chicago style" of theatre with such hits as the original *ER*, the stage play on which the television series was based, and through the work of such talents as David Mamet, Joe Mantegna, and Dennis Franz. In recent years, Organic has become known for its highly literate and sensitive productions of new plays as well as its attention to classics in the repertoire. Organic presented the Pickwick's *Little Prince* earlier this December.

Brookfield Zoo celebrates Groundhog Day

Will there be six more weeks of winter, or is spring just around the corner? Find out at Brookfield Zoo's annual Groundhog Day celebration on Friday, February 2, as Cloudy, one of Children's Zoo resident meteorologists, takes center stage. At 10:30 a.m., zookeepers will attempt to coax the furry forecaster from her winter digs with a nutritious homemade carrot-shaped cake prepared especially for her.

According to legend, if a groundhog sees its shadow on February 2, there will be six more weeks of winter; if it doesn't see its shadow, spring is just around the corner.

How did Groundhog Day begin? One theory originated with European farmers in the eighteenth century. In Europe, where milder winters occur than in the Midwest, farmers would watch hedgehogs come out of hibernation in early February. Their appearance was a sign that it was time to begin spring planting. Since there are no hedgehogs indigenous to the United States, the tradition was transferred to groundhogs.

Groundhogs hibernate when the air temperature drops to 50°F for an extended period. During hibernation a groundhog's body temperature drops from 90°F to 38°F. It takes a breath about once every minute and its heart slows to only four to six beats a minute.

When spring arrives, it may take several hours for a hibernating groundhog to rouse from its slumber.

Open every day of the year, Brookfield Zoo's winter hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Zoo admission is \$7 for adults and \$3.50 for children ages 3-11 and seniors 65 and over. Children 2 and under are free. From October through March on Tuesdays and Thursdays, admission is free. Parking is \$6.75 for cars and \$10.75 for buses (a Cook County parking tax is included). The Snowball Express, the zoo's free heated shuttle bus, transports guests between exhibit buildings.

Open every day of the year, Brookfield Zoo is located at First Avenue and 31st Street in Brookfield, IL, just 14 miles west of downtown Chicago. The zoo is accessible via the Stevenson (I-55) and Eisenhower (I-290) expressways, Tri-State Tollway (I-294), Burlington Northern commuter line, and PACE bus service. Gift Shops are also presented throughout the state and it enables each confined veteran to choose a gift for his wife, mother and children.

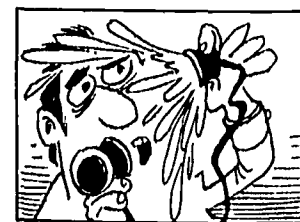

Funding for Park Ridge, Skokie Park Districts approved

Two local park districts have been approved to receive state funding for capital improvements from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, according to Assistant Senate Majority Leader Walter Dudydz (R-7th, Chicago).

The Skokie Park District will receive \$316,400 to develop North Shore Channel Park on Main Street in Skokie. Development includes soccer fields, a dog exercise area, playground, an extension of the long-distance trail system, a shelter, habitat restoration along the channel edge and a skate trail.

The Open Space Land Acquisition and Development grant program provides up to 50 percent reimbursement of eligible costs incurred by local agencies for approved recreational land acquisition and development opportunities.

During the 1940s, Girl Scouts sold fewer cookies due to limited supplies of flour, sugar and butter during World War II.

By 1947, a total of 29 bakers throughout the nation were licensed to create Girl Scout Cookies, but by 1980, the number was streamlined to four bakers (now

3. Maintain minor street accessibility for Village residents.
4. Provide accessibility for commuter parking facilities, municipal parking lots, and public buildings, and
5. Maintain alley accessibility for residents, providing cars are not blocking the right-of-way for plows to get through.

pride themselves with providing residents with the cleanest and safest streets in the area. While the Village receives many complimentary notes each winter thanking the crews for their efforts, it does receive a few complaints about snow being pushed up into driveways by the snowplows. Because there is no other place for the snow to go, the amount pushed back into a driveway can be reduced by the following suggestions:

• When you shovel your driveway, place the snow on the adjacent parkways and not in the street. Shoveling the snow back onto the roadway is not only unsafe, it is illegal; violators will be ticketed.

• If you are unable to clean your driveways or approach, you should make arrangements with a private contractor for cleaning. The Village staff cannot clean private driveways for you due to the amount of time involved.

• Additionally, when a snowfall of two or more inches is anticipated, you should park your cars in a driveway to make plowing more effective. If cars must be left on the street, please move them the morning following the

storm to allow the Public Works crews to clean the street.

Snow Route Parking Restrictions

The Village, as a service to Village residents after a severe storm, will pick up branches removed from trees due to a storm. These branches must be cut (4' length maximum) and placed in the parkway immediately after the storm. Collection of this type of storm debris will continue through five business days following the storm. Any storm debris not placed at the parkway (with a call to the Public Works Department at 847/470-5235 by the following Monday) will become the responsibility of the property owner for disposal.

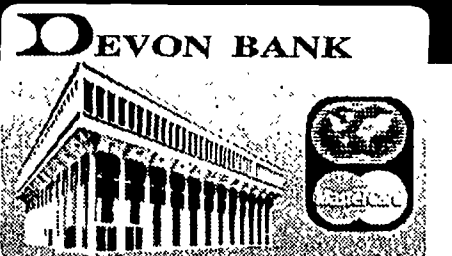

Teen smokers risk getting hooked early on

The conventional wisdom has been that teens usually become addicted to nicotine slowly, only after months or even years of daily smoking. But researchers at the University of Massachusetts Medical School in Worcester found that teens can experience the first symptoms of nicotine dependence within just a few weeks of occasional use.

Dr. Joseph R. DiFranza and colleagues studied nicotine use among 681 Massachusetts seventh-graders ages 12 to 13, interviewing these students three times during a year. Among the students in this study, 95 said they smoked at least one cigarette in each of the last two months.

This study, published in the September 2000 issue of Tobacco Control, sends an urgent message to teenagers: Experimenting with nicotine is even more dangerous than we thought.

Add this to what we already know about teens and smoking: About 15 percent of young people 12 to 17 years old are current smokers.

- Teens who try to quit smoking can experience the same withdrawal symptoms as adults who try to quit.
• Teens who start smoking are more likely to get lower grades.
• Compared with nonsmokers, kids who smoke are three times more likely to use alcohol...

However, there's good news: If teens can stay nicotine-free during high school, they will probably never smoke. This shifts the discussion to prevention.

One of the most effective ways to deter use is by imposing an excise tax on cigarettes. People think of it as a sin tax, said Knapp, but studies have shown that for each 10 percent increase in retail price, there is about a five percent decrease in demand for cigarettes.

Parents can have a powerful influence on prevention. Kay Provine, a community education specialist for Hazelton, emphasizes three actions.

Second, talk to young people about short-term consequences of tobacco use. Emphasize that young people are unattractive to friends if they smoke.

What is Type 1 Diabetes? Type 1 diabetes is a disease which results from the body's failure to produce insulin -- the hormone that "unlocks" the cells of the body, allowing glucose to enter and fuel them.

There are 15.7 million people in the United States who have diabetes. There are two main types of diabetes. Type 1, which usually occurs during childhood or adolescence, and type 2, the most common form of the disease, usually occurring after age 45.

Studies indicate that diabetes is generally under-reported on death certificates, particularly in the cases of older persons with multiple chronic conditions such as heart disease and hypertension.

What are the Other Types of Diabetes?

Gestational diabetes is a temporary form of insulin resistance that usually occurs halfway through a pregnancy as a result of excessive hormone production in the body, or the pancreas' inability to make the additional insulin that is needed during some pregnancies in women with no previous history of type 1 or type 2 diabetes.

Researchers have identified a small percentage of diabetes cases that result from specific genetic syndromes, surgery, chemicals, drugs, malnutrition, infections, viruses and other illnesses.

What Are the Complications of Diabetes?

- With its complications, diabetes is the seventh leading cause of death (sixth-leading cause of death by disease) in the United States. Each year, at least 190,000 people die as a result of diabetes and its complications.
- Blindness due to diabetic retinopathy.
- Kidney Disease due to diabetic nephropathy.
