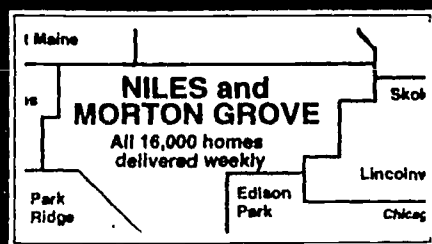

Legion site to become Civic Center

There was a full house at the Morton Grove Village Meeting. After the usual traditions Officers Yaras and Tabor presented the D.A.R.E. essay contest winners. While Niles' fiscal 2002 budget is expected to drop by \$4 million, property owners should expect slightly under a 5% increase in property taxes in 2002, according to Village Director of Finance, George Van Geem.

The current budget is \$60,271,304, compared to the \$56,512,404 projected for 2002. The decrease is the result of

Dist. 219 Board to expel student who made threat

District 219 board voted to expel a student who allegedly left notes around Niles North High School, threatening violence to the school community.

The board stated that the student had "engaged in gross and serious misconduct in violation of school rules." A case study evaluation is planned to determine any further discipline.

The student, 16 years old, was taken into police custody just prior to April 20, the anniversary of the Columbine High School shootings in Littleton, Colo.

The boy said he had intended the message as a prank.

The village's General Fund, which covers day-to-day expenditures, is planned to drop to \$27.6 million for 2002, from \$28.2 million for 2001. Van Geem said.

Special Funds, a budget category that tracks expenditures on a by-project basis, is 9.8 percent less--\$28.8 million in 2002, versus \$32.0 million in 2001. Street projects are covered under the Special Fund category.

Strip mall on Milwaukee has too much traffic; car wash not supported by residents

Zoners turn thumbs down to car wash

Niles residents burst into applause at Monday's Zoning Board meeting when the Plan Commission unanimously denied a zoning variance request for construction of a hand car wash at 7457-59 Milwaukee.

"It is just too ambitious (a project) for this particular piece of property," said Trustee Angelo Troiani.

The petitioner, Niles resident Harry Psarras, had hoped to build the car wash on the side of the former Ace Hardware Store, adjacent to residential property.

While the location is zoned as commercial property, area residents were concerned of the traf-

fic impact in their neighborhood by a business designed to service

automobiles.

CSO violinist, conductor, all-around musician

Perry E. Crafton, 80, who played in the first violin section of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra for 40 years, who founded the Northwest Symphony Orchestra in Des Plaines and directed orchestras in Oak Park and River Forest for many years, died May 1 following a brief illness.

Edgar Muenzer, a CSO violinist and conductor of the Park Ridge Civic Orchestra said that Crafton "had a very good ear, a razor-sharp ear, and was a very good conductor."

Crafton derived great satisfaction from his work with community orchestras, telling an interviewer with the Chicago Tribune in 1986 that if someone in the CSO "blows a bad note, we don't worry about it... mistakes are inevitable." But the amateurs, he believed, brought energy and charisma to performances that the pros sometimes didn't. "After a concert with my little orchestras, I feel genuinely exultant," Crafton had said.

Crafton is survived by his wife.

Melzer school girls aid stricken friend

Melzer School sixth-grader Tatum Halinton suffered an asthma attack during a game of baseball with friends April 27.

After rollerblading with friends, Sara Bodzin and Shannen Cruz, the threesome returned to the school area for a game of baseball.

"I hit a homerun, and we were all running," said Tatum Halinton later, when I started to wheeze. But I kept on going, and then I started to laugh."

That's when the asthma hit, and Halinton realized she hadn't brought her inhaler. She waited a couple seconds to see if the attack would fade but it didn't, so she asked Bodzin to go for help. Bodzin left, taking Cruz with her. Leaving Halinton in the company of two other girls, Bodzin and Cruz roller-bladed

to Bodzin's home. Diane Bodzin called 911 and Halinton's father, then headed to the school herself.

Garry Halinton arrived at the school but couldn't find her, not realizing she was at a location behind the school. He started to leave but returned when he heard sirens.

Diane Bodzin had wrapped Tatum Halinton, shivering and hyperventilating, in a coat. Paramedics arrived soon after, as did Garry Halinton.

Tatum Halinton was rushed to Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge. Paramedics gave her four breathing treatments enroute.

By that evening Tatum was feeling fine and expressed her thanks to her friends. So did Garry Halinton, who said "I'm happy the girls handled it so well. They did the right thing and didn't panic."




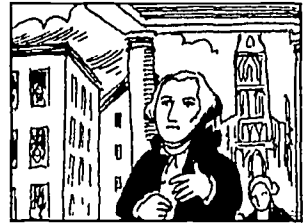

How seniors could pay less for prescription drugs

(NAPS) -- The average senior will shell out more than \$600 this year for their prescription drugs. That figure could be substantially reduced if the government changes policies that allow brand-name prescription drugs a competition-free market.

A Congressional Budget Office (CBO) study found that, in the first full year after a generic version of the drug is allowed into

the market, generics accounted for an average of 44 percent of prescriptions dispensed. The CBO study also found that with one to ten generic manufacturers in the marketplace, the average generic retail price is 61 percent of the brand name price.

"The prescription drug industry is unique because there is little to no competition for many of its products, and thus consumers

must pay higher prices," says Michael Zabko, Executive Director of TREA Senior Citizen League (TSCL). "Through huge investments in the lobbying and political contributions, the pharmaceutical industry has significantly delayed competition to brand name drugs by generic drugs through patent extensions and the FDA approval process."

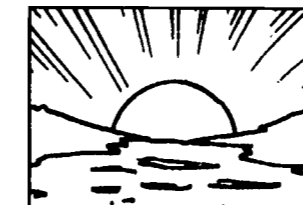





(NAPS) -- Getting older needn't mean memory loss, according to recent research funded by the National Institute on Aging (NIA). Keeping your mind active is the key to maintaining brain function.

Various diseases that can have negative effects on brain cells are more likely than normal aging to cause cognitive impairment. Studies conducted in the last couple of years suggest most brain-function loss can be attributed to some kind of pathological event not directly tied to old age.

Medical reasons that can cause brain cells to malfunction or die include viral infections, unhealthy behaviors such as alcoholism and drug abuse, and brain or nervous system disorders such as Alzheimer's disease or a history of mini-strokes.

New evidence suggests that some brain cell loss -- especially loss due to disease -- may be reversible. Contrary to popular belief, people continue to develop new brain cells throughout their lifetimes.

Doctors caution that the popular notion that one can improve memory by taking dietary supplements such as ginkgo biloba and vitamins is more of a quick fix than proven fact. Ginkgo has been shown to increase blood circulation, which in turn has been shown to aid brain function. However, the exact role of using ginkgo is not known yet.

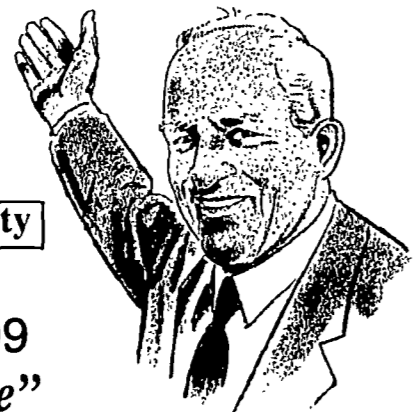

New housing law to benefit senior homeowners

New legislation was recently passed that will have a great impact on senior homeowners with respect to the reverse mortgage industry. Shortly before leaving office, Former President Bill Clinton signed into law a federal housing bill that makes certain changes to the federal reverse mortgage program. This new law, called the "American Homeownership and Economic Opportunity Act," provides senior homeowners the opportunity to utilize a greater portion of their reverse mortgage proceeds when purchasing Long-Term Care Insurance or when refinancing their existing reverse mortgage. In the near future, HUD will be releasing clarifications as to how all reverse mortgage lenders should carry out the wording of this new legislation.

The new law specifically states that reverse mortgage borrowers will now have the option to waive the up-front premiums that are paid for Mortgage Insurance if the loan proceeds are used to purchase qualified Long-Term Care insurance plans. During the sale of the property, if the home value is lower than the amount owed, the Mortgage Insurance Premium, or MIP, which is charged by the Federal Housing Administration, is used to offset any difference in values thus protecting both the borrower and the lender.

With the recent drop in interest rates, and higher reverse mortgage loan limits, current reverse mortgage borrowers may find an even greater incentive to look into a reverse mortgage. When refinancing, current reverse mortgage borrowers will have the opportunity to take advantage of the previously described MIP waiver, yielding even higher monetary results than before. The legislation also waives the required third party counseling when refinancing if the homeowner has received counseling within the last five years. This free counseling session is required of all new reverse mortgage borrowers. In addition, HUD will also establish procedures to help homeowners determine whether or not a refinance is the right option for their situation.

Reverse mortgages are considered a versatile retirement planning tool that empowers seniors to have greater control over their current financial situation, and their lives. Senior homeowners who are at least 62 years of age can qualify for this program. It is a loan that is primarily based upon the age of the borrower(s), home value and current interest rates. Proceeds are paid either as a lump sum, received in monthly installments, placed into a line of credit (like a credit option not available in Texas), or a combination of these options. Monthly installments can be received for as

long as the borrower lives in the home or for a fixed period. There is no repayment required of any kind until the home is sold or the borrower(s) permanently move from the residence. To increase senior access to the loan, there is no income or credit qualifications required when qualifying for this loan. The proceeds can be used in any manner the borrower wishes but are most often used to make home repairs or supplement income.

According to statistics collected by the industry, more than 50,000 reverse mortgage loans have been originated to date. Currently there are three reverse mortgage programs available; the FHA Insured Home Equity Conversion Mortgage, or "HECM," the Fannie Mae Home Keeper reverse mortgage and jumbo reverse mortgages available from Financial Freedom Senior Funding Corporation of Irvine, CA.

O'Hare noise levels and soundproof aid reviewed

The O'Hare Noise Commission and the Chicago Dept. of Aviation are revisiting noise levels that provide eligibility for soundproofing homes around O'Hare Airport.

Commission chairman Arlene Mulder said discussions have taken place about altering the O'Hare Noise Contour Map used to determine eligibility for the soundproofing program.

The Noise Contour Map currently in use was drawn in 1997. A new map will be drawn in 2000, and there is concern that boundaries may shrink compared to the eligible area on the 1997 map.

At a recent meeting representatives of 31 member communities and school districts were told that monitors around the airport show that noise levels have reduced since 1997. Airplanes using O'Hare must now utilize quieter engines, referred to as Stage 3.

The Commission has asked that soundproofing eligibility be expanded to homes with a 65 DNL measurement from the current 70 DNL level. DNL is a measurement term that translates as Day-Night Sound Level, a

measurement accepted by the FAA to determine average noise levels. Dropping the measurement from 70 to 65 would entitle more homes farther from O'Hare to sound insulation.

Joe Karaganis, the leading spokesman for the Suburban O'Hare Commission (SOC), claims that most other major cities in the country use 65 DNL as the threshold measurement.

The SOC says the number of homes within the 65 DNL contour could be as high as 49,000, but Chicago estimates the number at 20,000, says Karaganis.

The soundproofing program allows chosen homes to have new windows installed, and, in some cases, air conditioning. To date, nearly 4,000 homes around

O'Hare have been soundproofed under this program. Some homes still remain within the 70 DNL threshold to receive soundproofing.

At present, only single-family homes are considered for the program, but including some multi-family dwellings in the program is being discussed.

The soundproofing program is supported by a tax on airplane

tickets. On April 1, 2001 this tax increased to \$4.50 from \$3.

The 1997 Noise Contour Map showed that slightly over 7,000 homes qualify for soundproofing.

During 2001, 850 homes will be soundproofed at an expected cost of \$27.2 million.

District 63 joins O'Hare Noise Commission

At its April 24 meeting, the District 63 board voted unanimously to join the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission.

Walter Korpan, assistant superintendent of business services, said the district can provide information to the commission and the commission can return input to the district. Korpan said that district schools are in line with the airport and get a lot of noise. "We'll do whatever we can to soundproof our buildings," Korpan told a reporter.

Brian Gilligan, the commission's executive director, confirmed that District 63 will become a member organization by resolution at the May 4 meeting.
