
Local residents graduate from Citizen's Police Academy





Niles' budget plans conservatively for fiscal year 2001-2002

Village minutes from the Fiscal Year 2001-2002 Budget Hearing held on April 23 present the accomplishments of last year's budget, and introduce safeguards for what the mayor indicates may be an economical-

'If our local economy throws a curve at us, we have some things in place as contingency plans," stated Village Finance Director George Van Geem.

However, the new Budget is significantly based on such conservative sales tax revenue projections that the Village could end the year relatively un-

Although sales tax revenue increased by eight percent over the last fiscal year, the 2001-2002 Budget assumes sales tax revenues will only grow a conservative two percent.

Therefore, rather than assume last year's sales tax revenue of \$18,532,000 will grow by additional \$1.482,560 (eight percent) this year, the Village Budget projects collecting \$370,640 in additional sales tax revenue for 2001-2002.

Over half of the new budget's General Fund Revenue comes from sales tax. Van Geem called it the Village's "single most important revenue source."

A new Debt Service Fund col-

lecting 1/4 percent of sales tax dollars brought in \$2.3 million dollars this year, with \$1 million currently committed towards paying down debt.

Other revenue sources include the annual property tax levy increase of 4.9 percent and the four percent water rate increase. Assistant Finance Director

Scott Neukirch stated that these were the only increases in taxes or fees caused by the Budget, pointing out that the annual property tax levy is below five percent, as the Village prefers. The four-percent water rate reflects an earlier rate hike from the City of Chicago, Niles' supplier, and brings the water rate to \$3.08 per 1,000 gallons.

"Even with this increase, the Village water rate is still among the lowest in the area," stated Neukirch.

Expenses were down 6.2 percent from the Fiscal Year 2001

Van Geem stated that expenses were within 1/2 percent of this year's budgeted amounts, even with a surprise increase in energy costs.

The minutes close with Mayor Blase thanking Department Heads and staff, then encouraging them to try and reduce every line-item on their respective budgets at least 10 percent by the end of the year.

"This will lead us in the direction that we want to go... and enable us to at least come out even at the end of the year."

Niles board OKs budget. abates tax levy

On May 22 Niles trustees both approved the budget for the coming fiscal year and voided a portion of property tax levy for the past fiscal year.

The \$4.4 million of taxes that property owners would have paid to service bond debt dating back to 1995 will now be paid by existing village funds. The revenue replacing taxpayers' funds came from the village's one-quarter percent home-rule sales tax, as well as from water revenues and tax-increment financing, said Niles Finance Director George Van Geem.

"When the village has other funds that can be used for debt servicing, we'd prefer to use them and advise the county accordingly," Van Geem said. With notification, the county assessor will not bill homeowners via their tax bills.

The new budget figure remains



To help consumers understand these findings, the National Headache Foundation has developed a new information brochure, New Perspectives on Caffeine and Headache, that offers new ways to help people understand the relationship between caffeine and headache and help them make a wellinformed decision about treatment. Consumers can also learn ways to measure their caffeine consumption and gain a better understanding of the role caffeine plays in treating head-"We wanted to bring consu-

mers the opinions of experts to help them make the right decisions abut treating their headaches," says Suzanne Simons, executive director of the National Headache Foundation. "Our hope is that the findings of this panel and the information in the brochure will help eliminate any confusion headache sufferes may have regarding what triggers their headaches and how to

The New Perspectives on Caffeine and Headache brochure addresses the science behind headache-fighting caffeine's properties. By increasing the production of stomach acid, caffeine helps the body absorb headache medicines more quickly. Caffeine also constricts certain blood flow and eases pressure associated with certain headaches, such as painful migranes. The brochure offers a quiz that helps people determine how much caffeine they consume on a daily basis, a list of the most common sources of caffeine and a chart to gain a better idea of their weekly caffeine intake. Minimally invasive kidney surgery reduces complications, pain and recovery time

Jeanette Kosta. 67. of Niles needed a cancerous tumor removed from her kidney. but traditional surgery would have been dangerous. Kosta has diminished lung capacity due to a previous illness. A long. invasive surgery could have affected Kosta's breathing and put her at risk for developing pneumonia. Doctors at Advocate Lutheran General Hospital offered Kosta an alternative. A minimally invasive surgery called laparoscopy. "With less surgery, there was less recuperation and I was able to get up out of bed quickly." said Kosta.

"Laparoscopic surgery is well established, but using this procedure to operate on kidneys is a new application of the technology." according to Gordon R. Gluckman. M.D., a urologic surgeon at Lutheran General Hospital. The operation involves making small incisions in the abdomen to permit the insertion of instruments and a small camera that is connected to a monitor to guide the surgeon's work. "The visualization is great," said Dr. Gluckman. "The camera magnifies everything, which

makes identification of blood vessels and lymphatics easier."

Laparoscopy is an improvement over the traditional surgery, which involves a painful incision. There are many benefits to this new alternative: shorter hospital stay, quicker recovery time. reduced post-operative discomfort and less noticeable scarring. Edward Brandon. 75. of Morton Grove was recuperating at home less than 48 hours after having a kidney removed using laparoscopic surgery. "Within a week and a half I was driving and running errands,' said Brandon. Within three weeks Brandon was able to re-

"Laparoscopic surgery is not for everyone, but for the right candidate, it can be very satisfying." said Dr. Gluckman.



A second chance to improve women's bones

(NAPS)-The loss of estrogen at menopause causes bone deterioration to accelerate, leaving women ata real risk for developing osteoporosis later in

However, a recent study to evaluate the long-term effects of estrogen replacement therapy found that women who start ET at age 65 can actually gain back bone, prevent further bone loss and decrease their rate of fracture compared to women who use it early and then stop.

"As women age, their risk of fracture increases," said Dr. Sarah Berga, associate professor of OB/GYN. Division of Reproductive Endocrinology, University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. "It is important that women in their 60s and 70s understand they can still take measures to prevent the disabling complications of low bone

Younger women who have undergone a hysterectomy along with the removal of the ovaries are especially at risk for osteoporosis because they will be without estrogen longer than women who undergo menopause naturally. Unfortunately many women discontinue estrogen when their symptoms (hot flashes. night sweats) subside.

For these women. Climara* (estradiol transdermal system) can provide the lowest estrogen dose clinically proven to prevent osteoporosis — an attractive option for women returning to estrogen in their 60s and 70s.

"Continuous long-term treatment is beneficial in preventing the onset of osteoporosis," said Dr. Berga. One in two women over the age of 50 will have an osteoporosisrelated fracture in their lifetime, most commonly of the hip, spine or wrist.

Services for today's health conscious women

(NAPS) -- Today's women are fessionals at small hospitals and more health conscious than their mothers and as a result more likely to get the health services they

This is especially true when it comes to mammograms, OB/ GYN care and postmenopausal care. In response, more medical centers are being created that cater specifically to women and their busy schedules.

By focusing women's care in one center and providing schedules that factor in work hours, these centers make it easier for women to get the care they need.

A good example is the South Carolina Comprehensive Breast Center at Palmetto Richland Memorial Hospital in Columbia, SC, which has grown from 3,000 annual examinations to currently more than 14,000 per year.

The busy facility is expected to double its volume over the next three years, says director Dr. Tommy Cupples, proving there is demand for facilities that focus on women's health.

"Breast cancer is a disease that is complex to diagnose and treat," said Dr. Cupples, a leading specialist in mammography, digital mammography, breast ultrasound, image-guided needle biopsy techniques and computerassisted diagnosis (CAD) for mammography. "In general, the large medical centers that are able to make a commitment to subspecialize in treating women's health may be able to make a difference for women in early diagnosis and treatment. However, the important thing is to be proactive and get an exam -- there are very dedicated and capable pro-

clinics across the nation.

Equipping hospitals, clinics and women's health centers with some of the latest equipment can save time lost to repeating tests while new technologies may increase the accuracy of diagnosis and treatment. New equipment also can replace some invasive procedures -- such as surgical biopsy -- with non-invasive, highquality diagnostic ultrasound exams or minimally invasive vacuum-assisted core biopsies.

Women's centers are investing in advanced diagnostic equipment, such as the Siemens Mammomat 3000 Nova, which combines advanced digital spot mammography technology with a design that optimizes the x-ray beam for the highest quality image at the lowest possible dose. The system's design also incorporates an automatic system that determines optimal breast compression for best image quality and greatest patient comfort.

And while mammography is the best single way to detect early breast cancer, breast care centers like the one at Palmetto Richland Memorial Hospital are now utilizing high-quality ultrasound systems, such as the Siemens SONOLINE Elegra. The Elegra is used to guide biopsies, or to gather additional information hat can increase the diagnostic confidence of simple breast cysts, for example, which may render an invasive biopsy unnecessary.
