## From the Left Hand

It was Sunday The Seventh around noontime. I was listening to the Bears game on the radio when the announcement the bombings had taken place...that was 60 years ago. I was 16 years old. The Bears were playing their last regular season game against the south-side Chicago Cardinals. Five or six hours later I had a high school fraternity meeting at my house. The 15, 16 and 17-year-olds were full of war-talk. Since they were younger than the minimum age for joining the services they didn't expect to see military service. Within two years one of the 16-year-olds was killed at the Rapido River in Italy.

Another Sunday The Seventh. The Bears game was on TV when the announcement the bombings had occurred in Afghanistan. I'm now 76 years old and the Bears were playing the Atlanta Hawks. No club meeting this time. Hopefully, today's teen-agers will not be in harm's way two years from now.

During the week of September 11 I attended services at The Bahá'í Temple in Wilmette, a heavily police guarded Muslim Center on Elston Avenue in Chicago, a synagogue on Milwaukee Avenue in Glenview and a Catholic Church on Golf Road in Niles. Two of the services were ecumenical-leaders from many denominations eliciting prayers. The message at all four institutions was the same - patriotic and supportive of America, prayers of humility and optimism and prayers of good will.

The Niles Village Board of Trustees approved an ordinance last month to protect new condominium owners by adding warranties for materials, workmanship, operation and construction.

The new adjusted warranties will protect condominium owners within one year of the time that the developer hands over control of that unit. The developer will go through the proper authorities to see that all major repairs concerning mechanical systems (within a one-year period from the date of relinquishing control of the unit to the owner) will be the repaired at the developers expense.

Costs of regular routine maintenance, such as personal damage done by occupancies, accidents by weather systems, and normal wear and tear will not be included within these circumstances.

## Community Focus

### ABA: "Rule of law is our strongest weapon"

President, Robert E. Hirshon, speaking for the American Bar Association, offers the following thoughts for public consideration.

As Americans move forward from the shocking events of Sept. 11, we must develop actions that permit prompt and effective investigation and prosecution of those responsible for these heinous acts. Additionally, we must prepare ourselves for the possibility of war against those rogue nations that have aided and abetted the terrorists.

But despite the special measures we will need to take to battle, we must remember that our strongest weapon against anarchy and human destruction continues to be the rule of law.

The terrorists who attacked our country would like nothing better than to destroy the fabric of our democracy. We cannot allow them to do that; we must keep our passions in check and remain firm against ethnic or religious scapegoating.

The terrorists also seek to affect our daily lives by putting us in a state of fear so that we cannot conduct business as usual. We must fight these fears by

maintaining control of our lives and by finding a new comfort zone of living.

We know that some things will not be as they were before the terrorists struck. Our leaders have united to address such complex issues as electronic surveillance, wiretapping, computer encryption and immigration procedures. As a country we need to be ready for inconveniences, restrictions and possible loss of some liberties. We must make sacrifices to find and combat the zealots who respect neither law nor religion.

As Americans we share a common burden, a responsibility created by our citizenship. It is one for which lawyers are particularly prepared, and which we are ready to embrace.

To help this effort, I have created the American Bar Association Task Force on Terrorism and the Law. The task force draws on a range of experts: a former general counsel of the Central Intelligence Agency, a retired brigadier general from the United States Army, and experts in the law of business, immigration, civil liberties, aviation, international affairs,

technology, crime and civil liability. The task force already is analyzing congressional and administration proposals and is prepared to help find an appropriate balance between national security and individual liberty.

The task force's work will form a thoughtful basis for recommendations to federal leaders on these critical matters.

### Air pollution violations settled with M.G. manufacturer

A Morton Grove company will pay \$166,337 as penalty for its alleged failure to comply with air pollution law, Attorney General Jim Ryan announced.

Under terms of a proposed settlement, the company at the 6400 block of Oakton St., will pay the penalty within 30 days of a final order by the Illinois Pollution Control Board approving the settlement. The case stems from alleged excess emissions of volatile organic material (VOM) into the environment, failure to achieve an overall reduction in uncontrolled VOM emissions with capture and control techniques and failure to utilize compliant coating in the automotive department.

The company is a packing seal manufacturing plant that serves the automotive industry. The violations occurred at the facility from mid-1991 through September 1999, according to inspections conducted by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Attorney General Ryan notes in the proposed settlement that the company has now complied state environmental and Pollution Control Board regulations.

### Firemen also help fight

Fifteen year veteran firefighter/paramedic Lieutenant Bill White of the Niles Fire Department recently received a Master's Degree in Criminal Social Justice Administration from Lewis University in Romeoville. The program was predominantly comprised of Chicago and other police officers seeking advancement.

"Such accredited programs are not available in fire service administration," said White. "The close working relationship with law enforcement, similar administration responsibilities and the lack of a fire service degree" are what led White to enter the program.

"I wanted to expand my training and gather an expertise in Criminal Social Justice Administration to become more helpful to fellow firefighters and to the general public."

White said that social issues, those that communities want funded, are seen as responsibilities of law enforcement, when in fact the same social issues are being handled by firefighters but are not recognized or funded in the same way. Crossover responsibilities include arson investigations, DUI's, the overwhelming popularity and use of the "Ecstasy" drug by teens, suicide overdoses, drug issues, domestic violence calls and hazardous materials.

"Firefighters are called to a fire scene that can turn into an arson or crime scene to attend to the wounded or provide expertise on fires, while it is clear that the overall responsibility for the crime scene belongs to law enforcement," said White.

Federal funding for police in 2001 was \$11 billion. Comparatively, federal funding for firefighting was \$300,000. Critics of the disparity hope to double the firefighting appropriation.

Bill Manning, the editor of a website called Fire Engineering, took congressional leaders to task what he perceived as

their lack of support for firefighters.

"At a 1999 congressional briefing on domestic terrorism surrounding the Fire Caucus Dinner, firefighters listened quietly as high-ranking officials from the FBI, Department of Defense and other big-time agencies gushed with their stated desire to partnership with the fire service on terrorism response," wrote Manning. "When it was the fire service representatives' turn to make their presentations, you couldn't find a federal bureaucrat in the house. In this case, actions spoke far louder than the words."

One of the skills White has acquired as part of his education is learning how to put a finesse in written requests for budget appropriations.

"Learning how to speak to get the attention of the federal government to approve crucial funding needed for training, equipment is a challenge," he said.

"Each year, more than 500,000 unspeakable acts of arson are committed in the United States," wrote Manning in June. "It's a crime that exacts on children and adults the worst physical pain on this earth. Thirty percent of all fires go undetermined. Only 17 percent of arson fires are solved by arrest, and a mere two percent of arson offenses lead to a conviction. The public in general and our elected officials are 'not dialed' into the arson problems in America."

White is a part-time instructor at Oakton Community College and teaches a fire science program, including the courses, Introduction to Fire Service and Fire Investigation.

"I want to share my knowledge, experience and expertise to further educate the public in being better prepared in knowing the areas to protect themselves in and avoiding potentially life-threatening situations through communication and education," said White. "More public awareness of safety issues will prevent many avoidable safety hazards."

"One reason I'm here in the Niles Fire Department is to see that the men working for me go home safely after their shifts have ended."

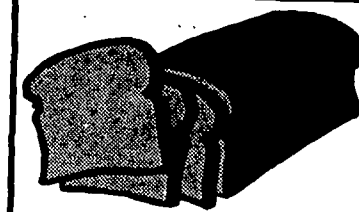

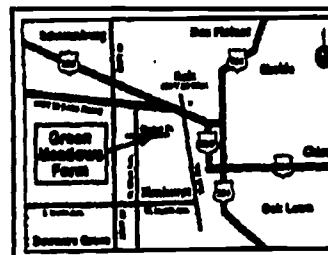

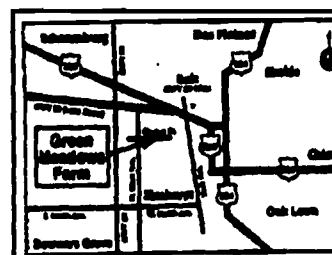

### AmeriCorps members make a difference

A growing number of people are breaking away from the working world and taking some time to serve their country in AmeriCorps.

One example is Zachary Sifuentes, a Harvard graduate who took a personal journey after graduation, joining the national service program that tutors children, runs after-school programs, mentors troubled youth, improves the environment and recruits community volunteers.

Since 1994, AmeriCorps has sent more than 200,000 Americans to inner cities and rural areas to tackle the country's most troubling social problems. For some people, joining means having the chance to see a part of the country they've never been to before. Sifuentes, a California native who grew up in Idaho, did just that.

"The really great thing is that you can apply to go anywhere," he says. "Most people stay in their area, but the possibility of finding a place and going there - I loved that. I looked in all the far places - Alaska, Hawaii, New York City - then found Puerto Rico."

While searching through the programs on the Internet, Sifuentes found Centro AYANI, a local organization that provides therapy and other services to children with disabilities in a rural area of Puerto Rico.

"Their biggest problem was that they didn't have someone who speaks, writes and understands English, and all the grants are in English," he said. At the time, the organization needed funding to build an educational and therapeutic center.

Sifuentes raised nearly half the cost of the project with the first grant he wrote. He also designed a web page for the organization and obtained donations of computers that will be used for the children the center serves, and also for adults in the surrounding community to learn to use computers during evening classes.

Sifuentes was particularly interested in doing community service because of all the opportunities he had, including going to Harvard. As graduation approached, he knew he wanted to do a year of community service because he wanted to give back to others for all the benefits he had received.

In addition to a living allowance and health insurance, AmeriCorps members receive a \$4,725 education award after completing a year of service. The award can be used to pay off student loans or cover tuition at college or graduate school.

Now enrolled in a graduate program at the University of Michigan, Sifuentes is considering a career in either teaching or in the nonprofit sector.

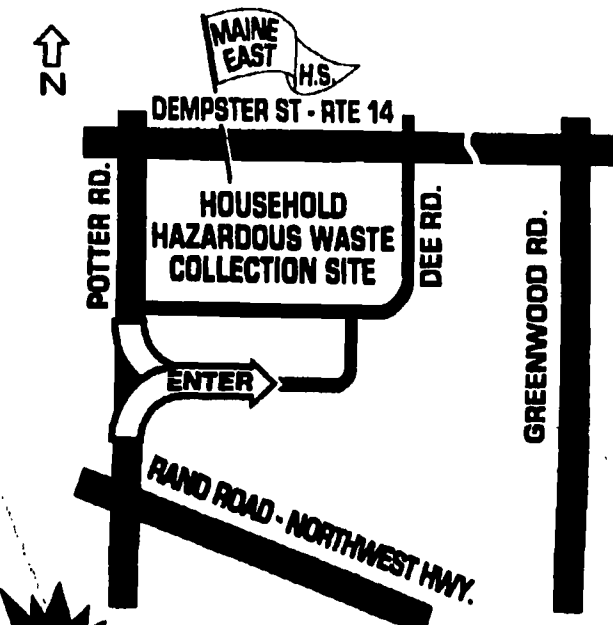

Vaccine will be given to persons at high risk for complications from the flu. This includes Niles residents 65 years and older, those under 65 who have underlying chronic illnesses, and their health care providers.

Anyone who belongs to an HMO (Humana Gold or United Health Care) and any other insurance that doesn't cover flu vaccine will be charged \$15. Anyone who has Medicare must bring their Medicare card. Medicare will be billed. You will need to show an identification that contains your age and Niles residency. Homebound residents can contact Terry Dalla Valle for an appointment.

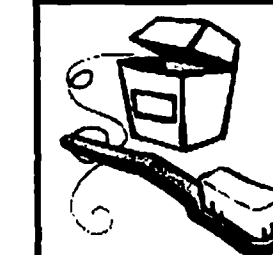

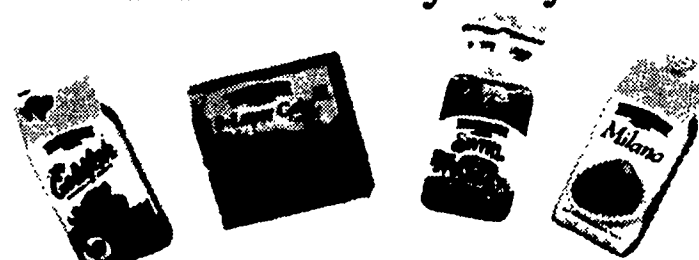

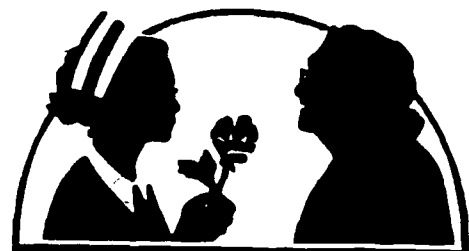

Pneumonia immunizations provide lifelong immunity to the most common forms of pneumonia. People should receive this immunization once every five years.

## Central Air Conditioning Systems: How They Work

Let's face it, central air conditioning has become an integral part of the American homeowner's lifestyle.

A recent study shows that seven out of every ten new homes built today include central air conditioning as a standard feature.

Thousands of other homeowners are adding central air to their existing homes.

Yet, how many owners or prospective owners of central air conditioners know how the system works?

According to a recent study by the Trane Home Comfort Institute, not that many.

To help you understand how this integral part of your home operates, the Trane Home Comfort Institute offers this simplified explanation:

A central air conditioning system essentially consists of two parts: the coil, which extracts unwanted heat and humidity from your home, and the condenser, which discharges the unwanted heat to the outdoors.

Most residential air conditioners are split systems, meaning that the coil is located indoors and the condenser, outdoors. When the coil and the condenser are both located outdoors in the same unit, the system is called a packaged system.

In a split system, two copper

tubes called refrigerant lines connect the indoor coil and the outdoor condenser. The smaller of the lines is called the liquid line; the larger, the suction line.

The lines are filled with a chemical refrigerant which has a boiling point low enough that it evaporates at relatively low temperatures and takes heat and moisture out of the air as it passes through the coil. The refrigerant travels in a closed loop between the coil and the condenser.

The loop begins as the liquid refrigerant passes through the coil, which is a network of tubes located on top of the furnace.

As the refrigerant travels through the coil, it evaporates from a liquid to a vapor, absorbing heat by cooling the air passing around the coil. The furnace blower distributes the cooled air through ducts into the interior of the house.

Meanwhile, the vaporized refrigerant moves through the suction lines to a compressor in the outdoor unit. The compressor compacts the vapor and moves the hot refrigerant gas under high pressure through the condenser, which is a network of tubes exposed to outdoor air. As the refrigerant travels through these tubes, it cools and returns to a liquid. The heat released during this condensation process is dispersed into the outdoor air by a

fan.

The refrigerant then flows through the liquid lines from the condenser back to the coil inside the house and the cycle begins again.

The compressor is considered "the heart of the system" because it is the pump that circulates the refrigerant through the loop. Because of its importance, experts at the Trane Home Comfort Institute recommend that you look carefully at the compressor's reputation and warranty when selecting a system.

They also recommend checking the SEER or Seasonal Efficiency Rating, which is an indication of a unit's efficiency. The higher the SEER, the higher the efficiency. The higher the efficiency, the less electricity needed to cool your home. Federal regulations now require that all split systems have a SEER of 10 or higher.

In addition, it's important to note that an outdoor condenser can be combined with dozens of different indoor coils. To obtain the rated efficiency, make sure the capacity and SEER of the indoor unit matches that of the outdoor unit.

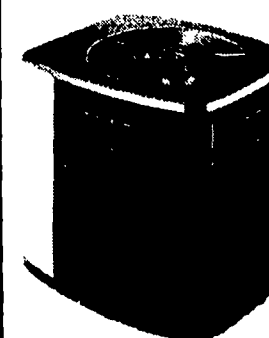

## Helping children deal with loss

Every child experiences loss at some time. It could be as simple as a broken toy, or as complex as the death of someone dearly loved. Helping your child deal appropriately with the feeling of grief can make the experience much less painful.

Often the first significant loss a child experiences is the death of a pet. As unpleasant as it may be, the situation presents an important learning experience for the child. If the child witnessed the event or feels responsible for the pet's death, his or her feelings are likely to be all the more intense.

Your feelings are important, also. Don't feel a need to hide your tears for the sake of your child. It's all right to grieve together and talk together about what happened. It's important for your child to know that even if he or she sometimes neglected the pet or was angry at the pet, that didn't make the pet die. Children often secretly blame themselves when something bad happens.

If you sense that your child is

afraid to ask questions or talk about what happened for fear of upsetting others, you may need to initiate the conversation. Let your child know you are willing to talk about what happened when he or she is ready. Share information in a way your child can understand.

Having a funeral for a pet can help bring closure. Let your child help plan what to do. You may want to talk about special memories, or make a tape recording about your pet's life. Making a scrapbook with favorite pictures of your pet can bring back good memories. Your child may enjoy drawing pictures or writing about your pet. You may want to create a memory box if there are items you want to save.

Often, after a pet dies, parents rush to get a replacement pet. However, getting another pet too soon usually doesn't relieve the grief. Even talking about getting another pet right away can be upsetting to a child who is still grieving. Your child could end up taking angry feelings out on the

new pet. When your child begins to ask about getting a new pet, that is likely to be the right time to start planning for another pet.

Don't be surprised if your child sometimes "takes a break" from grief. Children can be very upset, then go out and play as if nothing happened. This doesn't mean they are through grieving. The feelings may come back many times. Bedtime can be difficult. Being alone in bed at night can give time to think and bring back unpleasant feelings. Some children may find a highlight or stuffed animal comforting. Respect your child's feelings; avoid making fun of them or ignoring them.

If your child is having a difficult time with the loss, especially if it is a major loss such as a relative, it could be helpful to talk with your school's professional counselor. The counselor may have a small group that meets to help children deal with loss. The counselor can answer questions your child may have and help him or her develop ways to handle any

uncomfortable feelings that may have been making it difficult to concentrate and learn in class. The counselor can also suggest ways to deal with any behavior problems that may have developed. Call your child's school to talk with the school counselor and schedule an appointment.

A visit to the library may yield several child-appropriate books to read with your child about death. Books may answer questions your child has been afraid to ask. A good book will stimulate conversation and provide new understanding. Just the act of reading a book aloud to your child will give comfort. The extra attention is also valuable at this time. You may even find that you and your child grow closer as you deal with the grief together.

Grief is a process. It does not automatically stop after a given period of time. Your child cannot "snap out of it." Helping your child handle the process well provides a foundation for dealing with other losses that are likely to

occur in life. Helping your child learn to be resilient takes time and effort, but resiliency is a valuable life skill that will help your child grow into a strong, confident adult.

Helen worked for 35 or 40 years at the Niles elementary school on Touhy Avenue. She was the wife of Eddie Bacher who was the Public Works superintendent during Niles major growth years in the fifties, sixties and seventies. Ed was also the deputy fire chief when The Bugle first began bugling in 1957.

Al Hoelbl was appointed fire chief when village president Nick Blase was first elected in 1961. Al served in

the post through the 1980's. Helen Bacher's brother-in-law, Charley Bacher, was a captain in the fire department. Charley married Hoelbl's mother. I'm guessing Hoelbl was then a nephew of Helen's.

Both Helen and Al were bulwarks during the early building of Niles. Their contributions, like so many of the pre-World War II residents, laid the groundwork for the All American City Niles became in the early sixties.

## Cyberstalkers face jail with new state law

The convenience of having a computer at work, at home or bringing one with you on the move has evolved into a necessity for many users. However, increased Internet communication has brought with it increased online harassment by e-mail users.

It's called, "cyberstalking," and in August it became illegal.

A bill sponsored by state senator Ira L. Silverstein (8th dist.) and signed into law by Gov. George Ryan makes it a felony to send repeated electronic messages threatening bodily harm or assault.

Niles Police Department detective Jim Elenz said that while there were occasional reports of physical stalking, there has yet to be any reported cases of cyberstalking in the area, but added that this is still a serious problem and this new law is necessary.

"Many people are somewhat computer illiterate and don't know who they're dealing with when they go online," said Elenz. "You have to find some way to deal with every situation, and sometimes they go to extremes. A lot of the instances can be serious. Especially when the victims are kids."

Now a Class 4 felony, a convicted cyberstalker can face one-to-three years in jail. A second or further conviction could result in a Class 3 felony.

conviction with three-to-five years in prison.

Though this is a new and commonly unknown problem, the crime spreads every day, and many legislators believe that awareness is the first step to confront these offenses.

"This is a growing problem that expands every day when a new individual gains access to a computer and the Internet," the senator said in a recent press release. "The great problem with this crime is that the stalker can come from anywhere and without leaving the confines of their house, can terrorize the individual."

Silverstein maintains that the lack of knowledge about cyberstalking is one of the biggest problems surrounding the issue: his fall newsletter will contain more information about cyberstalking dangers.

"The real job, for all of us, is to get the word out that this is a serious problem that requires our efforts if we hope to reduce the number of incidents."

The number of cyberstalking offenses in Illinois are unknown, mainly because of the anonymity of e-mail. Additionally, many victims do not report the crimes, making it difficult to keep track of statistics.

There are still some similarities between offline and online stalking, such as most of the victims are women and most of the stalkers are men.

Many cases of cyberstalking begin through chat rooms, where many individuals—usually strangers will enter a place and can all share responses about various subjects on the Internet. If someone becomes a victim of cyberstalking through such activities, many authorities believe that the best thing to do is contact their local police department and report the crime. They should also not delete any messages they receive from their stalker and instead turn them in to the proper authorities.

"Individuals should obviously change their e-mail address, user name, etc.," Silverstein advises. "If the stalker got the victim's name from a chat room or bulletin board, they should not go back to those sites."

According to Working to Halt Online Abuse (WHOA), an organization devoted to cyberstalking awareness, it received reports of 353 cases last year; over 19 percent of their cases escalated into offline stalking. Unfortunately, as victims are not very forthcoming, the organization is concerned that it often receives unreliable about stalkers.

The bill has the support of the Illinois Coalition Against Domestic Violence, the Council on Domestic Violence and the National Organization of Women.

## Burglary

Niles Police responded to a 911 call of a burglary in progress on Sunday, September 23, at approximately 6:15 p.m. in the 7600 block of Madison. The 24 year old male resident had fled his house when he saw an intruder attempting to force entry through a locked window. The resident went to a neighboring home where he called police. Upon arrival Niles officers discovered the offender exiting the home through the rear door where he was immediately taken into custody without incident. Niles officers discovered the damaged window where force was used by

the offender to gain entry.

The offender was identified as a 25 year old male from Chicago.

The offender was charged with one count of residential burglary and was taken for a bond hearing on Monday, September 24, at the 2nd District Courthouse in Skokie, where his bond was set at \$20,000 "D" (10% applies), by Judge Orr. The offender is scheduled to appear in court on October 16.

Niles Police want to make it clear that the offender should be considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

## Planning Reduces Stress in Times of Tragedy

The recent tragic events in New York, Virginia, and Pennsylvania have shaken each of us to the core. We look at the horrific images of destruction and misery surrounding us and they speak to us in a personal way. Many Americans have flocked to churches, synagogues, mosques, and other places of worship seeking answers to questions regarding the meaning of life and the existence of suffering.

Each of us, to varying degrees,

is affected by this national tragedy. We face similar issues in environmental tragedies such as hurricanes and in personal tragedies such as serious illnesses. In each instance, we prepare the best we can. We plan for ourselves, so that we can reduce anxiety if a crisis arises. We plan for our aging parents who nurtured and guided us. We plan for our spouse or life partner who has helped us to grow in ways we could not have imagined when we first met. We

plan for our children or grandchildren who let us see the world anew through their adoring eyes. We plan for our friends who know our faults and love us unconditionally. Once we prepare, we focus our energies where they belong: on spending precious time with family and friends.

One way we can prepare for personal tragedy is to plan what should happen in the event crisis strikes. Basic estate planning relieves stress at the time of crisis both for us and for those whom we love. The basic estate plan includes four documents: General Durable Power of Attorney, Health Care Durable Power of Attorney, Will, and Revocable Trust.

Through A General Durable Power of Attorney you designate an "Agent" who will make financial decisions for you when you are unable to do so. This Agent may be your spouse, a parent, or a trusted friend. Without this document, nobody is authorized to act for you if you are missing or incapacitated. Without it, if you need to refinance your house to pay for bills, it could only be done by someone going to court and having you declared incompetent. This is an arduous process that is emotionally draining for all involved.

A Health Care Durable Power of Attorney designates an "Agent" to make health care deci-

sions for you if you are unable to make them yourself. With this document in place, you can rest assured that the person you trust will have legal authority to make your medical decisions. You also may wish to prepare a Living Will which expresses what you would want done if you are in a persistent vegetative state or terminal condition.

A Will has several functions. First, and most importantly, under the laws of most states it is the only way you can designate whom you wish to serve as guardian for your minor children. Without a Will the court will decide who will be guardian, regardless of your wishes. Unfortunately, no matter how caring the judge may be, he or she does not know and love your children as you do. Second, the Will distributes any assets that are held in your name. Without a Will, the assets are distributed according to a list set by state law for "intestate succession." Unfortunately, this set list does not take your specific circumstances into account and assets often do not go to the desired person or in the desired manner. The assets can "pour-over" into a Revocable Living Trust, to be distributed by its terms. Third, it names someone as your Personal Representative to carry out the instructions set forth in your Will.

At your death, even with a

Will, any assets owned by you must go through "probate" in order to be distributed to those designated by you. Probate is the process of transferring title from the person who dies to the person who has the right to receive the property. This process can be expensive, time consuming, and emotionally draining for those left behind. A Revocable Living Trust is set up now, during your lifetime, and holds legal title to your assets. As a result, the assets do not go through probate at death because the trust owns them and the trust did not die. Even though legal title is in the Trust, you still can use the assets as you wish. If you become incapacitated, the person you have chosen as your successor "Trustee" will manage the assets for you, much like the Agent under your General Durable Power of Attorney. The Trust can be very flexible and can be used to direct how and when the assets will be used. For example, the Trust can be used to ensure that your children do not squander money but, rather, keep the money for a higher education.

Finally, it is important to know how other assets are handled. Periodically review the beneficiary designations on your 401k, IRA, or other qualified plan assets. Often, circumstances change and beneficiary designations do not change with the times. This becomes increasingly important as qualified plan assets comprise a larger and larger portion of the typical person's assets. Beneficiary designations for life insurance also should be reviewed periodically.

Unfortunately, we cannot eliminate the possibility of tragedy in our lives. However, we can plan ahead so that, if tragedy occurs in our lives, we will not have unnecessary stresses and burdens as obstacles in our path. Of course, these are just the basics. There are many considerations which come into play when attempting to achieve your goals: beneficiaries with special needs, creditor protection, income taxes, divorce protection, estate taxes, etc. A qualified estate planning attorney, one that specializes in that practice area, can help you structure your plan to achieve the best result.

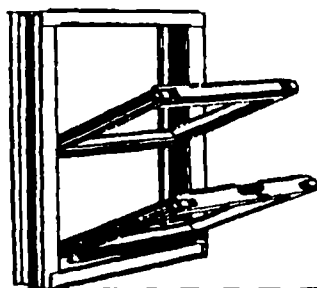

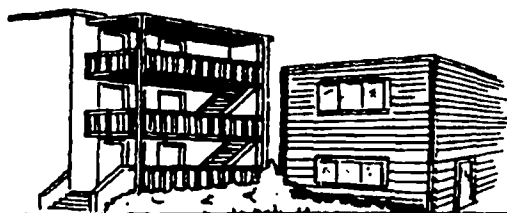

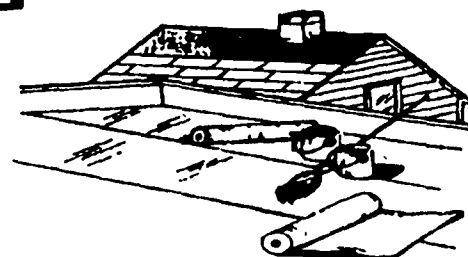
