Jacklyn Naughton, a Niles North science teacher, was recently named the runner-up for the first Illinois Science Teachers Association (ISTA)/ExxonMobil Exemplary High School Teacher Award. She was honored at an ISTA convention in Peoria where she was presented with a crystal trophy and her award from J. Patrick McGinn, the Midwest Regional Public Affairs Manager for ExxonMobil. William Donato, a Woodstock High School teacher, was the winner of the award.

Ms. Naughton is a 2001 Golden Apple Finalist and the 1996 Niles North Teacher of the Year. She teaches AP and Honors Biology and serves as head coach of the Science Olympiad. Ms. Naughton started the Research and Investigators of Tomorrow (RIOT) Club twelve years ago with five members. It has now grown to 57 members. She utilizes computer technology in data collection, graphing and statistical analysis, and employs a website that students use to prepare for labs.

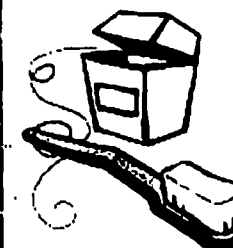

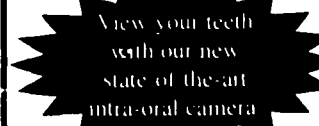

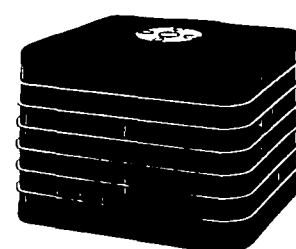

Sheriff offers holiday safety tips

Cook County Sheriff Michael F. Sheahan is urging county residents to exercise extra caution during the Christmas season, when holiday activities can lead to an upswing in theft and other crimes.

"The holidays present the criminal element with numerous opportunities," said Sheahan. "The Christmas shopping season is prime time for thieves and pickpockets and with a number of families out-of-town visiting relatives during the holidays, their empty homes become targets for burglaries."

But, Sheahan added, there

are several precautions that can be taken to protect yourself and your home. The Sheriff suggests the following:

While shopping, be alert and aware of possible pickpockets. Always hold your purse close to your body or under your jacket if possible. Men should avoid carrying their wallets in their backpocket. It is more difficult for a thief to reach a wallet if it is kept in a jacket lining pocket or a front pants pocket.

Be alert while waiting in check-out lines or while entering or exiting an elevator or escalator. Pickpockets often

work in groups and attempt to trap their victims between two thieves.

Don't overload yourself with packages and other purchases; make sure that your hands are free and that you can get to your wallet or purse easily. Don't leave merchandise visible in your car. Make sure any valuable goods are tucked away in bags or placed in the trunk.

In a crowded mall it is important to keep track of your children and teach them what to do should you become separated.

If your holiday plans take you out-of-town to visit friends or relatives, Sheriff Sheahan suggests you take the following precautions to safeguard your home during the holidays:

Use an automatic timer for lights. Cancel mail and newspaper delivery or arrange for a friend/neighbor to pick it up so mail doesn't accumulate.

Let a trusted neighbor know you will be out of town so they can keep an eye open for any suspicious activity around your house.

The biggest potential threat to your home during the holiday season is the fire hazard posed by holiday decorations. By taking these few simple steps you can avoid a fire in your household:

Do not overload circuits with excess electrical cords and don't leave Christmas lights on for an extended period of time. Check decorative lights frequently for shorts or missing light bulbs.

Christmas trees should never be placed near a heating vent, radiator or portable heater. You should also regularly water your Christmas tree to keep it from drying out and becoming susceptible to fire.

District 64 Procedure for Emergency School Closings

Heavy snow, unsafe streets, or other emergencies may make it necessary to close District 64 schools. Announcements regarding emergency school closings are made via television and radio stations; however, sometimes there are media delays in the winter when most area schools are having weather problems. Emergency school closing information is available on the School District 64 web site. Simply access the web site at

www.d64.k12.il.us and click on the Emergency Closings section. Parents will also be notified through their school's "telephone tree" when emergency plan goes into operation.

School closing decisions are made on the basis of District-wide student safety. When schools are open on extremely bad weather days, the final decision rests with parents to decide whether or not their child should attend school.

The Maine Township Special Education Program (MTSEP) and the Extended Day Kindergarten and After School Child Care Program normally follow the same schedule as the Maine Township schools, including Park Ridge - Niles School District 64. Therefore, if District 64 schools are closed, the MTSEP classrooms, Extended Day Kindergarten, and After School Child Care are also closed and transportation will be canceled.

Elvis Entertainer, Trent Carlini coming to Rosemont Theatre

No other solo artist in history has had such an enduring impact on the music scene as Elvis Presley, and Trent Carlini, the number one Elvis entertainer in the world, will continue the King of Rock n' Roll's musical style in a new one-night-only production, *Elvis: From Hollywood to Memphis*. Saturday, January 5, 2002 at 8 p.m. at the Rosemont Theatre. Having performed Presley's music for sold-out audiences worldwide, Carlini returns to the Rosemont Theatre by popular demand, this time showcasing the King's movie music in a tribute to Presley's 13 year motion picture career.

Backed by the 17-piece TC Orchestra and Johnny Star and the Meteors, the Chicago-born Carlini will sing the King's greatest movie hits including "Rock a Hula Baby," "G.I. Blues" and "Girls! Girls! Girls!" Between 1956 and 1969, Elvis Presley appeared in 31 movies including *Love Me Tender*, his first released in 1956. Sales of many of the movie soundtracks and single songs recorded by Presley propelled them to gold or platinum status.



Born in Chicago's Little Italy neighborhood, Carlini began singing when he was 10. At age 14, he and his family moved to Italy and Carlini found the music of Elvis Presley to be a connection with his homeland.

"I have always been a big fan of Elvis and learned early on that I wasn't alone," said Carlini. "When I would sing, my music often consisted of a lot of Rock-a-Billy so audiences would ask me all the time to sing like Elvis. I came to realize that if it would make people happy for me to help keep his music and image alive, then I would. I'm not Elvis, and no one ever will be, but I am proud to pay tribute to him in this way."

Joining Carlini at his *Elvis: From Hollywood to Memphis* concert will be Joe Esposito, Presley's Army buddy and friend for nearly 20 years, and another longtime Presley friend, Al Dvorin, who coined the phrase "Elvis has left the building," announcing it at nearly every Presley concert. Esposito and Dvorin have both become friends and associates of Carlini, much in the same way they were to Presley, and agree Carlini is an extremely talented

entertainer whose music and spirit reminds them of Presley.

From Carlini's popular concerts to music fans buying the King of Rock n' Roll's songs, Elvis Presley continues to live on. On November 27, Presley was posthumously inducted into the Gospel Music Association's Hall of Fame and, as of early December, a re-released RCA Records single called *America The Beautiful* has been in the top ten of the Billboard music chart for seven weeks. The first Elvis Presley single from RCA Records in over 20 years, the CD-single includes "If I Can Dream," recorded live for Elvis' legendary 1968 Comeback TV special, "America The Beautiful," recorded on stage in December 1975 at the Las Vegas Hilton, and "Amazing Grace," recorded at RCA's Studio B in Nashville on March 15, 1971.

Put Some of Your Investment Losses To Work

If you're like most investors, 2001 has been a year you'd just as soon forget. Even before the tragedy in September, the stock market had been slumping - and it's been volatile ever since. As a result, you may be considering selling some stocks at a loss this year to improve your tax situation.

Your investment losses are tax-deductible - to a point. You can use your losses to offset any capital gains you may have achieved, plus \$3,000 of income. This capability can prove quite useful to you, because even when the markets are down, you can still rack up some capital gains by selling investments that, over time, have increased in value. Capital losses also may offset year-end capital gains distributions you may have received from your mutual funds.

To claim a capital loss, however, you must actually sell the stock - and you might not really want to part with it. You may believe that, despite its current decline, this stock still has good prospects for the future and fits in well with your diversified portfolio. So, can you sell the stock to establish your tax loss then buy it back at a lower price?

It's not that simple. In the eyes of the IRS, if you sell a stock and repurchase it - or if you buy a "substantially identical" security - within 30 days, you're making a "wash sale," and you won't be able to deduct any losses resulting from this transaction. And this rule applies to purchases you make within 30 days before or after you sell your stock.

Essentially, you have three strategies for avoiding this wash sale problem. First, you can wait at least 31 days after the sale before repurchasing the stock. Second, you can double your position and then sell your original shares after 31 days. And third, you can sell your shares for a loss and purchase stock of a different company - one that's in the same industry and that has performed similarly to the stock you sold. You can then wait at least 31 days, sell the new stock and repurchase the original stock.

Keep in mind, though, that any purchase you make within the 61-day time frame could violate the wash sale rules. So you'll have to be particularly careful if you've set up a dollar cost averaging plan under which you buy the same amount of stock shares each month. You'll also have to be alert if you automatically reinvest dividends and capital gains.

Before making a stock trade that could conceivably fall under wash sale rules, consult with your tax adviser. You won't want to make any expensive mistakes. Remember, you have many other options for reducing taxes associated with your investments.

Also, make sure that any moves you make won't upset your long-term investment strategy. It's clearly tempting to try to lock in tax-deductible losses, but it's even more important to maintain a portfolio that's designed to meet your individual needs, goals and tolerance for risk.

Wolff's Flea Markets offer Opportunity in Tough Economy

The National Bureau of Economic Research this week made official what most Americans have known for some time: The United States is in a recession. The evidence is everywhere, from massive job cuts to salary freezes to a deep erosion of consumer confidence, resulting in a marked slowdown in retail spending.

In Chicagoland there is a place that provides safe haven from the ravages of these trying economic times: Wolff's Indoor Flea Market in Melrose Park. Now in its third year, Wolff's indoor location - on Mannheim Road just north of North Avenue - provides ample opportunity to those wishing to supplement their incomes or searching for a new career path. It also offers amazing bargains on a wide range of merchandise - including name brand items - for those looking to stretch their budgets.

David and Donald Wolff have operated their flea markets in Chicago for more than a decade. Their outdoor market in Rosemont, IL, at the Allstate Arena near O'Hare International Airport, is the Midwest's largest all-outdoor flea market, attracting hundreds of thousands of shoppers each summer from around the world. Their indoor location is a popular destination year round.

It is a place where hundreds of entrepreneurs chase the American dream of owning their own business. Now it is a place where people land on their feet. Wolff's is a cooperative that attracts vendors from around the United States. Many of these vendors shop for the best deals, buying up overstocked merchandise, seconds and specials, and then pass the savings on to their customers. Other vendors manufacture goods themselves, and then bring them to Wolff's to sell them.

Regardless of which path they take, Wolff's gives them an opportunity they may not be able to get elsewhere. "We always make sure we have space available for new vendors who just want to try us out, or who need a place to sell

their merchandise for the short-term," said David Wolff. Added his brother Donald: "We also can accommodate vendors looking for more of a long-term situation. Often these are people who have lost their jobs or simply grew tired of what they were doing, and need a change."

One of those is longtime Wolff's vendor Tony Williams, who lost his job in 1981, turned to the flea market business, and hasn't looked back. "I started out selling green peppers for 10 for a buck, and I just grew from there," said Williams, who now sells office supplies and takes up a half dozen booths at Wolff's. "I've been able to buy cars, trucks and houses off of this living."

For Frank Speciale, Wolff's Flea Markets provided a way for him to supplement his income while serving as a Rosemont police officer. Now retired, Speciale is still at it, using the income he makes as a Wolff's vendor to supplement his pension. He says the flea market experience still gives him a thrill.

"It gives me the ability to try something new and make it work," said Speciale, who currently is hawking packaged foods at Wolff's. "I love being able to take something like a bottle of water and make the public want it."

Dave Jucius, another longtime

Wolff's vendor, said his father got him started in the business "as soon as I learned to drive," 32 years ago. Jucius said getting into the business isn't as hard as it might seem. The key is starting small and building from there. "I started with six items and now stock 195 different items," he said, adding that relationships tend to develop naturally in the flea market business, and those relationships make the business easier to manage and more fulfilling.

"I have made friends all over the country, from Wyoming to Florida," Jucius said. "Often they will give me a lead for products they don't want, and that really helps, because in this business you always have to be on the lookout for the deals."

According to Brian Santinover, a former retailer of computer hardware and software, vending at Wolff's Flea Market is a good deal because the modest rent he is charged is far less than his previous overhead. "You can pay up to \$3,500 a month when you have a store, even for a small amount of space," Santinover said. "And at Wolff's I get several thousand people walking past my display every weekend. You're not going to get that in a store."

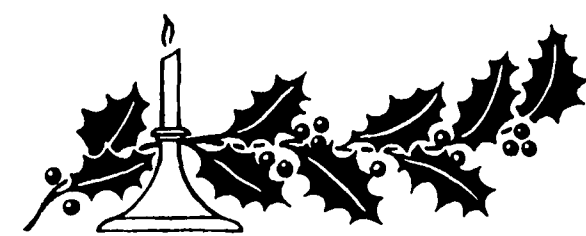

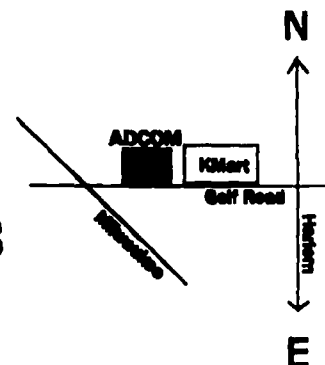
