



Sheriff offers holiday safety tips

Cook County Sheriff Michael F. Sheahan is urging county residents to exercise extra caution during the Christmas season, when holiday activities can lead to an upswing

in theft and other crimes. "The holidays present the criminal element with numerous opportunities," said Sheahan. "The Christmas shopping season is prime time for thieves and pickpockets and with a number of families ou-tof-town visiting relatives during the holidays, their empty homes become targets for bur-

But, Sheahan added, there

are several precautions that can be taken to protect yourself and your home. The Sheriff suggests the following:

While shopping, be alert and aware of possible pickpockets. Always hold your purse close to your body or under your jacket if possible. Men should avoid carrying their wallets in their backpocket. It is more difficult fo ra thief to reach a wallet if it is kept in a jacket lining pocket or a front pants pocket

Be alert while waiting in check-out lines or while entering or exiting an elevator or escalator. Pickpockets often

work in groups and attempt to trap their victims between two thieves.

Don't overload yourself with packages and other purchases: make sure that your hands are free and that you can get to your wallet or purse easily. Don't leave merchandise visible in your car. Make sure any valuable goods are tucked away in bags or placed in the

In a crowded mall it is important to keep track of your children and teach them what to do should you become sepa-

If your holiday plans take you out-of-town to visit friends or relatives, Sheriff Sheahan suggests you take the following precautions to safeguard your home during the holidays:


Use an automatic timer for lights. Cancel mail and newspaper delivery or arrange for a friend/neighbor to pick it up so mail doesn't accumulate

Let a trusted neighbor know you will be out of town so they can keep an eye open for any suspicious activity around your

The piggest potential threat to your home during the holiday season is the fire hazard posed by holiday decorations. By taking these few simple steps you can avoid a fire in your household:

Do not overload circuits with excess electrical cords and don't leave Christmas lights on for an-extended period of time. Check decorative lights frequently for shorts or missing light bulbs.

Christmas trees should never be placed near a heating vent. radiator or portable heater. You should also regularly water your Christmas tree to keep it from drying out and becoming susceptible to fire.





Edward Jones: Put Some of Your Investment Losses To Work

If you're like most investors, 2001 has been a year you'd just as soon forget. Even before the tragedy in September, the stock market had been slumping - and it's been volatile ever since. As a result, you may be considering selling some stocks at a loss this year to improve your tax situation.

Your investment losses are tax-deductible - to a point. You can use your losses to offset any capital gains you may have achieved, plus \$3,000 of income. This capability can prove quite useful to you, because even when the markets are down, you can still rack up some capital gains by selling investments that, over time have increased in value. Capital losses also may offset year-end capital gains distributions you may have received from your mutual funds.

To claim a capital loss, however, you must actually sell the stock - and you might not really want to part with it. You may believe that, despite its current decline, this stock still has good prospects for the future and lits in well with your diversified portfolio. So, can you sell the stock to establish your tax loss then huy it back

It's not that simple. In the eyes of the IRS, if you sell a stock and repurchase it - or if you buy a "substantial-yidentical" security - within 30 days, you're making a "wash sale," and you won't be able to deduct any losses resulting from this transaction. And this rule applies to purchases you make within 30 days before or after

Essentially, you have three strategies for avoiding this wash sale problem. First, you can wait at least 31 days after the sale before repurchasing the stock. Second, you can double your position and then sell your original shares after 31 days. And third, you can sell your shares for a loss and purchase stock of a different company - one that's in the same industry and that has performed similarly to the stock you sold. You can then wait at least 31 days, sell the new stock and repurchase the original stock.

Keep in mind, though, that any purchase you make within the 61-day time frame could violate the wash sale rules. So you'll have to be particularly careful if you've set up a dollar cost averaging plan under which you buy the same amount of stock shares each month. You'll also have to be alert if you automatically reinvest dividends and capital gains.

Before making a stock trade that could conceivably fall under wash sale rules, consult with your tax adviser. You won't want to make any expensive mistakes. Remember, you have many other options for reducing

Also, make sure that any moves you make won't upset your long-term investment strategy. It's clearly tempting to try to lock in tax-deductible losses, but it's even more important to maintain a portfolio that's designed to meet your individual needs, goals and tolerance for risk.

Many of these vendors shop for the best deals, buying up overstocked merchandise, seconds and specials, and then pass the savings on to their customers. Other vendors manufacture goods themselves, and then bring

them to Wolff's to sell them.

Regardless of which path they take. Wolff's gives them an opportunity they may not be able to get elsewhere. "We always make sure we have space available for new vendors who just want to try us out, or who need a place to sell

their merchandise for the shortterm," said David Wolff. Added

Often these are people who have

"I've been able to buy cars, trucks and houses off of this living."

For Frank Speciale. Wolff's Flea Markets provided a way for him to supplement his income while serving as a Rosemont police officer. Now retired. Speciale is still at it, using the income he makes as a Wolff's vendor to supplement his pension. He says the flea market experience still gives him a thrill.

"It gives me the ability to try something new and make it work," said Speciale, who currently is hawking packaged foods at Wolff's. "I love being able to take something like a bottle of water and make the public want it."




