Chicago will not pay for noise insulation at school

Gemini Junior High School acted too quickly to make sound insulation improvements, thereby losing potential reimbursement for the work.

Gemini was one of 11 schools eligible to get money for sound insulation design work because sound levels generated by O'Hare International Airport warrant it.

But the school started work on its air conditioning and boiler systems before applying for a grant through the Chicago Department of Aviation. Michael Nowlan, District 63 Director of Operations and Maintenance, said that information then available indicated the school would be allowed to apply for a grant after the work had begun; however, in the eyes of the Chicago Department of Aviation, this lapse disqualifies it.

"In the case of Gemini Junior, all of their contractual items were defined before they were ever identified or given a commitment to enter into a grant agreement," said Chris Arman, assistant commission for the Department.

Morton Grove votes to purchase Dempster St. land

Last year the village purchased two other lots along Dempster for the same purpose. Officials plan to "land bank" the real estate until plans for Dempster Street redevelopment are complete.

The property recently purchased is located along the south side of Dempster, street numbers 6055 through 6061. Officials say they do not plan to force a move in the near future.

Businesses at these addresses are Yasukunai Bonsai Garden and Golden Razor Barber Shop. The village will pay \$360,000 for the land parcel.

The passing vote was split, with trustees Dan DiMaria and Terry Liston voting against. DiMaria said the present weak economy is not a good time to make purchases that won't be used for several years.

Sharp police work puts end to restaurant burglar

A burglar, the subject of surveillance by Niles police, was apprehended by a team of Niles investigators January 18 during a break-in of a Chicago fast-food restaurant.

The perpetrator, George Hatziandreou, 41, of Elk Grove Village, was tailed by Niles police investigators for seven hours Jan. 17 and into Jan. 18, as he unwittingly led them to Chicago's West Side, to Cicero, and back to Chicago's North Side, with his last stop at Taco Burrito King Restaurant, 2817 W. Irving Park Road.

According to a police report, Hatziandreou parked a few doors east of his target and walked up a side staircase of the building onto the roof. From there he dropped into the restaurant through a grease exhaust chute.

After removing about \$82 from the cash register, he was preparing to tackle the safe

when the owner arrived. Hatziandreou escaped through the bathroom's false ceiling and down into a laundromat next door, out that back door and back to his car, only to be taken into custody by Niles police.

Niles police were able to identify Hatziandreou using leads and physical evidence left following a restaurant burglary-Dec. 25 on the 8100 block of North Milwaukee Avenue in Niles. Hatziandreao's arrest

has solved two burglaries in Niles and six in Chicago, according to spokespersons of respective police groups. Police in Des Plaines, Park Ridge and Morton Grove are also seeking warrants.

Niles Police Department has closed files on burglaries at the China Star Restaurant, 8105 N. Milwaukee Ave., and the Kimchy Cabana Korean Restaurant, 9020 N. Greenwood Ave.

Niles North graduate shot by terrorists in Israel

A graduate of Niles North High School wounded during a recent attack in downtown Jerusalem will soon be released from the hospital where she has been treated, according to Niles North principal Neil Codell.

Shayna Gould, 19. of Skokie. was hit with six bullets Jan. 22. Gould, who graduated in 2000, is a seminary student in Israel.

Though originally thought

dead, Gould was resuscitated and has been recovering steadily since.

Codell says he has monitored his former student's condition.

Gould's parents traveled to Israel immediately upon hearing of her injuries.

She suffered a lung injury in the attack by a Palestian gunman in which two persons were killed.

High school looking to cut programs to save money

Niles Township high school officials are listing ways to cut spending as they approach an ever-increasing deficit.

Board President Robert Silverman has said that, given the most recent projections, he expects to be out of money in two years rather than three. Cuts will be necessary as early as next school year, said Silverman.

Spending from the education fund increased at 5.3 percent over last year. This fund, used mostly for salaries and benefits, has operated in a deficit for a number of years. In total, the fund has a \$7 million deficit.

Silverman and Superintendent Griff Powell say 219's problems are no different than those of other districts. The cap on property tax, the demands of higher special education enrollments with little help from the state, and growing general enrollment are factors, along with property tax appeals that keep dollars from reaching education.

Silverman insists these issues are not "put out there as a threat," that actions must be taken, like limiting students to no more than five classes at a time or not allowing students to re-take failed classes. Other proposals reduce spending on out-of-state travel, on arts, athletics, clubs and field trips, and on supervisors' stipends.

Spending for special education, on a newly-created student assistance program and for substitute teachers are other targets, along with technology cuts, spending less on copiers and printers, supplies and textbooks, and on security.

Voters to be asked to approve \$9 million school construction bond

If voters in School District 69 approve a 59 million bond issue referendum in March, School District 67 will build two additional classrooms at Skokie's Madison School.

Agreement came after the Niles Township school districts got assurance from Skokie-Morton Grove District 69 that the new rooms will be used for Niles Township Special Education students.

In total, the \$9 million bond issue would fund four classrooms at Madison, improvements at Lincoln Junior High and air conditioning at all three District 69 schools.

The cost estimated to build and equip the two special education rooms is \$500,000. These rooms will be assigned to the Special Education Department, for use by all special education students throughout Niles Township.


Julie Higgins, District 67 Board representative to the Special Education Department, said if the referendum doesn't pass, this plan will not go forward. She said that the referendum will be pitched to emphasize that the special education classrooms will serve the entire 10 districts within the township.

Kenneth Randle, executive director of the Niles Township Department of Special Education, wrote Jan. 7 in a memo to member schools that his department has a real need for more classrooms, and that many districts are faced with growing enrollments and no longer have space to lease for that purpose. While total enrollment in township schools has risen at close to 5 percent from 1996 to 2000, special education enrollments have increased at 17 percent during the same period.

District 69 would be paid a fee for maintenance costs attached to the two rooms used by Special Education. This would be paid only by those districts sending children to the Special Education program.

In the event an emergency situation occurs which does overwhelm normal resources, it is the intent of the plan to offer guidelines that will minimize the loss and damage to life and property The plan is designed to be applicable for any type of emer-

n whether technological or natural, whether intentional or accidental.

A significant element of the Emergency Operations Plan is the provision within the plan for the activation of an Emergency Operations Center during a major disaster. Kev Village personnel would respond to the Emergency Operation Center to assist with and coordinate the emergency response.

The Village s Emergency Operations Center has communication capabilities specifically designed to work during an emergency that might compromise normal communication normal methods.

The intent of the conducted exercise was to test the effectiveness of the plan and the readiness of village departments should a disaster strike the community. Residents of the community can rest assured that village departments are well prepared to respond should a disaster impact Niles.



New rules simplify IRA calculations and planning

Owners of Individual Restirement Accounts and other qualified retirement plans have reason to rejoice. According to the Illinois CPA Society, the Treasury Department has issued new rules streamlining the formula used to determine the required minimum annual distribution from a tax-deferred retirement fund upon reaching 70 1/2 years of age.

Previous rules, which re-

quired plan owners to choose a beneficiary andoffered limited choices for determining life expectancy, were extremely complicated and, for the most part, irrevocable. In fact, the wrong decision could mean outliving your retirement

The new rules provide a simple and uniform method of calculating life expectancy that, in effect, lengthens for tax and

distribution purposes the plan owner's life expectancy. As a result of the change in calculating minimum withdrawals, retirees can take smaller annual distributions. A lower annual withdrawal means a lower tax bill and more money left in the plan to accumulate tax-deferred







Also included in the *Treasury* Hunt database are Series I. undeliverable bonds that have been returned since June 1996 and undeliverable Savings Bond Series HH/H interest payments. For the record, savings bonds and interest payments become "undeliverable" after financial institution issuing agents or the Federal Reserve make several unsuccess-

ful attempts to deliver the bonds to investors. Returned interest@payments usually result when a customer changes his or her bank account or address and fails to provide the Bureau of the Public Debt with new delivery instructions.

According to the U. S Treasury Department, there are at least 160,000 forgotten orce undeliverable" bonds waiting for their owners to claim them. While the Treasury Hunt database currently contains information on roughly 35,000 records, the site will be updated regularly as new information becomes available.
