Acura dealer to move to Waukegan Rd. site

Morton Grove trustees have approved an agreement between the village and auto dealer Gary McGrath which awards a subsidy up to \$500,000 for an Acura dealership on Waukegan Road but extends the number of years it must operate there from four years to eight, or lose benefit of tax rebates.

The site formerly held a residential property along with the Suburban Motel and the Fireside Inn. It is located across

Waukegan Road from Abt Electronics, soon to move to Glenview, where the Acura dealership in question is presently located.

McGrath will pay about \$1.8 million to Morton Grove for property which cost the village about \$5 million. The village expects reimbursement for the balance to come from a property tax generated by the Waukegan Road tax increment financing (TIF) district.

Skokie's Cal Sutker confirms FBI probe of hiring practices

Cook County Commissioner Calvin Sutker (D-13th) confirmed that FBI agents have interviewed his staff and have spoken with elected officials and county employees at downtown Chicago's County Building.

A probe into Sutker's hiring of an aide's son came to light in Feb. 2000 but has been inactive since then.

The aide is Barbara Panozzo,

whose son, Michael was hired by Sutker in 1999 for \$30,000 on a 10-month contract. The office position came with no insurance or medical benefits, Sutker said.

Factored into the original probe was Michael Panozzo's previous employment at North Shore Mosquito Abatement District, over which Sutker, as the Niles Township Democ-

Ice causes six-car accident on Devon Avenue

Devon Avenue at the North Branch of the Chicago River was the scene of a six-car pileup during the morning rush on Friday, Feb. 1, as rain and freezing temperatures iced the bridge surface and caused a driver changing lanes to skid.

The driver, Willie Perez, 26, of Chicago, was taken to Lutheran General Hospital. Perez was cited by police for driving without a license or insurance.

Police said Perez was westbound at the bridge shortly after 7:00 a.m. when his car skidded on ice, sending him into eastbound lanes where he struck a 1998 Honda head-on.

The driver of an eastbound 2002 Oldsmobile swerved right to avoid Perez' Ford, but hit an eastbound, late-model Saturn. A westbound Nissan whose

driver swerved to avoid the original skid also came to a stop in the eastbound lanes and struck a late model Dodge van.

The fire department's response was to summon an Emergency Medical Services Plan 1, which sent at least five ambulances to the scene. About 10 police cars responded for traffic control duty.

The driver of the Honda and a baby in her auto, plus the driver of the Nissan were taken to Lutheran General Medical Center.

Both the infant and the female driver of the Nissan were treated and released. The Honda driver's condition was originally regarded as serious, but was upgraded "good to fair" by the following Monday.

Lincoln School teacher one of 34 finalists for nation's top award; 29 year school veteran called "fantastic teacher"

Local teacher nominated for Golden Apple award

Darlene Patulski, 6th grade math teacher at Morton Grove's Lincoln School, is a finalist for this year's Golden Apple Award.

The Golden Apple Foundation draws candidates for its annual award honoring outstanding teachers from Lake, Cook and DuPage counties. This year's entrants teach grades six through eight.

Patulski, one of more than 800 teachers nominated, filled out an extensive application that narrowed the process down to 324. Now as a finalist, she is one of 32.

A Foundation team will visit Skokie-Morton Grove's Lincoln School to watch Patulski teach and to interview colleagues, students and parents, "to figure out who I am and what I do," Patulski adds.

The ten winners selected will be honored in a ceremony shown on WTTW Channel 11

at the end of May, but Patulski expects to learn in early March if she is a winner.

Patulski encourages social and communication skills in her students and believes in reinforcing their sense of self esteem.

"She's a fantastic teacher; she definitely deserves this," says Lincoln principal, Nancy Wagner.

Patulski, who grew up in Des Plaines, has taught at Lincoln for her entire career of 29 years.

Besides math, she teaches science courses to sixth and seventh graders.

Golden Apple Award winners will receive computers and \$2,500, plus attend Northwestern University for the following fall semester.

Skokie to allow housing to be built on Dempster

A Skokie zoning change approved Feb. 4 will allow residential buildings along the West Dempster Street business strip.

The zoning change applies to the West Dempster Street Redevelopment District, which runs from Edens Expressway to Kilpatrick Avenue, as well as to Skokie Boulevard, Niles Center Road and Gross Point

Road, within the district.

Staff and the planning commission wanted residential allowed above street level only, but Trustee Don Perille pleaded for the flexibility that would lure developers to the area.

"If you don't want it, you can turn it down, but at least this allows the possibility," he said.

Park Ridge employees accused of theft expected to plead guilty

Two Park Ridge park district employees accused of stealing from the district have waived their right to preliminary court hearings, which hastens their arraignment.

Attorneys for Matthew Horbas and Josephine Chicalace agreed to the waiver in court Jan. 31. Both will appear Feb. 22 for trial in a felony courtroom at the Skokie Courthouse.

Horbas' lawyer, Leon James, declined to say why his client waived the preliminary hearing. State's attorney Marshall Libert said the waiver indicates that the defendants recognize the existence of probable cause.

Horbas is former revenue and facilities coordinator for Park Ridge Recreation and Park District. Chicalace is the former manager at the district's Oakton Ice Arena.

Both are charged with failure to deposit cash payments and using the money to gamble at riverboat casinos.

Horbas is charged with thefts between \$15,000 and \$17,000, and Chicalace, of over \$12,000.

Reward offered for info on shootings in Park Ridge

Park Ridge will give a \$1,000 reward to anyone who can supply information leading police to the arrest and successful prosecution of those responsible for recent shooting in the city.

Six bullets fired shortly after midnight on Friday, Feb. 1 struck the driver's side of a 2001 Infiniti parked on Habberton Avenue near Elliot, police said. No one was injured.

A witness saw a larger, gray car leave the scene eastbound on Habberton but could give no description of its occupants, police said.

This shooting was the first since Jan. 1, when six shots were fired into the home of James and Elizabeth Keating on Dec Road.

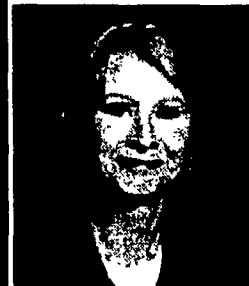

ND wrestlers advance to sectionals

Three Notre Dame High School for Boys' wrestlers qualified for the Lyons Sectional by finishing in the top three at the IHSA Regionals, which were held at Maine East High School in Park Ridge on February 2.

Paul Szczesny '02 (Niles/St. Thecla) captured the title in the 215-pound weight class. John Serafini '04 (60630/St. Cornelius) and Matt McAleer '04 (Arlington Heights/St. Emily) finished in third place at 119 and 145 pounds, respectively.

Szczesny improved to 28-3 this season by winning the championship. Szczesny defeated a Maine South opponent by an 8-6 decision in the final. Szczesny also took first at 215 pounds at the East Suburban Catholic Conference meet on January 25 at Notre Dame.

Serafini won his third place bout by a 13-8 decision against a Loyola Academy opponent. He improved to 21-15 with the win. McAleer upped his record to 20-15 by pinning his Loyola opponent in 4 minutes, 36 seconds in the third place match.

The Dons finished fifth of eight schools at the Maine East Regional. Head coach Augie Genovesi leads Notre Dame. The Lyons Sectional was held February 8-9.

Federal Income Tax Breaks For Working Parents

Three important tax credits can reduce the federal income taxes of working parents. The Child Tax Credit can shrink tax bills up to \$600 per child. The refundable Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and Additional Child Tax Credit can put extra money in parents' pockets.

These credits are too valuable to overlook. Internal Revenue Service spokesperson Sue Hales said.

"Some parents may be eligible to claim these credits for the first time," Hales said. "Especially if there were changes in the family such as a new child, a divorce, or a decrease in earnings during the past year."

Working parents with incomes under \$32,121 can generally claim the EITC with tax breaks up to \$2,428 for one qualifying child and up to \$4,008 for two or more qualifying children. The primary EITC requirements include:

the taxpayer must file a federal income tax return;

the taxpayer must have earnings from wages or self-employment; and

the taxpayer must provide a valid Social Security number for each qualifying child listed on Schedule EIC.

Taxpayers without qualifying children, who are at least 25 years of age but under age 65, and whose 2001 earnings were less than \$10,710, may qualify for an EITC of up to \$364.

The Child Tax Credit reduces tax liability dollar for dollar. Parents can claim a credit of \$600 for each child who, on December 31, 2001, was under age 17. Social Security numbers are required for each qualifying child.

This credit phases out for each \$1,000 of modified ad-

justed gross income in excess of \$110,000 for taxpayers filing jointly, \$75,000 for single taxpayers or heads of household, and \$55,000 for married taxpayers filing separately. Taxpayers with zero tax liability do not qualify for the credit but may qualify for the Additional Child Tax Credit.

The Additional Child Tax Credit can give refunds to some taxpayers with qualifying children, even if no tax is owed. Form 8812, Additional Child Tax Credit, must be completed to claim the credit.

Chicago-area parents who qualify for the EITC and Additional Child Tax Credit can get help preparing their returns during special EITC Awareness Days at Chicago IRS Taxpayer Assistance Centers located at 230 S. Dearborn Street and 7601 S. Kostner (Ford City area). Taxpayers can visit these Chicago IRS offices between 8:30 a.m. and 12 p.m. on each Saturday in February.

Taxpayers who want their returns completed should have valid photo identification. If they are filing a joint return, both husband and wife must be present and have photo identification. Taxpayers will also need social security cards for themselves, their spouse, and all dependents named on their return. Additionally, they should bring all income documentation including W-2s and 1099s. Without this information, the IRS will not be able to complete their tax return.

"The EITC, Child Tax Credit, and Additional Child Tax Credit can significantly reduce your tax liability and, in some cases, give you extra money back," Hales said. "You earned it. Don't forget to claim it."

Notre Dame High School Boys' athletic department has retired the jersey No. 10 that former NBA player Jim Les '81 (Niles/St. John Brebeuf) wore when he was a star at the high school more than 20 years ago.

The ceremony took place in the gymnasium before the varsity's basketball game against Holy Cross High School on Saturday, Feb. 9.

Les lettered in basketball and track at Notre Dame from 1977-81. However, it was basketball that would later carve Les' legacy in Notre Dame athletics history. Les earned all-conference and all-state honorable mention status at the high school before continuing his career at Bradley University.

The Atlanta Hawks drafted

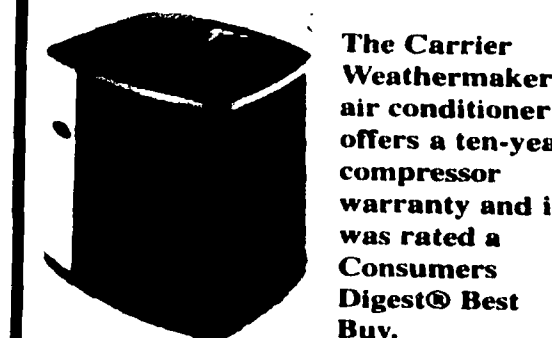

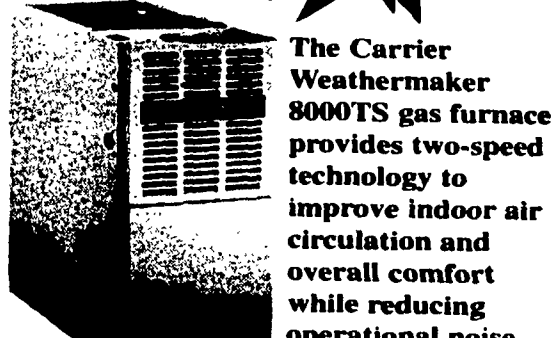

County urges residents to know signs of heart problems

The Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH) has teamed up with American Heart Association (AHA) to encourage residents to learn the warning signs of a heart attack or cardiac arrest during American Heart Month. Every year about 480,000 American adults die of a heart attack or its complications. It is important to know the symptoms of heart attack and cardiac arrest. Warning signs of heart attack include: Uncomfortable pressure, fullness, squeezing or pain in the center of the chest lasting more than a few minutes. Pain spreading to the shoulders, neck or arms. Chest discomfort with lightheadedness, fainting, sweating, nausea or shortness of breath. When a person goes into cardiac arrest, the heart's electrical impulses become chaotic. This irregular heart rhythm, called ventricular fibrillation, causes the heart to stop suddenly. 95% of cardiac arrest victims die before reaching the hospital. The warning signs of cardiac arrest differ from a heart attack.
