Burglar arrested for FEB 2 1 2002 Survey shows one in four seniors regularly use drugs; church break-in

A man who allegedly attempted to break into a church facility on the 7400 block of Milwaukee Avenue was arrested a short time later when police found him in an area of other churches.

James Houston, 45, of West Juneway Terrace in Chicago. was arrested about an hour after Niles police responded to a burglary-in- progress call Feb. 6 at St. John Lutheran Church and School.

When officers arrived shortly after 3:00 p.m. they found that a north window off the courtyard had been broken and the perpetrator scared off.

About 4:00 p.m. police found an individual who matched a witness' description in the 7300 block of North Caldwell, an area with several other churches.

Niles detectives stopped the man, later identified as Houston, and he started to struggle with the officers.

Houston was subdued and returned in custody to St. John Lutheran Church where he was positively identified.

Bredeman to move dealerships to Dempster

After 75 years Park Ridge's Bredemann Dealership is moving from Touhy Avenue and the Northwest Highway to new quarters at Dempster Street and Greenwood Avenue, in the Dempster Auto Mall.

Drug, alcohol use called crisis at Niles High Schools

Suspension for drug offenses at school highest ever

Results of a survey taken in December conclude that drug and alcohol use among students at Niles Township high schools has reached a crisis stage.

Chuck Klevgaard, Student Assistance Coordinator for District 219, recently presented survey data to the school board. Klevgaard said the results are cause for concern and has scheduled a parents' meeting in April.

Despite a 21-year legal age for both sexes, about three of five seniors said they have taken alcohol at parties. In the sophomore age group, the ratio drops only slightly, to two out of five.

One out of four seniors admitted to using drugs. In the sophomore group, the number dropped to one out of five.

Further conclusions indicate that many users don't consider regular drug use harmful, and some use the substances together, with 25 to 30 percent of students admitting to using alcohol with marijuana.

Students admit their behavior has led to lower class performance, fighting at home, or hurting themselves or others.

About 12 to 15 percent admits their substance abuse led to sexual activity they later regreted, the survey indicates.

Student suspensions for drug and alcohol use at District 219 doubled in 2000-1, from over thirty in 1999-2000.

Use of marijiuana has in-

creased in the last three years, says Niles North Dean Suc Hoffman who guesses that's because marijuana is not considered as bad as other options.

But Klevgaard points out that today's marijuana is 10 to 15 percent more potent than the product available in the 1970s.

Alarmingly, use of the drug eestasy is higher in District 219 than the national average. Continued on Page 31

Chicago man dies in Niles car crash

A 32-year-old Chicago man died following his car being torn in half after striking a light pole in Niles on Friday, February 15.

The man, Zdzislaw Skolyszewski of the 5700 block of Milwaukee Avenue, was reported to have struck a light pole at the intersection of Milwaukee and Oakton.

The 9:48 pm

brought numerous police and fire vehicles to assist the vic-

However, Skolyszewski was pronounced dead at the scene.

The Cook County Medical Examiner has not released results of an autopsy.

Niles Police would not rule out that alcohol or drugs played a role in the accident.

Baby's death exposes illegal daycare in Skokie

A Skokie couple was charged with operating an illegal daycare facility after a 13-monthold infant in their care was pronounced dead at Rush-North Shore Medical Center.

The couple is Gary Graham, 49, and Dianna L. Graham. 44, of 3926 W. Fargo in the vil-

The baby is Jordan Elizabeth Bowering, daughter of Traci and Jamie Bowering.

When paramedics and police responded to a call from the Graham residence Feb. 5 that a baby had stopped breathing they took her to the hospital, said Sgt. Paul Kruszynski, Skokie Police Department spokesman.

While in the home police

found five other children being cared for. None belonged to the Grahams.

Police contacted the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, who will conduct an investigation.

State law says that anyone caring for three to eight children under the age of 12, including their own, is operating a day care home.

Police sources said the Grahams could have been charged with violating a village ordinance, but instead invoked state law, which provides for fines up to \$1,000 and up to 364 days in jail.

The Grahams are scheduled to appear in Cook County Circuit Court in Skokie on March

Niles West bookkeeper charged with felony theft

A Niles West High School bookkeeper arrested January 25 faces a charge of felony theft and an on-going investigation after an audit indicated irregularities.

Christine B. Bronowicki, 49, a Glenview resident, appeared in court in connection with two checks issued during July, 1999.

The investigation hegan when district officials contacted Skokie police December 4, 2001.

The complaint claims that Bronowicki "knowingly exerted unauthorized control over property of High School District 219 at Niles West High School," with the intent of depriving the district permanently of its property.

Superintendent Griff Powell refused to comment due to the on-going investigation. The case is continued to March 7.

Bronowicki was hired by the school district in 1995.

One dead in Park Ridge drug arrest

While assisting a paramedic crew on call to aid an unconscious man, Park Ridge police found "a large quantity of controlled substances" in plain sight within the home and arrested the resident, Alex J. Grippo, 20, of the 1800 block of West Crescent Avenue.

Although paramedics employed life support procedures on the patient, 20-year-old Matthew Park, he was pronounced dead at 9:24 a.m. at Resurrection Medical Center in Chicago.

Park Ridge Police Chief Jeffrey Caudill said the department suspects that the substances are codeine and other prescription drugs. The substances have been sent to Illinois State Crime Lab for

Grippo was released on \$15,000 bond and is scheduled to appear in court Feb. 15. Paull's death is under investigation by the Cook County Medical Examiner's office, Caudill said.

Lutheran General celebrates ten-years of center for adults with Down Syndrome

31-year-old twins Patrick and Paul Patterson will continue creating beautiful drawings thanks to a surgical procedure that treats a paralyzing condition more commonly affecting adults with Down syndrome.

The brothers underwent surgery at Advocate Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge for atlanto-axial instability. It is a condition in which the first veterbrae slips on the second, pinching the spinal cord causing paralysis and other neurological problems.

Persons with Down syndrome who had declining mobility were often mis-diagnosed as having an irreversible condition, said Brian Chicoine. M. D., director of The Advocate Medical Group Adult Down Syndrome Center. After the operation patients have hada dramatic recovery physically and psychologically. Dr. Chicoine credits the excellent work of orthopedic surgeon Dr. Steven Markjetko, and anesthesiologists Dr. Thomas Blasco and Dr. William Soden as well as the nursing staff.

As the Adult Down Syndrome Center celebrates its 10th anniversary this month, Dr. Chicoine says the evaluation of over 1300 patients, the largest sample in the world, has provided a tremendous amount of information that was not recognized before. What is most

enlightening for me is exploring the potential reversible causes of decline.

Frequently people with Down

Syndrome who develop a loss in skills will quickly be diagnosed with Alzheimer s. Dr. Chicoine found that in 79-percent of those cases, the patient had other diagnoses, including such reversible conditions as hypothyroidism, vitamin deficiency and depression. We believe that each person deserved a good evaluation to look for possibly reversible causes, said Dr. Chicoine.

Many adults with Down syndrome talk to themselves. In the past, this self-talk was misinterpreted as a sign of psychosis and patients were treated with anti-psychotic medications. We found for many of our patients, self-talk is a developmental stage-appropriate behavior. It can be very beneficial and does not require anti-psychotic medications, said Dr. Chicoine.

More aggressive treatment and cultural changes have increased the life expectancy of people born with Down syndrome to 56 years, up from 9 years in 1910 and 20 years in 1950. Some are even living into their 80s.

The Adult Down Syndrome Center was the brainchild of parents whose children with Continued on Page 17

Down syndrome received excellent pediatric care, but had difficulty finding care once they reached adulthood. We would receive calls from parents of adults with Down syndrome that had been turned away by physicians." said

Sheila Hebein, Executive Di-

rector, National Association for

Down s Syndrome.

The National Association for Down syndrome continues to work closely with the clinic. The collaboration between the parent advocacy organization and the medical field is quite unique, said Hebein. We are involved on the clinic team to make sure the center is providing what families need.

Every patient that visits the clinic sees a Family Practice physician, a social worker, an audiologist and a nutritionist. Thyroid blood tests are ordered annually and neck x-rays, when appropriate to evaluate for atlanto-axial instability. Hypothyroidism, altanto-axial instability, chronic hepatitis and other health problems are more common with Down syndrome and can lead to physical and/or mental deterioration if left untreated.

"First and foremost, the patients are treated as adults, not children. said Dr. Chicoine. We deal with adult medical and psychological issues, adult dreams and wishes, and adult concerns.
