## Niles Community Church marks 50th anniversary

This month the Niles Community Church, a Presbyterian congregation, will celebrate its golden anniversary.

The congregation had its beginnings in 1951. Worshipping at temporary quarters, a dedicated group from new homes bounded by Harlem and Milwaukee. Howard and Dempster chose a location and had chartered a church by spring, 1952.

A golden commemorative worship service will be held at

10 a.m. on March 24 with former pastors, dignitaries and members of the Presbytery of Chicago on hand.

A luncheon will follow at the Niles Recreation and Park District facility where the jazz band from Gemini Junior High School will entertain.

The congregation has enjoyed an active year, with a newly-ordained pastor. The Rev. Steven L. Howery, arriving in Jan. 2001 and incorporated

## Glenview Teacher awarded Golden Apple for excellence

David Jones, a physical education and drama teacher at Glenview's Pleasant Ridge School, is a winner in this year's Golden Apple Award contest.

As befits his physical education background, Jones organized a fund raiser, Jump Rope for Heart, some 13 years ago and heads up an after-school, open-play program in the gym. But his interests don't stop

## Sutker faces tough fight to hold County Bd. seat

On March 19 voters will make a choice between the two Democratic candidates vying for the Cook County Board's 13th District's seat. With recent re-districting, the 13th District represents the major part of the 49th and 50th wards in Chicago, plus all of Evanston, Niles and New Trier townships. Yet many suburban voters regard this slot on the ballot as low on their radar.

Incumbent Cal Sutker, 78, is head of the Niles Township Democratic Party. He has also served as a Skokie village trustee and state legislator.

His challenger, out of Evanston, is Larry Suffredin, 54, who is an attorney and lobbyist.

Suffredin claims that Sutker is partly the reason for the county's low-profile perception

here in the suburbs. He says that suburbanites have lost touch with county government.

County issues include the court system, the Forest Preserve District, Cook County Hospital, not to mention the Mosquito Abatement District.

Suffredin claims that suburbanites today don't use the forest preserves much, that they go to court mostly as jurors, and have no little interaction with the county health system.

Suffredin feels his opponent has not advocated on behalf of the district in healthcare.

Suffredin says the district contains a significant population that lacks health insurance and depends on the county health system. While the county operates 30 clinics.

## Voters asked to approve \$9 million in bonds for special education; Classrooms and administrative offices would be built

# Special Education expansion on March 19 ballot

Niles Township's special education students are closer to getting the space their program needs, now that the last member segment of a township-wide consortium has approved placing a referendum on the March 19 ballot.

The Park View District 70 School Board followed other members of the 10-member consortium by approving a referendum. If passed, it would allow construction of seven classrooms and administrative offices for the special education department.

The classrooms to be built at Madison School would serve all special education students throughout the township.

Administrative offices would relocate to quarters on the second floor at Madison School.

The referendum will ask voters to approve the sale of \$9 million in bonds to finance construction at Madison and at Lincoln Junior High. Other improvements for township schools would be part of the package.

Higher enrollments at the township schools means that

space now leased to the special education program is needed for the general student body.

Along with larger general enrollment, the number of special education students has grown about 17 percent, or 279 students, since 1996.

## Notre Dame H.S. interim president

The Rev. Sean McGraw, C.S.C. will serve as interim president of Notre Dame High School for Boys, effective Feb. 25. The appointment, made by the Provincial Administration of the Congregation of Holy Cross, stands until June 30.

McGraw came to Notre Dame in fall 2000 as a full-time member of the social studies department. He has held coaching positions on both var-

sity basketball and tennis squads.

A Minnesota native, McGraw graduated from the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, in 1992 with a degree in political science. He holds a master's degree in West European Politics from the London School of Economics and a master's of Divinity from the University of Notre Dame.

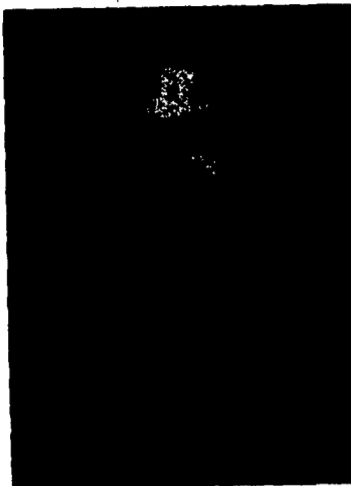

### CTA service to Navy Pier blossoms

Extra CTA buses will serve Navy Pier for the annual Chicago Flower and Garden Show, Saturday, March 9, through Sunday, March 17. Buses on the #29 State #56 Milwaukee #65 Grand #66 Chicago routes serve Navy Pier throughout the week, and on Saturdays and Sundays CTA will run its #124 Navy Pier Express buses to the Pier directly from Union Station and the Ogilvie Transportation Center (North Western Station). Chicago Flower and Garden Show hours are from 10 a.m. until 8 p.m. weekdays and Saturdays. Sunday hours are from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. On both weekends of the show, fully accessible #124 Navy Pier Express buses will start their trips from Union Station northbound on Canal at Adams. #124 service will begin at 9:15 a.m. on Saturday, and at 10:15 a.m. on Sundays. The buses will operate every 15 minutes, with the last trip from Navy Pier starting 15 minutes after the show closes.

#29 State buses to Navy Pier operate daily north through the Loop on State before heading east on Illinois, which is one block south of the Red Line subway station at Grand. #56 Milwaukee buses to Navy Pier travel east through the Loop on Washington, stopping for Union Station and the Ogilvie Center at Canal, and at Dearborn for riders transferring from the Blue Line subway station at Washington.

Serving Navy Pier from the west are #65 Grand buses, which operate east on Illinois and make their last trips west from Navy Pier just after 7 p.m. nightly, and #66 Chicago buses, which stop on Chicago at Michigan across from the Chicago Water Tower. All #29, #56, #65 and #66 buses are fully accessible to persons with disabilities.

# Remembering Emily with annual "Miles for Smiles"

Each year cancer kills more children than any other illness, and the number one cause is brain cancer. That's a statistic Beth and Steve Dorfman weren't aware of, until their 3-year-old daughter Emily died after a courageous 11-month battle with an inoperable brainstem tumor in 1994. Shortly after their daughter's death, they established the Emily Dorfman Foundation for Children, which since its beginning has raised more than \$700,000. ## CCDPH Food Program Serves Women, Infants & Children

Suburban Cook County parents and guardians of young children can receive free food through a federally funded program operated by the Cook County Department of Public Health (CCDPH).

The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program is a support service for low-income working families that assists in obtaining nutritious foods for pregnant and breast-feeding women, and children under the age of five. Eligible participants receive coupons for milk, juice, cheese, cereal, beans, peanut butter and infant formula. WIC also gives parents information on breast-feeding and child nutrition and provides free health screening for iron-deficiency anemia.

Established as a pilot program in 1974 and made permanent in 1974, WIC is administered at the Federal level by the Food and Nutrition Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. WIC is effective in improving the health of pregnant women, new mothers, and their infants. A 1990 study showed that women who participated in the program during their pregnancies had lower Medicaid costs for themselves and their babies than women who did not participate.

WIC participation has also been linked with longer gestation periods, higher birth weights and lower infant mortality.

## Introducing landmark legislation

Environmental Defense today applauded Senators Bob Smith (R-NH), John McCain (R-AZ) and Russ Feingold (D-WI) for introducing landmark legislation to reform the scandal-plagued U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The legislation would subject large Corps dams and levees to independent review and force local project boosters to contribute more to project construction funds. The bill would also force barge interests to share the cost of running waterways with little or no barge traffic. In addition, the bill would prioritize and reduce the Corps' growing \$52 billion backlog of authorized projects.

"Dozens of economically questionable and environmentally unacceptable Army Corps projects waste scarce funds that could instead be used to meet pressing water resource needs such as restoring the Everglades and other wetlands around the nation," said Environmental Defense science specialist Scott Faber. "By subjecting projects to greater scrutiny and requiring local boosters to pay their fair share, the Smith-McCain-Feingold bill will clear the way for projects that make economic and environmental sense."

## Edward Jones: New IRA Rules can help you --and your beneficiaries

It's a good time to own an IRA. Why? Because now you can put more money in and you won't have to take as much out. Let's look at both sides of the IRA equation, beginning with "put more in."

You now can contribute up to \$3,000 per year to either your traditional or Roth IRA. This figure will gradually rise to \$5,000 in 2008, after which the ceiling will be indexed for inflation.

If you are at least 50 years old, you may be able to make catch-up contributions to your IRA. Increasing your contributions means more security during retirement. An eligible married couple could contribute \$7,000 in 2002.

The ability to put away more money in your IRA provides you with some significant tax advantages. By contributing to a traditional IRA, your earnings will grow tax-deferred and you may lower your annual taxable income. While you can't make tax-deductible contributions to a Roth IRA, your earnings will grow tax-free, provided you meet certain conditions.

These higher contribution limits can help you build your retirement savings. However, at some point, you'll need to start taking money out of your IRA. You can make penalty-free withdrawals as early as 59-1/2, but, once you do, you'll be taxed at your ordinary income tax rate (assuming you took the withdrawals from a traditional IRA). So, if you don't really need the money, you could incur unnecessary taxes by making these IRA withdrawals, and you may opt to delay them.

You will have to start taking mandatory minimum IRA withdrawals on April 1 of the year after you turn 70-1/2. And now, thanks to some recently enacted IRS rules, the definition of "minimum" has changed, allowing you to take smaller annual distributions.

Under the old guidelines, you had to follow some complicated formulas to calculate minimum withdrawals. And if you picked the wrong method, you could have ended up taking out larger sums than you wanted and facing an inflated tax bill.

But the new withdrawal rules are less complex. And, more importantly, they may allow you to reduce your taxes and preserve a larger percentage of your IRA for your heirs.

The new guidelines employ the following calculation methods:

**Joint life expectancy**

If your spouse is more than 10 years younger than you are, you can select a joint life expectancy calculation. Spreading out the life expectancy in this way can result in smaller minimum distributions.

**Uniform table**

If you don't qualify for the joint life expectancy calculation, you'll use a uniform table that assumes your beneficiary is 10 years younger than you are. This results in a smaller minimum distribution for married couples who are just a few years apart in age and who name each other as beneficiaries.

Here's another favorable change: Under the new IRS guidelines, beneficiaries who inherit IRAs can take withdrawals based on their life expectancies, which could mean lower taxes along the way. Under the old rules, your children or other beneficiaries generally had to withdraw all the IRA money in a short time period - which could have left them with huge tax bills.

See your tax adviser before you begin taking IRA distributions. Although the rules may have changed in your favor, you still need to make the right moves.

## Man pleads guilty to 1977 murder

Daniel Baxter, 48, pleaded guilty to murder and chose to be sentenced under the sentencing guidelines of 1977 for murdering 18-year-old Eric Princell when he appeared before Cook County Associate Judge Timothy Chambers at the Skokie Courthouse. Chambers sentenced Baxter to 30 to 36 years in prison.

Princell was an ex-boyfriend of Baxter's girlfriend at the time of the murder. Baxter became angry with Princell for having a romantic relationship with his girlfriend.

Under the guise of selling him an illegal substance, Princell and Baxter drove to the Big Bend Lake Forest Preserve on Feb. 28, 1977. Once there, Baxter bashed in Princell's head with a hammer and slit his throat.

Des Plaines police had always suspected Baxter of the murder but only had enough evidence to charge him in 1999 after a witness came forward telling police that Baxter killed Princell, and that Baxter showed the body to his girlfriend at the time.
