Dist. 207, Park Ridge police to swap info

Because of an agreement between High School District 207 and Park Ridge Police, any District 207 student involved in misdeeds within the community may expect that information to be available to school officials.

Likewise, if a student deals

drugs or consumes liquor within the school environment, local police will be made aware, said Dist. 207 Superintendent Steven Snider.

The agreement, approved at the school board's recent meet-

AT&T Broadband offers toll-free customer service

The long-awaited toll-free number for local cable customers is finally here.

The number at which to register service problems or complaints is 1-866-594-1234. It became effective late February.

Morton Grove residents had long complained to the village's cable commission about the need to make toll calls in order to reach AT&T-Broadband's customer service unit.

Morton Grove officials held that AT&T's franchise agree-

ment with the village required having either a local or toll-free number.

"We were overjoyed at the news," said Mayor Dan Scanlon.

Still in the works is the ongoing study of the planned merger between AT&T and Comcast Corp., a Philadelphia-based company that has proposed buying AT&T's broadband services, including cable television and Internet service. The company hopes to complete the sale by

Niles police link suspect to 7-Eleven robbery

Niles police feel they have a strong lead on the robbery of the 7-Eleven at 7450 Oakton Street, in Niles, March 23.

A rash of robberies that began in Chicago March 4 resulted in the perpetrator's image being captured by various security systems.

A foiled attempt March 23 to rob a gas station in Chicago

places the suspect at 6405 N. Northwest Highway at 2:40 a.m. where the robber pulled a gun on the station manager after posing that he came to buy ice.

He demanded money, but the station manager grabbed his gun and wrestled with the robber, who left empty-handed.

Niles police report that about

Local crime up 7% in 2001; patterns analyzed

Skokie Police Chief Jim Halas says shoplifting rose during 2001, which he attributes to an increase of new retail development, especially in the area around Old Orchard Shopping Center.

Drug violations and vehicle thefts increased for the year, which also contributed to the 7 percent overall rise in crime for the year.

But batteries and assaults, although up in number, are hard to draw conclusions from, Halas said, since the sources are usually people who know each other, and are not related to general crime patterns, as such.

Skokie police documented more batteries and other crimes

at Niles West and Niles North High Schools during 2001.

Having a police officer located full-time at Niles West made a difference with these numbers. A similar position has been created at Niles North.

Such incidents were formerly handled by school officials alone, but they now receive police documentation.

There were 28 more drug crimes in 2001 than in 2000, according to the report, and sexual assaults have also increased.

The number of burglaries stayed level, but retail theft rose.

Arrests for driving under the influence of alcohol decreased, in line with national figures.

Mistake caused Niles forms not to be mailed; County extends filing date to May 13

Niles residents get delay in filing tax exemption

Over the years Cook County residents have come to count on real estate tax breaks like the homeowner's exemption, and, for residents over 65, the senior exemption and senior assessment "freeze."

So the county decided to streamline its exemption offerings this year by including all three applications within a single booklet called the Taxpayer Exemption Booklet, which even included a flowchart to guide taxpayers through the eligibility process.

But the initial mailout of the new booklet developed some bugs, and residents of Niles

Township didn't receive theirs.

Abe Selman, Niles village manager, said that when village officials learned Niles residents hadn't received the books they

requested the county assessor's office investigate.

The county found that a distribution error had resulted in

Edward Jones:

By expecting a very high level of return each year from your stocks, you're setting yourself up for disappointment - and you'll also be more likely to make some bad investment decisions. Here's how: If you're dissatisfied with your stocks' performance, you may end up constantly juggling your portfolio in an effort to boost your returns. This type of hyperactive trading is usually ineffective - and it can be expensive, too, once you start racking up heavy commissions. So, instead of perpetually buying and selling stocks in an effort to increase your return, look for high-quality stocks, and hold them for the long term. Most good stocks will still have their ups and downs, but if they represent good companies with good products and strong management, they should reward you over time.

Diversify your investments. If you expect high returns from your stocks, you're going to be rewarded in some years and disappointed in others. It's true that, over time, stocks have historically outperformed other asset classes, such as bonds and U.S. Treasury securities. And yet, during any given year, stocks can perform poorly, while bonds and Treasuries are showing good returns. That's why it's essential that you diversify your investment dollars among a broad range of assets - growth stocks, international stocks, growth-and-income stocks, bonds, Treasuries, certificates of deposit, etc. By diversifying your portfolio, you can help cushion yourself against downturns affecting just one type of asset - while giving yourself more opportunities to succeed.

In most walks of life, it's good to be optimistic. And it's that way in the investment world, too - as long as you temper your optimism with a healthy dose of realism.

CTA's Red Line a sure-hit travel for home games

Chicago baseball fans can look forward to another season of sure-hit travel to home games on the CTA's Red Line, which serves both the Cubs' friendly confines at Wrigley Field and the Comiskey Park home of the White Sox.

The Cub's open their 2002 home season Friday, April 5, with a 2:20 p.m. game against the Pittsburgh Pirates, where the easiest way to reach Wrigley Field will be by taking a Red Line train to the accessible station at Addison. From there you're just a long fly ball across Sheffield Avenue from the right field stands. For the start of weekday night games throughout the season, Purple Line (Evanston Express) trains will also stop at Addison.

The White Sox will host the Baltimore Orioles for the first home game of their 2002 season at 1:05 p.m. Friday, April 12, at Comiskey Park. Comiskey Park is served by the Red Line through the newly accessible station at Sox-35th, just across Wentworth Avenue from the left field stands.

Customers can connect to Red Line trains from all other "L" lines and most east-west bus routes. For Cubs fans, trains take only 15 to 17 minutes to reach Addison from stations in the State Street subway downtown. Travel time is about the same from Howard, where fans can connect from the Purple or Yellow Lines.

For White Sox fans, the trip from the State Street subway downtown to Sox-35th takes only about 10 to 12 minutes, and from 95th around 18 minutes.

Besides the Red Line, Wrigley Field is also served by accessible

#22 Clark & buses that operate north through the Loop on Dearborn and south on Clark from Howard, and by #152 Addison buses that run east and west on Addison. For weekday night games, #154 Wrigley Field Express buses will provide direct service to Wrigley Field from parking lots just west of Western and south of Addison, beginning two hours before each game.

Comiskey Park is also served by accessible #35 35th & buses, which connect with accessible stations on both the Green and Orange Lines. On weekdays through early evening, #24 Wentworth buses serve the park from Clark Street downtown, and from 79th via Vincennes, Wentworth and LaSalle.

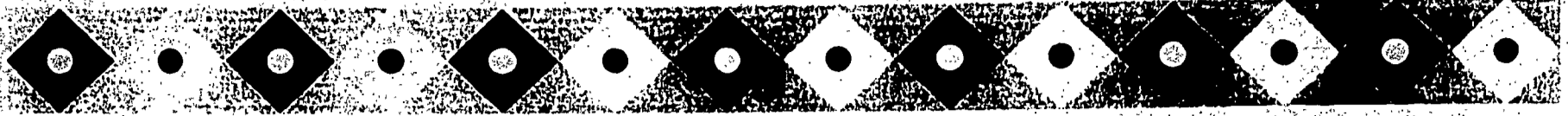

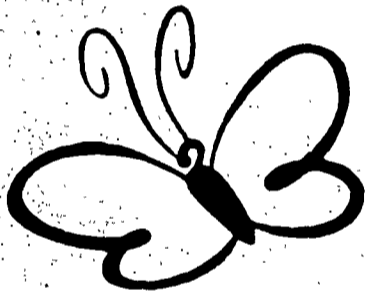

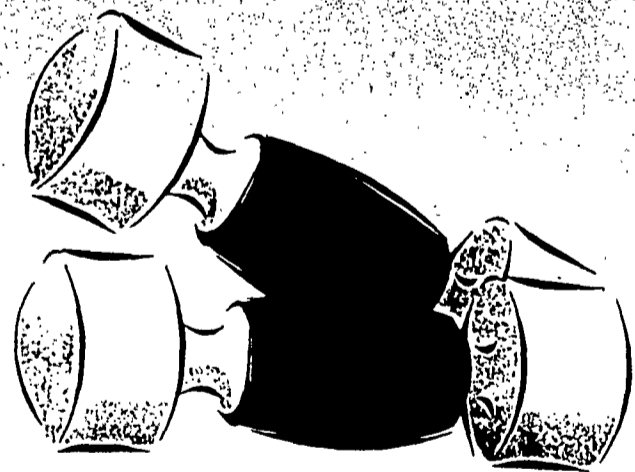
