Old Orchard Center sold to Australian firm

Old Orchard Shopping Center will transfer to foreign ownership, as one of three shopping centers recently sold by Urban Retail Properties to the Westfield Group, an Australian company.

The company refers to its shopping center holdings as "Westfield Shoppingtowns," but holds individual names for each. No renaming is planned for Old Orchard.

Gun-toting freshman arrested inside school; Officials claim student planned massacre

Massacre of students thwarted at Niles West

Fast actions by a pair of Niles West students prevented a possible massacre at Niles West High School last Thursday.

A 15 year old freshman, Mikhail Makhalis, of Skokie, was charged as an adult on a charge of unlawful use of a weapon.

Police report Makhalis had stolen the gun from an area business and brought it to the high school last Thursday.

Further, one acquaintance of

Makhalis claims the freshman had threatened to kill a female student because she was "annoying."

According to the Cook County State's Attorney's office, Makhalis planned to then run to the cafeteria to try and shoot additional students.

Police credit two students with thwarting the plan. A senior, Darek Franczak, 18, saw Makhalis playing with a bullet in class. Po-

lice officials said Makhalis loaded the bullet into a clip and slipped the clip into the gun, which was hidden in a book backpack.

Franczak had a fellow student slip out of the classroom and run for help. In the meantime, Franczak slid the backpack out of reach of Makhalis.

Security officials arrived quickly to remove Makhalis.

Makhalis has been ordered held in Cook County Jail.

Lincoln at the waterfalls attracts curious, tourists

Just as one Abe is taking leave of Niles public life, another has set down roots---or bolts, as it were.

A representation of young Abraham Lincoln is now installed on the plaza surrounding the Veterans Memorial Waterfall at Milwaukee and Touhy Avenues. Seated on a fiberglass sofa, arm draped across its back, Abe gazes out over Milwaukee Avenue.

One of the "Suite Home Chicago" pieces from Chicago's

public art project last summer, Abe seated on his blue sofa was somehow omitted from the auction last fall after his season in the sun. The piece was rediscovered, however, and Mayor Blase decided Abe would add a nice touch to public space in Niles. "We bought him for \$1,000.00," said Steve Vinezano, Assistant to Niles Village Manager.

Abe's previous station was in front of the Wrigley Building at 400 North Michigan Avenue. The piece representing the Illi-

nois Bureau of Tourism was planned by the Bureau's creative agency, BBDO, whose offices are located in the landmark building. Its title, "Don't just sit there, do something," is apparently calculated to goad tourists on to bigger and better excursions.

In addition to motifs of state historic sites and recreation opportunities, two more sons of Illinois trim the couch's front arms---Ronald Reagan and Ulysses S. Grant. "It appears to have

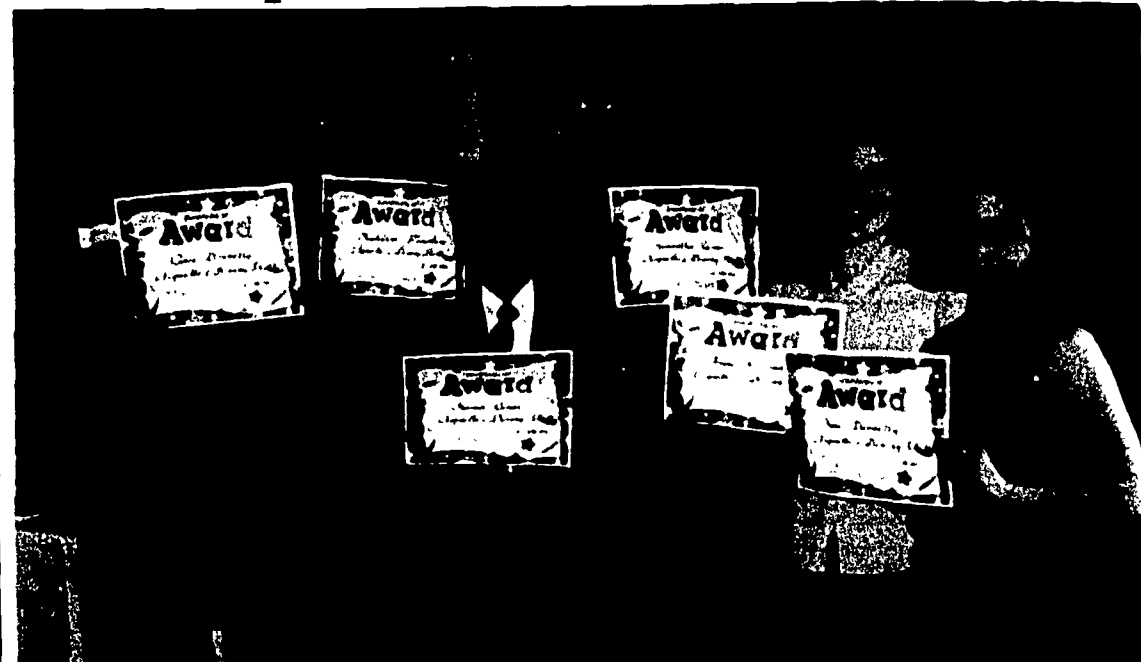

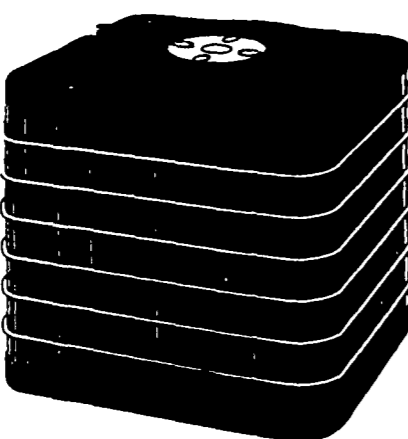

'Cook County Property Tax Refund Specialists'

Niles Township Assessor Scott Bagnall has issued a tax payer advisory.

A company identifying itself "Cook County Property Tax Refund Specialists" has mailed a letter to a number of Niles Township taxpayers. The letter suggests that "a search of Cook County tax records" indicates that a refund may be due the taxpayer. They offer to file the necessary documents, for a contingency (percentage) fee.

Notwithstanding the gist of the name, these letters are not issued by my office or by any other official. It appears that these folks have found residential Cook County parcels that do not have homeowner exemptions.

There is no magic here. Anyone can obtain the same information and apply for a refund. The process requires no specialized skill. Call my office at (847) 673-9300 to find out whether your tax bill shows a homeowner exemption. If you have missed a homeowner exemption for one of the past three years, then come to my office for assistance in filing a certificate of error. No charge or fee, of course.
