Parents say schools disregard taxpayers while training fired teacher in District 63

Administrators of District 63 special education program drew criticism recently when word reached certain parents that the district had paid for the training of a teacher who was served notice he would not return next fall.

Special education teacher Patrick Black attended a program on strategies to use with autistic children, which was paid for by the district.

Black, presently employed by the district, teaches children with autism. But Black, along with 25 others, was given notice in March that he would be released at the end of the 2001-2 school year.

Michael Johann, executive director of personnel and pupil services, said the release was based on enrollment projections completed in November.

"We just need to make sure we're not overstaffed ... we could re-hire as many as half those teachers back," Johann said

Training is done only at certain times during the year, and enrollment is made well in ad-Continued on page 30

Morton Grove reports crime drop in 2001

Overall, Morton Grove's crime statistics dropped 14 percent, but Chief George Incledon isn't taking full credit.

The state of the economy and unemployment figures are both national factors that play out locally, Incledon points out.

But crimes like robbery and criminal sexual assault rose slightly less than 2 percent. Thefts also rose.

Chief Incledon noted that in a small population like Morton Grove, even a small increase can show a greater proportionate influence on percentages.

While the department operated as usual, it did keep higher visibility, including attention given to enforcing traffic laws. "So people know we're around," said Incledon.

Finally, he urges that citizens remain alert and call police if they see something that arouses their suspicions. "We encourage their calling; residents recognize when something is wrong. I can't stress that enough," Incledon said.

Skokie to hold adults responsible for teen drinking

Now that Skokie village trustees have approved a more stringent liquor law. parents will be accountable for their teens' drinking parties.

The law puts responsibility for underage drinking on the adult owner or tenant of a premises where a violation has taken place.

And it includes a system to help police track the purchases of beer kegs.

Locally, Schaumburg and Wilmette have similar keg tracking systems.

The law also requires that one employee from each liquor store, bar and liquor-licensed restaurant in the village take a training course on how to counter underage drinking and over-consumption and to report any criminal behavior on their premises.

MG Library recognized as 'Library of Year'

The Morton Grove Library, on the strength of technological innovations it employs in serving its public, was named Library of the Year by the North Suburban Library System.

In its "Matchbook" program, patrons may list their interests and receive notice when relevant books, CDs or other materials become available.

These monthly lists of new materials will even be sent by e-mail, if preferred.

The library's Chapter a Day program e-mails one chapter of new acquisitions to its participants. Readers can check that item out if it holds their interest.

The library has a data base which can conduct a search by plot line or character name if a Continued on page 30

Parents turn out at meeting to protest board move; Board states case against Mark Twain principal

Parents rally to protest firing of school principal

Orlando Piedra, principal of District 63's Mark Twain elementary school, is at the center of a dispute after his firing by the school board led a group of parents to rally to his support.

Several parents came to the May school board meeting to present a petition bearing approximately 100 signatures protesting the firing. The group also pushed for a public meeting on the matter, as Piedra himself has requested.

Piedra's performance is characterized in the district's recorded minutes as lacking in adequate supervision, in evaluation and mentoring of staff, and in effective use of technology in the classroom.

His failure to develop an action plan for school improvement in line with the district's plan is also cited.

Finally, it was charged that Piedra is "not visible and ac-

cessible" to staff

In pursuing a date for the requested public meeting, Piedra and his lawyer have asked for a notice of five business days.

At the time, District 63 superintendent Kathleen Williams said she was awaiting word on whether she may release a meeting date.

Williams said there were scheduling problems that prevented scheduling the public meeting earlier. Piedra had met privately with the board in early April.

Piedra said he will respond to the charges, but that he would not do so at the May board meeting.

Williams said that details supporting the charges will be presented at the public meeting, and Mr. Piedra's role will then be to present to the board why he should be retained.

MG woman, 87, struck, killed crossing Waukegan Road

An 87-year-old Morton Grove woman died April 25 at Lutheran General Hospital after she was struck by a car while crossing Waukegan Road.

Helen Mortkowicz of 8600 Waukegan Road was crossing Waukegan at a point south of Dempster Street when she was struck by a 1989 Lincoln Towncar traveling south in the outside lane.

Police said they saw no evidence the car was speeding and added the driver was not charged.

It appeared that Mortkowicz was enroute from her home to shop at Dominick's in Prairie View Plaza, police said.

Sobering statistics on teenage drunk driving

Carbondale, IL - Prom. High School graduation. Spring fever. Or getting dumped by your latest heartthrob may seem to teens to be reasons enough to hit the bottle - and then hit the road.

In fact, 43 percent of Illinois high school juniors and seniors admitted they boozed it up before getting behind the wheel at least sometime during a previous year. according to a first-ever statewide survey of older high schoolers conducted by safety experts at Southern Illinois University, Car-

Worse yet, those drivers often had company in the car.

The survey shows that 60 percent of juniors and seniors said they had been passengers during the year in cars piloted by drivers who'd been imbibing.

"Drunk driving is the leading cause of death among young Americans," says traffic safety expert. Dale O. Ritzel. Director of the SIUC Center for Injury Control and Worksite Health Promotion, which conducted the

Ritzel and his team were asked by state officials--hoping to steer younger drivers down the right road--to get a fix on binge drinkmg, driving under the influence. favorite drinking spots and other risky business among juniors and seniors at high schools all over 11-

Teens, perhaps more than anyone else, may be surprised at the findings, Ritzel says.

"Drinking is not something you have to do to fit in." Ritzel says. "Our study shows nearly 60 percent of 17-18 and 19-yearolds either don't drink at all or drink very little--and if they do drink, they said they don't drive. And high school students overestimate how much drinking actually takes place among college students." he adds.

That's according to results of anonymous surveys Ritzel's team received from 634 upperclassmen at 27 randomlyselected high schools in Spring, 2000-the most recent year for which figures are available. Respondents reflect the racial and gender diversity at public and private high schools in cities, suburbs and rural areas.

Among the findings: . 78 % of high school upperclassmen has their first drink before the age of 16;

. 47% binge drink, downing five or more drinks in one session, even though 78% believe binge drinking even a single time carrics a moderate -to -great risk: 92% do not own fake ID's,

though 66% said they were rela-

tively easy to come by: . When it comes to preferred watering holes, 73% like private parties, 52% drink at home. 46% like secret locations and 40% drink in

How can adults reach teens who jcopardize lives by breaking the most fundamental rules of the Don't candy-coat it or make

light of the issues. "The cutesy stuff doesn't work." Ritzel says. "Instead, be honest about what's going on in your schools and communities. Use the data availabale (on drinking, driving and auto crashes) and report it completely, whether it's good or bad. If there is a problem, get the community involved in looking at it

He says young people are most receptive to hard facts, especially when conveyed in brochures. fliers, billboards, news stories and other printed media. Printed mesages impress tecnageres longer than bloody crash films, whose effectivenes seems to fade shortly

and resolving it."

And parents' attitudes may make or break a teen's well-

A father of three. Ritzel says he and his wife made sure their kids knew they could call anytime of the day or night for a free ride home--no questions asked--if they found themselves in uncomfortable situations.

We told our teenagers: "We're not going to make judgments. Call us if you need us. We don't younger drivers. want you to put yourclf in situations where there may be unpleasant consequences. We'd rather you were safe," he says. "And if there needs to be a fo-

cus on reducing drinking behaviors, that needs to be done by parents." he adds.

Tecn drivers need to listen up. too. he says. Distractions-whether it's friends, loud music. eating or failing to keep your eyes on the road--are the causes of many auto crashes.

"Rememer when you're driving, you're the person responsible for what happens." said Ritzel. If you have passengers in the car. make sure they are wearing seat belts. Remember, speed tends to cause problems for inexperienced drivers, so obey the speed limits.

"Don't use alcohol when you are going to be driving." Ritzel continued. "We know the first thing that occurs when people drink is that their judgment is affected and when you're a young driver, judgment is something you definitely need."

Funding for the survey came from Illinois Secretry of State. Jesse White's office and the Illinois Department of Transportation. Results spurred the creation of a free state brochure "Get In With the In Crowd." geared to




