Four sentenced in murder of MG US Attorney Messer

Four South Carolina men have been sentenced for their role in the murder of Morton Grove (MG) U.S. Attorney Michael Messer, special assistant U.S. Attorney, who was attacked and killed Aug. 20, 1981, while attending a seminar at the University of South Carolina.

Cicely L. Mayor, 18, was sentenced to 47 years in prison. Mayor pled guilty to murder, armed robbery, assault and battery, and conspiracy.

St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church in Morton Grove was vandalized Sunday night by two teenagers who broke into the church and stole property.

Morton Grove police investigating a report of a group break-in about 4 a.m. Jan. 2 found a destruction, starting from St. Mary's.

At the church, police found windows broken, doors knocked over, and had property collected for a fire drive. A fire extinguisher was found in the lobby. Fire extinguishers had been discharged into the air and computer components were pushed from tables onto the floor, destroying them.

Police pursued two boys seen in the area and apprehended one, who gave police

the name of the second. Both boys, brought to the station with their parents and are charged with the church vandalism and with breaking into the garage.

The names of the church and the boys are being withheld at the request of the church. The church is a Roman Catholic Church. The boys are being held in the Morton Grove Police Department.

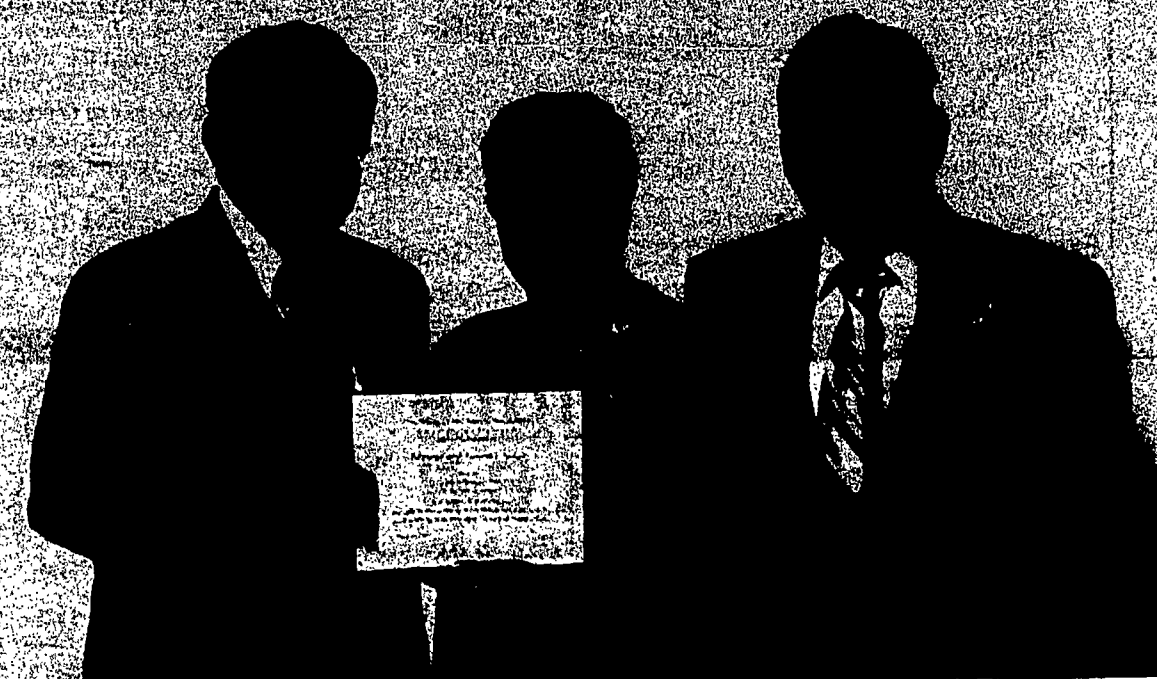
President of U.S. Catholic Bishops, William Gregory, has swing stop in Niles

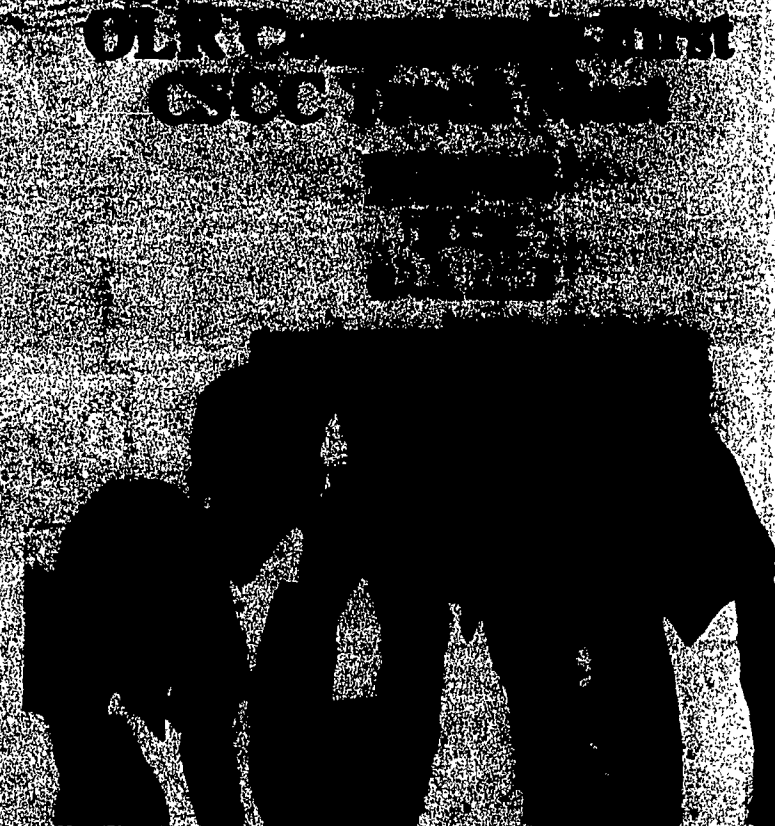

A new tool for the diagnosing and care of dementia. Hydrocephalus is increasingly being considered by health care providers attempting to diagnose the cause of dementia in their patients. Hydrocephalus is the abnormal accumulation of cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) in the ventricles of the brain. Experts believe as many as 10 percent of Americans with symptoms of dementia may actually be suffering from hydrocephalus which can cause symptoms such as dementia and forgetfulness, gait disturbances and impaired bladder control. For many patients, a diagnosis of hydrocephalus, as opposed to Alzheimer's or Parkinson's, means the opportunity to return to a normal life, as hydrocephalus can often be treated with the surgical insertion of a shunt into the ventricular system of the brain to divert the flow of CSF to another part of the body. "The problem had been that physicians kind of had to guess when making this diagnosis," says Ali Shaibani, a neuro radiologist at Northwestern Memorial Hospital.
