District claims savings of \$2 million; New gym, classrooms, officees added

Gemini Jr. High expansion completed at \$8 million

The new expansion at Gemini Junior High School is now complete, in use and on-budget.

Originally budgeted at \$8.2 million, the project would have run an additional \$2 million had the district stayed with the original planner, Legat Architects.

Balking at Legat's higher figure, the district turned to STR Partners to construct the proiect.

New construction includes a gym, a band room, music and drama classroom, one multipurpose room. plus eight classrooms for science and language instruction.

Remodeling efforts have provided space for administrative use, plus an expanded library with computer lab. Altered floor space also allows for more efficient use of cafeteria facilities.

Also, the expansion resulted in a courtyard area which Principal Scott Hermann said may be developed as outdoor space.

Such development could in-

clude a prairie restoration or a science playground, and perhaps

be outfitted with picnic tables for lunching outdoors.







FLU & PNEUMONIA IMMUNIZATIONS

Again this fall, the Village of Morton Grove will provide influenza and pneumonia immunizations for residents age 60+. The shots are free for those whose primary insurance is Medicare Part B. Individuals enrolled in an HMO or who do not subscribe to Medicare Part B must pay \$12 for the flu shot and \$20 for the pneumonia shot. Influenza damages the mucous lining of the lungs, enhancing susceptibility to pneumonia. It is especially dangerous for people with heart disease, diabetes, anemia, lung disease and kidney disease. Influenza immunizations provide immunity to the most commonly predicted flu strains for the coming winter. Seniors should get a flu shot each year. Anyone allergic to chicken eggs: who has had a severe reaction to a flu shot in the past; who has previously developed Guillian-Barre Syndrome in the six weeks after getting shot: or who has an active infection, respiratory infection. or fever the day of their shot; will not be immunized. Pneumonia immunizations provide immunity to the most common forms of pneumonia. People should receive this immunization once every five years.

Those interested in a shot must make a reservation by calling the Morton Grove Senior Hot Line any weekday from 1 to 4 p.m. at (847) 470-5223. 



According to the National Alliance for Caregiving, more than 22 million households provided care to an aged person in 1998. While it is challenging enough for most adults to contemplate caring for elderly parents they adore, that thought could paralyze adult children of dysfunctional parents. In some cases, the degree of family dysfunction and abuse was so extreme or hurtful that adult children cannot be expected to care for their aging parents. In other cases, adult children decide to take on the difficult role of caregiver.

While caregivers might be re-Verticals turning to the family landscape in a new adult capacity, it is important for them to realize that old issues and emotions can easily resurface. They may feel like young children again, filled with the confusion, fear, and grief they felt all those years ago. It is no easy task to navigate the former battleground of family without resentment, while trying to muster up some compassion for an aging and failing parent.

The challenge, says Cade, is for caregivers to make sure they are responding to the situtation, not their emotions. It is important, she says, to be flexible enough to recognize that negative

thoughts and positive actions can co-exist. She says that being flexible also means adapting and changing our caregiver role as need he, understanding that good caregiving requires diplomacy, outside support, and a practical network of assistance. That assistance can come in the

form of Twelve Step support

groups like Al-Anon or Adult Children of Alcoholics. Nursing homes, hospitals, or other care facilities may also offer support groups or other services and information for caregivers. Another good resource is the Family Caregiver Alliance Web site at www.caregiver.org. Caregivers can also find a host of informawww.caregiving.com - an inter- proach death, are able to commuactive site that allows caregivers nicate with their children in new to share experiences, informa-

tion, and successes. It is crucial for caregivers to take good care of themselves as they go about their caregiving duties. Cade advises that caregivers exercise, eat nutritious meals, abstain from using tobacco, alcohol, and drugs, and get enough sleep. She stresses that caregivers range of information and treatcarve out time for partners, children, and friends in order to keep their lives in healthy balance.

Cade also says that as difficult as it might be for those who grew

boundaries at all, it is important that caregivers establish boundaries with sick parents, dysfunctional family niembers, and themselves. This might mean limiting visits, not taking phone calls after a certain time, and deciding for oneself what is reasonable or pos-

Ideally, this journey of compassion will help caregivers achieve peace within themselves and with their pasts. "Making peace is not about our parents, it's about us," writes Cade. "We're ready to move on, ready to forge a different relationship.

Proton Therapy Helps Cancer Patients Survive Women's (NU) - Ten years ago, up and found cancer, it was in-

doubters of the use of protonbeam therapy to treat cancer were to be found not only among victims of the illness but within the medical community as well.

Since then, the success of the Loma Linda Proton Treatment Center in California has made believers of the skeptics. Indeed, approximately 140 patients are receiving proton therapy treatments on an average day.

After successfully treating thousands of patients, doctors at the Loma Linda facility say proton therapy has turned lives around and holds even greater promise in the future.

"We still have a long way to go to realize our goal of treating all types of tumors and diseases," said James M. Slater, director of the center, who pioneered proton therapy at Louis Linda.







The Center's parking lot accommodates about 70 ears, but plans for a new mosque will include approximately 140 additional spaces.

The additional parking will come first in the construction phase. Plans for this project will be submitted to the village sometime this month.

The Commission will study additional traffic information at its November meeting.




