# Lutheran General vs. Blue Cross guarantees higher rates for consumers

Tens of thousands of area residents find themselves caught between two titans of health care as they slug it out over who is able to fleece the other faster.

Lutheran General Hospital and its parent organization Advocate Health Care have announced it will not accept Blue Cross-Blue Shield of Illinois coverage after January 1. The reason for such an unprecedented announcement is, of course, that Lutheran General wants more money from Blue Cross. In fact, they want fifteen percent more insurance compensation for their hospital and ten percent more for their doctors.

Blue Cross has offered seven percent more plus a three percent bonus for something vaguely called, "certain quality measurements." More than likely that bonus means, in plain street-English, 'if you throw enough business our way we'll kick some money back to you.'

The effect on area residents will be, simply, that they will have to end the relationships they have had for many, many years with their local doctors and local hospital as they are forced to move on to Blue-Cross approved doctors.

As we watch these medical behemoths burn money on newspaper and radio advertising to define their positions, (regrettably, none spent in The Bugle) we can't help but see before us not caring health care organizations seeking to fulfill their charters of caring for the sick. Rather, we see two hogs trying to push each other out of the way to, as always, gorge themselves at their feeding trough.

One Lutheran General/Advocate official recently stated, "The inability to get paid a reasonable amount is going to threaten the health-care infrastructure." Now there's a statement right out of a George Orwell novel.

Walk through the beautiful, parquet-floored executive offices at Lutheran General and ask whether this hospital charges a "reasonable amount" for their services? Walk through the doctors' parking lot at Lutheran General Hospital, amidst their \$50,000 to \$80,000 vehicles, and ask whether the doctors charge a "reasonable amount" for their services?

Then go knock on the door of any area seniors and ask what their out-of-pocket costs are for medication? Many, many will tell you \$500 to \$1,000 per month.

So, it is time to ask those dreaded bottom-line questions:

- 1) Why should up to 300,000 patients in the Advocate system have to lose their long-trusted doctors simply because of a battle between the rich who want to get richer?
- 2) Whether the increase in compensation to Lutheran General is seven or fifteen percent, how long will it take before the public must pay for this increase in higher premiums?
- 3) How many additional people will no longer be able to afford health-care insurance due to this battle of the medical cartels?
- 4) Where, oh where, are our protectors in Springfield and Washington while, literally, the health and well-being of their constituents is at stake?

Stay tuned readers, for this is becoming a drawn-out battle orchestrated by \$100,000 public relations firms and, eventually, the courts with their very, very high-priced lawyers. But be assured, whatever the outcome, your family's health-care will be again diminished as you are forced into programs which are more profitable for these institutions.

#### Speaking of money.....

The ballot-counting computers had not even been powered down when the Niles Township High School District 219 school board, having just lost a property tax referendum with 70 percent of the voters opposed to a tax hike, announced they will introduce the referendum again.

We assume it costs the district tens of thousands of taxpayers' dollars to place a referendum on a ballot and distribute their

propaganda.

Who is going to pay the price for this lunacy? Just get out there and work a little harder, Mr. And Mrs. Taxpayer. For the bill will soon be in the mail.





This scam is directed at bereaved families, many who are older and may not realize their deceased relative never had a credit card debt. They should contact the Better Business Bureau in Delaware at 302-230-0108.

Study shows MG pays its employees less than other towns

A survey recently conducted in Morton Grove sites below average pay for some of its employ-

Twenty-eight positions were studied, said Assistant Village Administrator, Bridget Wachtel. and only eight have salaries equal to or above the neighboring towns of Skokie, Lincolnwood. and Niles. Twelve staff positions and seven management positions are below average.

After hearing the results of the survey, Village Trustees dis-cussed the issue during a closed

session and, as yet, have not turned in a decision on raises for the upcoming year. A majority of the below aver-

age salaries are the police and public works staff. The police records manager is 22% below average, while community service officers are 10% below, and 7% for public works mainenance workers. Police sargeants are at 2 percent below average.

Administrative salaries were shown to also be below nearby communities. Wachtel, who currently receives \$67.000 compared to the \$88,161, and Economic Development Director.

Tim Angeli, whose salary is \$62,000 compared to the \$84,273 salary of other Villages. Village Administrator. Larry Arft, receives \$115.233. This is 10% below Morton Grove's neighbors. David Erb. 14% and Fire Chief Ralph Czerwinski, 5% below.

Although the move of ABT Electronics from Morton Grove created a tax loss for Morton Grove, the Trustees did approve a 3.25% cost of living increase for most of its employees. With the reclassification of some positions, many employees will be





# Larry Schrambeck retires after 46 years

by Barbara A. Mendelsohn When Assistant Superinten dent of Niles' Public Works. Larry Schrambeck retired Oct. 31. he topped off a work history that spanned three superintendents and, yes, two mayors.

When Schrambeck joined the department 46 years ago, Mayor Blase's first term was still four years in the future.

It all began in 1956 when Schrambeck responded to a knock at his door. "It was Eddie Bacher," he recalls. Schrambeck knew him from high school where Bacher was on the main-

Bacher, also first head of Viles' Public Works, was out reruiting. "He came by to ask if I vanted a job." Schrambeck aughs. So the 20-year-old groundsman at Tam O'Shanter eft his job and signed on with Niles Public Works.

New hires all started in garbage collection. After that Schrambeck dug ditches, repaired motors and leaks, plowed his share of snow. Certain memories stuck, like the snow accunulation of 1967.

Schrambeck recalls a water eak near Jarvis and Harlem Avenues during an exceptionally cold winter, when leaking water caused a 4-foot frost buildup on pipes. "We finally had to hire a contractor who broke through the frost with an air hammer.' Schrambeck recalls. "Then we were able to fix the leak."

In 1997 Public Works got a pleading call from Niles resident Sigismund Rahn, who noticed his wedding ring missing right after pouring a bucket of sudsy water down a catch basin. Putting two and two together. he asked Public Works to rescue his ring from the grip of the sewer system. Schrambeck, with a crew of two and help from the village "Vactor," found the ring and returned it to a grateful Mr. and Mrs. Rahn.

A barrel-chested, bewhiskered man of respectful demeanor. Schrambeck performed another kind of community service in

the mid-80s when he spoke to several classes at John Hersey High School about his experiences as a recovering alcoholic.

About that period. Schrambeck quietly thanks the Village of Niles for helping him through it and for holding his job during his treatment period at Lutheran General Hospital.

Mayor Nicholas Blase remarks that Schrambeck brought a special asset to the department. "Larry's the kind of guy that everyone likes. He gets along with everyone, and that's important in that kind of job." said Blase. "With Larry, we never had the kind of problems they do in some places."

Now her company, Seattle Sut-ton's Healthy Eating sells about 120,000 meals per week from a 24,000-square-foot kitchen in Ot-

Sutton's husband has retired from his medical practice and helps run errands for the busi-

The first franchise based on Sutton's concept opened in November in Omaha to serve Nebraska, Iowa and parts of South Dakota. Another franchise opened in March in Plymouth,

The meals are much like family meals but are prepared according to strict guidelines. Entrées typically feature chicken or turkey or are meatless.

For that reason, the company does not have chefs who want to embellish recipes. Instead, the company hires cooks who can prepare the 105 different meals according to Seattle Sutton's Healthy Eating company recipes.

Customers may select meals with an average of 1200 calories per day or 2000 calories per day cluding the customer's own fatfree milk as a beverage. On average, less than 30 percent of total calories come from fat and less than 10 percent of total calories come from saturated fat.

The cost is \$85 per week for the lower calorie plan and \$100 per week for the higher calorie plan. Each plan consists of 21 meals, breakfast, lunch and dinner, for seven days. Customer may pick up meals or have them

Customers typically order their meals on Thursday for the week to come.

"There are no gimmicks of any kind and no contract," Sutton

The menu for Thursday of the

third week, for example, calls for a breakfast orange-apple strudel with orange sauce and grapefruit

The lunch entree is a pita sandwich with Swiss cheese, garbanzo beans and fresh greens. It comes with a yogurt cuember dressing and an orange.

The main course for dinner consists of a ground-turkey patty served hamburger style on a whole wheat bun with lettuce and tomato. Baked beans are served on the side.

Earlier this year, Gov. George Ryan and the Illinois Department Commerce and Community Affairs awarded Seattle Sutton's the Governor's 2002 Entrepreneurial Success Award at a ceremony in Springfield.

Sutton's first name honors the American Indian chief Seattle. Sutton's family was not American Indian, nor did they live in Seattle, they are from North Da-





This publication constitutes official notice of the changes in assessment to all owners of real property in Niles Township. The 2001 assessment changes as published herein are those determined by the Assessor of Cook County.

it is the duty of the Assessor to appraise all taxable real property in Cook County at its fair cash value as of January 1, 2002. Fair cash TH value is described as what the property would bring at a voluntary sale in the normal course of business or trade. The Assessor is required by law to assess said property in a fair and just manner.

The Assessor does not determine property taxes. Property taxes are determined by the spending needs and requests of municipalities, school boards, park districts and other local government agencles which provide public services to property owners. The Assessor's sole responsibility is to estimate the value of real estate | LIN

In Cook County, real property is classified according to its use. The classification system is used to determine the percentage of the fair cash value at which the real property is assessed for purposes of taxation. Accordingly, real property is assessed at only a fraction of its fair cash value, depending on its use and classification.

Changes in assessment for land and Improvements are listed separately. The dimensions of the land are also listed:

- A Acres
- B Back Lot
- N Irregular Lot S - Square Feet

Cook County uses a Permanent Index Number (P.I.N.) system as a means to identify individual real estate parcels. The PIN consists of a 14-digit number. The first two digits identify the area or survey township; the second two digits identify the sub-area or section; the next three digits identify blocks.

Blocks are defined as follows:

Blocks 100 to 199 are located in the N.W. Quarter Blocks 200 to 299 are located in the N.E. Quarter Blocks 300 to 399 are located in the S.W. Quarter Blocks 400 to 499 are located in the S.E. Quarter

The next three digits in the series identify the specific percel or lot. The last four digits, (where applicable), identify individual condominium units, non-operating railroad perceis or leasehold's of exempt parcels.

Whenever possible, the assessment list will be listed by the street name and the street or house number of the parcel. However, the Cook County Assessor's Office official records rely on permanent Property Index Numbers (P.I.N.) only. No assessment of real property shall be considered invalid due to an incorrect listing.

#### NOTICE - VILLAGE OF MORTON GROVE TAX INCREMENT FINANCING REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AREA REGISTRATION FOR INTERESTED PARTIES REGISTRY

Pursuant to Section § 5/11-74.4-4.2 of the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, 65 ILCS § 5/11-74.4-1 et seq. (the "Act") the Village of Morton Grove (the "Village") is required to establish an interested parties registry ("Registry" or "Registries") for each Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") redevelopment project area created pursuant to the Act (a "Redevelopment Project Area") whether existing as of the date of this notice or hereafter established. On November 11, 2002, the Village adopted an ordinance authorizing the establishment of Registries by the Village Administrator ("Administrator") and adopting registration rules for such Registries. The purpose of this notice is to inform interested parties of the Registries and registration rules for the Registries and to invite Interested Parties (as defined below) to register in the Registry for

Any organization active within the Village and any resident of the Village (an "Interested Party") is entitled to register in the Registry for any Redevelopment Project Area. Organizations include, but are not limited to, businesses, business organizations, civic groups, not-for-profit corporations and community organizations

An organization seeking to register as an Interested Party with respect to a Redevelopment Project Area must also complete and submit a registration form to the Administrator. Such individual must also submit a copy of a current driver's license. case, voter registration card, utility bill, financial statement or such other evidence as may be acceptable to the Administrator to establish the individual's current Village

Interested Party Registries are being established for the following TIF Redevelopment Project Areas, which have been adopted by the Village:

\*Waukegan Road TIF Redevelopment Project Area

All individuals and organizations whose registration form and supporting documentation comply with the registration rules and who submit such documentation, either in person or by mail, to the Village Administrator, 6101 Capulina, Morton Grove, IL, 60053, will be registered in the applicable Registry within ten (10) business days of the Administrator's receipt of all such documents. The Administrator will provide written notice to the registrant confirming such registration. Upon registration, Interested Parties will be entitled to receive all notices and documents required to be delivered under the Act with respect to the applicable Redevelopment Project Area. If the Administrator determines that a registrant's registration form and/or supporting documentation is incomplete or does not comply with the registration rules adopted by the Village, the Administrator will give written notice to the registrant specifying the defects. The registrant will be entitled to correct any defects and resubmit a new registration form and

supporting documentation. An Interested Party's registration will remain effective for a period of three years. Rules for the renewal or amendment of an Interested Party's registration are included with the registration form that may be obtained as described

Each Registry will be available for public inspection at the office of the Administrator during normal Village business hours. The Registry will include the name, address and telephone number of each Interested Person and, for organizations, the name and phone number of a designated contact person.

Interested Parties will be sent the following notices and any other notices required under the Act with respect to the applicable Redevelopment Project Area:

pursuant to § 5/11-74.4-5(a) of the Act, notice of the availability of a proposed redevelopment plan and eligibility report, including how to obtain this information; such notice will be sent by mail within a reasonable period of time after the adoption of the ordinance fixing the public hearing for the proposed redevelopment plan;

pursuant to § 5/11-74.4-4(a) of the Act, notice of changes to proposed redevelopment plans that do not (1) add additional parcels of property to the proposed development project area, (2) substantially affect the general land uses proposed in the redevelopment plan. (3) substantially change the nature of or extend the life of the redevelopment project or (4) increase the number of low or very low income households to be displaced from the redevelopment project area, provided that, measured from the time of creation of the redevelopment project area, the total displacement of inhabited households will exceed 10; such notice will be sent by mail not later than 10 days following the Village's adoption by ordinance of such changes,

pursuant to § 5/11-74.4-5 (c) of the Act, notice of amendments to previously approved pursuant to 9 3711-74-4-3 (c) of the root induce of anticipations of property to the redevelopment plans that do not (1) add additional parcels of property to the redevelopment project area, (2) substantially affect the general land uses in the redevelopment plan, (3) substantially change the nature of the redevelopment project. (4) increase the total estimated redevelopment project costs set out in the redevelopment plan by more than 5% after adjustment for inflation from the date the plan was adopted. (5) add additional redevelopment project costs to the itemized list of redevelopment project costs set out in the redevelopment plan, or (6) increase the number of low or very low income households to be displaced from the redevelopment project area, provided that measured from the time of creation of the redevelopment project area the total displacement of inhabited households will exceed 10; such notice will be sent by mail not later than 10 days following the Village's adoption by ordinance of such amendment;

pursuant to § 5/11-74.4-5 (d)(9) of the Act, for redevelopment plans or projects that would result in the displacement of residents from 10 or more inhabited residential units or that contain 75 or more inhabited residential units, notice of the availability of this information, including how to obtain the report, required by subsection (d) of Section 5/11-74.4-5 of the Act; such notice will be sent by mail within a reasonable period of time after completion of the certified audit report.

Pursuant to § 5/11-74.4-6(e) of the Act, notice of the preliminary public meeting required. under the Act for a proposed Redevelopment Project Area that will result in the displacement of 10 or more inhabited residential units, such notice will be sent by certified mail not less than 15 days before the date of such preliminary public meeting.




