'Room at the Inn' Nativity Exhibit & Open House

A private collection of more than 100 nativity sets from around the world will be exhibited for the public to enjoy at St. Matthew Lutheran Home, a program of Lutheran Social Services of Illinois (LSSI). The event, called "Room at the Inn," takes place Saturday, December 14, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. at the skilled nursing facility, 1601 N. Western Ave. in Park Ridge. "I bought my first nativity scene in 1980 when I was living in Bogota, Colombia," Greeley shares. Greeley has received many nativity sets as gifts, including one from her husband as a gift on their wedding day. Greeley is producer of Lutheran Vespers, the national radio ministry of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), which features Walt Wangerin, author, storyteller and pastor.

People tend to think of traditional nativity scenes sold in American stores, but Greeley's collection highlights what others around the world consider "traditional" as well. Greeley points out one from Alaska where Mary and Joseph are dressed in an Inuit and Russian costumes. The Three Wise Men come bearing gifts on dog sleds. "I love this Alaskan interpretation of the nativity because it expresses so beautifully our human understanding of Christ's incarnation," Greeley says. Another unique nativity set Greeley owns is one made of painted dough bread.

"I hope people who come to see the display will find themselves drawn a bit more deeply into the mystery of God who would choose to be born as one of us," Greeley adds.

The tradition of the nativity scene, or crèche, dates back to 1223. St. Francis of Assisi is said to have been traveling to the Italian village of Greccio at the time, when the sight of shepherds in moonlit fields evoked images of the first Christmas. Inspired by the midnight scene, he beckoned villagers that Christmas Eve to light the sky with their torches, bring their animals, and re-enact the Nativity. During succeeding centuries, the tradition spread from Italy to the rest of Europe and beyond. Today, many Christian families annually display a crèche, often one that has been handed down from generation to generation.

While viewing the spectacular display at St. Matthew Lutheran Home, guests are welcome to register for a chance to win a beautiful nativity scene valued at more than \$400. In addition, guests are invited to tour the nursing facility, which serves people of all faiths, in all walks of life. Light refreshments will be served and entertainment provided.

Make sure your home is winterized

With winter just around the corner, now is the time to give your home a "check-up". Here are six tips from the Comfort Institute on what to look for and take care of so your home is ready for those cold winter winds.

1. **Have your duct system tested for air leaks.** Many think that windows and doors are the major cause of a home's air leaks. But according to recent research by the Department of Energy (DOE), gaps, cracks and disconnections in the typical home's duct system are much more significant. The DOE states that typical duct system loses 25% to 40% of the energy put out by the central furnace, heat or air conditioner. Leaks are usually the biggest problem.
2. **Ask your heating contractor to perform an Infiltrometer "blower door" test.** The blower door is a computerized instrument originally invented by the Department of Energy. It pinpoints where your home's worst air leaks are, and also measures how leaky the overall house is. While most homes are still far too leaky, some are now quite tight, and need mechanical ventilation to ensure the air inside is fresh.
3. **Have your heating system cleaned and tuned by a qualified contractor.** A pre-season tune up and filter change is a good investment. It reduces the chances of breakdowns in the middle of winter, improves safety, and pays for itself through more energy efficient operation. 4. **Have your system checked for Carbon Monoxide.** A good contractor will also offer to test your system for hazardous Carbon Monoxide, which can be produced by a dirty or malfunctioning gas or oil furnace or water heater.

6. **Consider replacing your old furnace or heat pump.** Just like a car, heating equipment doesn't last forever. If your system is over 12 years old, and you are planning to stay in your home more than a few years, many authorities recommend considering replacing it before it fails permanently. A new system is safer, more dependable, and can pay for itself through energy savings as they are up to twice as energy efficient.

Assistance available with utility payments

Those 60 years old and older and anyone SSI/SSDI Disability Benefits should schedule an appointment immediately.

Anyone may apply for assistance whether they pay their own heating bills or if it is included in with their rent. This also applies to telephone bills.

The programs sets income guidelines including:

- 1 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$1108
- 2 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$1493
- 3 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$1878
- 4 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$2263
- 5 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$2648
- 6 person household may not have a gross monthly income of over \$3303

Tips for Getting Ready for Severe Winter Weather

Winter Storm Preparedness Week ends Saturday, but State Senator Dave Sullivan (R-Park Ridge) said any time in the next few weeks is a good time to get ready for winter storms.

The annual average number of severe winter storms in Illinois is five. During the winter of 1977-78, there were 18 severe storms. Sullivan said the odds are that Illinois residents will have to contend with severe winter weather and it is a good idea to be prepared.

- Prevent water pipes from freezing
- Prepare for being unable to leave your home

LIHEAP is a program that allows families with incomes of up to 150 percent of the poverty level to receive financial assistance for their energy needs. Currently a family of two can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$1,493 and a family of four can qualify with a monthly income of up to \$2,263.

And you can deduct all or part of the gift from your taxes.

You also can help your estate planning by making your donation through a charitable remainder trust. You may do so by contributing appreciated assets - such as stocks or real estate - to the charitable remainder trust. The trust then sells the assets and uses the proceeds to purchase a portfolio of securities. You are then paid an income stream for life, and the organization receives the principal upon your death. By setting up such a trust, you avoid capital gains tax, and you can claim a deduction on your current-year taxes. And because you're moving assets from your estate, your beneficiaries will have fewer estate taxes to pay.

By transferring the bulk of your appreciated assets to a charitable remainder trust, you need not forget about your heirs. You may wish to use the income from the charitable remainder trust to purchase a life insurance policy on yourself. It is important to note, however, that the proceeds from such a policy will go into your taxable estate. If you'd like to avoid this, consider purchasing an insurance policy in an irrevocable life insurance trust. Because the trust actually owns the insurance policy, the proceeds are kept out of your taxable estate and your heirs will owe less in estate taxes. You can also direct the trust to provide your heirs with regular income.

Before establishing a trust, consult with your legal adviser to learn the full advantages and disadvantages of these complex estate-planning instruments. Should you simply donate an appreciated stock or make your donation through a charitable remainder trust? The answer depends on your financial goals. If a tax deduction is your primary objective, a straight donation may be the best choice for you. If you would like to establish a steady stream of income, a charitable remainder trust may be the more attractive option.

Regardless of which option you choose, you'll be helping a valued institution and yourself. In short, everyone would be thankful.
