Military gains access to student information

Maine Township high school administrators inadvertently learned of a federal law requiring high schools to provide student information to military recruiters.

It came about when a counselor at Chicago's Taft High School, also the mother of a Maine South student, learned about it on her job when a recruiter asked for a list of Taft students.

Phyllis Sapiecka said she refused the request because Taft had not provided such information in past years.

The recruiter then informed her in writing that she was bound to honor his request. "I asked him why," said Sapiecka. He said I should look up the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, she said.

Maine South director of student personnel services, Marianne Kelly, says that Maine South will send letters home to inform parents of this change, while telling them how to keep their student's name off lists supplied to recruiters.

Parents are allowed to make a request that information in student directories not be released without their prior consent.

Two pieces of legislation contribute to the total picture here:

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, and the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal 2002.

Student directories will be used both by military recruiters and for informing students of scholarship opportunities.

An Air Force recruiter confirmed that, in the past, military recruiters had access to students only through school visits.

In the past it was left up to individual schools whether to supply student directory information to recruiters, he said.

The recruiter said the process gives kids access to additional education and recruiters access to the kids.

As one senior summed up, you can always say no.

Des Plaines angling for last riverboat license

The city of Des Plaines is hoping an offer to share the wealth will help to deliver it.

Des Plaines hopes to be awarded that last riverboat license from the Illinois Gaming Commission, the same license that slipped through Rosenblatt's fingers.

The developer suggests that an offer to give low-income communities a share of the profits might cause the gaming commission to look with favor on the venture.

Developer Neil Bluhm, of JMB Realty in Chicago, wants to put the casino at 3000 S. River Road, one-time Xerox Corporation site.

Bluhm estimates that such a casino would generate \$30 million in taxes a year.

Bluhm pointed out that even if the city were to donate say, 25 percent to appropriate communities \$20 million would be left in the pot.

One official suggested that the developer might also contribute to the pool, but Bluhm replied his group will invest \$500 million in the project and set up a \$1 million foundation to serve causes of the disadvantaged.

The Des Plaines City Council voted 6 to 1 in favor of sharing future casino tax profits.

Library board has two needed candidates

With two seats open for April election, the Niles Library board has candidates willing to serve.

Morgan Dubiel filed to retain the seat he took in August, 2002 as the appointed replacement for former member Ted Przybylo.

Dubiel says he sees opportunities for the library to hold its service level without raising taxes too high.

Dubiel was the only dissenting vote on the tax-hike referendum.

Says Dubiel, "We need to increase the tax rate. It hasn't increased in 10 years, even though inflation and costs have increased."

But we also need to tighten the belt and to stand by our employees, he added.

Dubiel voted against the referendum mainly because of what he sees as obscurity of wording, both in the referendum and in the law.

The second candidate is William Waddell, park district employee and the manager of Tam Golf Course.

Niles library OKs tax hike referendum

The Niles Library board has voted 4-1 in favor of asking for a five-cent tax rate increase to counter current financial woes.

The action was approved at a Jan. 20 board meeting.

A referendum carrying the request will appear on the April Ballot, said Cary Czarneci, library administrator.

If the referendum passes, the library's tax rate would be increased to 33.1 cents per \$100 of equalized assessed value, up from the present rate, 28.1 cent.

Czarneci pointed out that even though the present rate is

28 cents, the library's actual income is about 17 cents, as a result of the county tax cap.

Adding five cents onto the present rate will actually deliver about 22 cents in spending dollars.

"It has to be phrased that way (as 33.1 cents) because we want to go up five cents," Czarneci said.

The only dissenting vote objected on grounds that the rate could legally be increased to an actual 33.1 cents.

The law requires certain wording, says Czarneci. "We want a five-cent increase. We don't want to deceive. There are no plans to bring the rate that high (to 33.1)," Czarneci said.

The increase would add about \$6 per every \$1,000 of a tax bill.

Czarneci estimates that rate would bring the library out of deficit within three years.

The library's financial woes are the result of lowered interest rates and increasing costs complicated by the tax cap.

If the referendum doesn't pass we may be looking at service reductions, such as cutting back hours and on spending for materials, Czarneci said.

This year's acquisition budget is approximately \$200,000 less than the 1999 budget.

Fatal heart attack at Niles car wash

A Chicago man died unexpectedly at a Niles car wash on Saturday afternoon, Jan. 25.

Ron Norton, 44, a resident of Chicago's far northwest side, fell from his chair in the car wash office at 900 Civic Center Drive, showing no signs of life, according to police report.

Norton's brother William, also present, called the Niles Fire Department and began to administer CPR.

Niles fire fighters transported the victim to Lutheran General Hospital where he was pronounced dead shortly after 1 p.m.

According to the Cook County Medical Examiners Office, Norton died of natural cause, a coronary attack.

Feds Fine SBC \$2.6 Million

IBEW Breaks With SBC; Supports Competition Through UNE-P. SBC paid the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) \$2.6 million in fines for failing to meet wholesale performance standards for the month of December, more than double the fine SBC paid last month. December marks the 25th consecutive month SBC has been summoned by the federal government to pay fines for violating terms of the 1999 SBC-Ameritech merger. Since December of 2000, SBC has paid the FCC \$73.3 million in fines.

"SBC fined thousands of workers, claiming they were going broke. But, for 25 consecutive months, they've been happy to pay millions of dollars in fines for their anti-consumer, anti-competitive practices," said Gary Mack, executive director of the Illinois Coalition for Competitive Telecommunications (ICCT). "The latest round of fines and lawsuits are proof that SBC will stop at nothing to preserve their phone monopoly - leaving workers and consumers in the dust."

IBEW stands for "unbundled network elements platform," which competitors lease from SBC to provide local phone service. Fair UNE-P rates are essential to ensure access to the network.

"The IBEW agrees - preserving current UNE rates is essential to ensuring choice and quality in local phone service. Lower rates for consumers and more jobs for working families," said Mack. "Despite posting enormous profits this year, SBC fired 20,000 workers this year and placed service quality at risk. Our goal is to ensure Illinoisans have the right to choose their local phone service provider when SBC's misguided business practices let them down."

The Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC) also recently announced plans to impose stricter performance standards on SBC over the next eighteen months. The ICC will require SBC to install new service within five days or by contractual due date 90 percent of the time. Previously, SBC's requirements were at 85 percent and 90 percent respectively. Calls to customer service centers must now be answered within an average of 60 seconds.

The ICCT works to promote public policies that create and sustain a more competitive telecommunications industry in Illinois.

Are you looking for a unique way to say you care this Valentine's Day? Say "I love you" with a manatee. For twenty dollars, you can adopt a manatee for your Valentine through Save the Manatee Clubs (SMC) Adopt-A-Manatee program and send a personalized Valentine's Day gift card and message. You'll provide a year's worth of love and help protect an endangered species.

Weighing in at an average of 1,000 pounds and measuring 10 feet long or more, manatees are close to being a ton of love. These "gentle giants," as they have been called, are large, slow-moving, aquatic mammals known for their sweet temper and curiosity. Manatees spend most of their time eating, resting, and traveling and can be found along the southeast coast of the United States. A migrating species, manatees need warm water to survive and are located primarily in Florida in the winter.

There are 30 manatees in SMC's Adopt-A-Manatee program. Twenty of the adoptive manatees live in the wild and migrate each winter to a natural warm water spring at Blue Spring State Park, near Orange City, FL. Five female manatees live permanently at Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park in Homosassa, Florida. In addition, five manatees frequently seen in the Tampa Bay area and along the west coast of Florida are up for adoption.

Approximately 3,000 manatees remain in the United States today, and they are listed as endangered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. SMC's Adopt-A-Manatee program helps to fund education and public awareness projects, research, rescue and rehabilitation; and advocacy and legal efforts to help protect manatees and their habitat. SMC is the world's leading manatee conservation program and was established in 1981 by U.S. Senator Bob Graham and singer Jimmy Buffett. A manatee adoption packet includes an adoption certificate, an underwater photo, a biography of the adopted manatee, and a membership handbook with information and photos for the manatee enthusiast.

Manatees in the adoption program at Blue Spring include Lenny, Flash, Nick, Phyllis, and Lily. Lenny is known as the "couch potato" manatee because he likes to sleep a lot when visiting Blue Spring. Flash is a shy manatee, so named because he takes off at the slightest sound.

The manatees in the adoption program located at Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park incription to the Save the Manatee Club Newsletter is included and features updates on the adopted manatee throughout the year. Amanda, Ariel, Betsy, Rosie, and Lorelei. Amanda was rescued after suffering severe injuries from a motorboat propeller. Her daughters Ariel and Betsy are also in the Adopt-A-Manatee program. Rosie is a sweet, gently manatee known for adopting young manatee orphans who come to reside at the park. Lorelei is gently as well and as is often seen resting with the other manatees.

Several manatees frequently seen in the Tampa Bay area and along the west coast of Florida can also be adopted. The manatees in the Tampa Bay program include Elsie, Flicker, Ginger, Jemp and Vector. Elsie is easily identified because her tail was badly mutilated from an encounter with a boat propeller. Flicker is a female manatee and has a series of small propeller scars that remind researchers of flickering flames. Ginger has been seen every summer since 1994 in the Marco Island area of Florida. She has had at least two calves, and one of them is named Ale! Jemp travels a wide range of Florida's west coast. Vector is also a traveling man(atee)! He has been tracked as far north as the Suwannee River in the northeast area of Florida.

District 219 brainstorms cost cutting

Dist. 219 trustees and parents discussed possible cuts in service and whether to seek a tax hike through referendum in April.

The district's November 2002 referendum bid was defeated by voters by more than 2-1.

One suggested cut would impose a 6-class limit per student per semester.

Cuts in after-school activities were also suggested.

Such actions could save the district about \$4 million toward the \$14 million deficit that officials project for next school year.

These proposals were suggested by a financial advisory committee of district officials, residents and members of the business community.

Limiting students to no more than six classes would conserve an amount equivalent to salaries of six full-time teachers, a savings of slightly more than \$400,000 said David Schusteff, assistant human resources superintendent.

Eliminating low-enrollment courses might save about \$500,000 said Schusteff.

\$200,000 could be conserved by eliminating or restructuring certain athletic teams and levels of competition. The elimination of competitive clubs, like marching band and chess, could save another \$60,000, and eliminating after-school writing and homework centers could save about \$160,000, he said.

Phasing out five clerk-typist positions and the outsourcing of social work services could save nearly \$260,000, Schusteff said.

Non-curriculum cuts could conserve an estimated \$1 million. These include savings for field trips, custodial services, security, travel expenses, general purchasing, and utilities, if one

school shuts down completely for the summer months.

Business manager Gerry Yeggy spoke of raising existing fees and creating new ones to generate an additional \$1 million for the district.

This meeting was a prelude to the school board vote on the referendum issue and on proposed cuts.

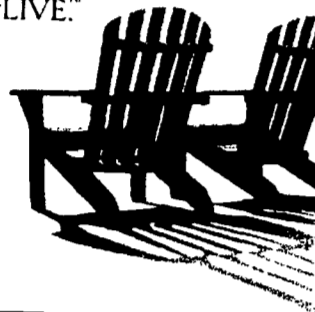
