The WYSE Academic Challenge is a series of competitive tests in seven subjects designed to motivate high school students to higher achievement in the fields of math and science. Students are required to take tests in two of the seven subject areas. Test material is drawn from senior high school and freshman level college curricula. Written by teams of college and university faculty, sub jects include hiology, chemistry. computer science, engineering graphics, English, mathematics, and physics. Each test production team produces three tests of increasing levels of difficulty; regional, sectional and state finals. Students compete as individuals or as part of a team; they have 40 miniutes to complete multiplechoice tests that range in lengths from 30 to 100 questions. Forest Villa **Receives Perfect Inspection Report**

On Friday, February 28, the IIlinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) completed the annual inspection of Forest Villa Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. The dialysis center's report was also flawless.

Earlier in the month. Forest Villa was granted a 3-year accreditation from the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCA-HO) following a thorough 2-day
