Two local businesses were scammed recently by what police term "theft by deception."

In the 9100 block of Golf Road a man asked a store clerk if she could give him \$400 in large bills in exchange for his smaller bills. She agreed, and he counted out his money, but it came up two dollars short.

He said he had two dollars in his car and left to get it, but before leaving he appeared to place the \$398 in an envelope, which he sealed and gave to the clerk to hold.

He never returned with the additional money. When the clerk

opened the envelope, she found its content was paper, not currency.

A similar incident occurred later that day at the 7900 block of North Milwaukee.

"The incidents are certainly related," said Niles Deputy Police Chief Charles Giovannelli.

Dist. 207 stretches insurance dollar

A new insurance provider will save money for Maine Township High School District 207 because a customary broker's fee will not be imposed.

Some time before, the Maine Teachers Association had hired a consultant who advised the group it could probably improve its coverage package, said teachers association president Jean Miller.

The union then recommended Corporate Benefit Consultants, Inc. to the District 207 Board.

The district sought bids from 10 brokers and narrowed the field to two. All bidders were asked to quote a fee-based bid only, without commission.

The district also conducted its own insurance audit, said Steven Snider, superintendent.

The audit showed a 30 percent increase one year, Snider said.

The new district broker will continue to review the District 207 program to make further recommendations.

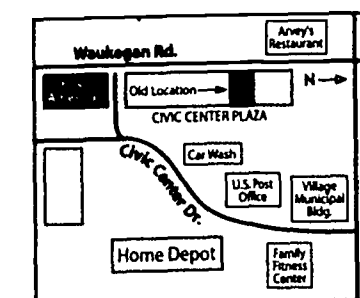

D219 nixes merging teams, saving money

Niles Township High School District 219 has rejected a proposal to merge the swimming and gymnastic teams of Niles West and Niles North.

Acting on the proposal would have saved the district \$200,000. Board Vice President Sam Borek said he would rather cut

language or other academic courses first.

District 219 Superintendent Neil Codell had asked the athletic department to devise a way to cut \$200,000 from next year's budget.

There's no way to do that without cutting programs.

agreed Niles West's Director Steve Heuerman and North's Director Karl Costello, creators of the plan.

The plan would have combined swimming and diving for both boys' and girls' teams into district teams rather than school teams. Girls gymnastics would also be a district team, rather than a school team.

This tactic would have realized savings of slightly more than \$100,000 at each school, and eliminated 26 coaches and 15 competition levels.

Board President Robert Silverman said a time will come when the district runs out of money and will then have to consider those kinds of cuts.

Present projections estimate the district's reserves will run out in 2005-06.

D207 plans life-safety construction for summer

Summer construction work is scheduled at the three Maine Township high schools, said Michael Galis, director of facilities for the district.

Maine West will have UV

coating applied to roof areas, repairs made to structural cracks and boiler tubes replaced.

Completion of Maine West's H wing and the renovation of three science labs are also scheduled for this summer, Galis said.

At Maine East, both roof coating and tuckpointing are planned, and a handicap lift installed at the pool.

In addition, this summer will bring phase two of Chicago's noise abatement program to Maine East. This Chicago-paid improvement will complete air conditioning in the entire school by next year.

At Maine South some windows will be replaced with safety glass and carpeting replaced in the library.

Work at Maine West is expected to run \$200,000; at Maine East, \$650,000; and at Maine South, \$250,000.

Much of the work is seen as life safety construction, Galis said.

Robbers hit shopping center parking lots

The Niles Police Department calls women's attention to a rash of purse snatchings perpetrated in area parking lots.

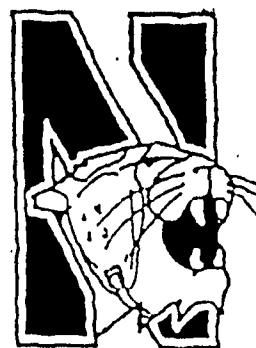

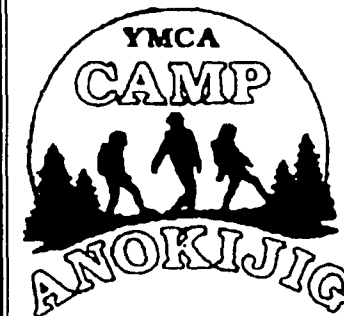

Seniors urged to use caution in severe cold weather

The Suburban Area Agency on Aging today issued a reminder that the severe cold of a Chicago area winter presents an especially significant danger to older adults. Relatives, friends and neighbors are urged to visit and check on seniors during hazardous cold weather conditions.

Older persons must be aware of these cold weather precautions.

• Wear warm clothes in layers including hat and gloves - do not wear wet clothing

• Cover all exposed skin - if you suspect frostbite, do not rub the affected area, warm it slowly.

• Do not drink alcoholic beverages - tea, coffee, soup or hot chocolate are beneficial

• Maintain physical health by eating well and resting

• Know if prescription drugs you take increase vulnerability to cold

• Recognize symptoms of hypothermia - stiff muscles, slowed breathing, mental confusion

• In the home, never use an oven as a heater and use space heaters only as directed

• Be aware of warming areas such as libraries, public safety facilities or community warm up centers

Persistent exposure to extremely cold temperatures can be dangerous. According to Jonathan Lavin, Executive Director of the Suburban Area Agency on Aging, Cold temperatures are only the beginning of the hazard.

In addition to air temperature, it is necessary to monitor the wind chill factor, and also the cumulative cold - duration of the current cold spell. Many communities maintain warming centers and hotlines designed to help older adults in their homes and out. Seniors need to be aware of these services, and take advantage of them in threatening conditions.

The Area Agency and its network of partner agencies provide a variety of services to help adults aged 60 or over live independently in their communities. These services include information and assistance, nutrition programs,

transportation, social services, protective services and more. Older adults and their caregivers may obtain information on these services by calling the Agency at (708) 383-0258, or by visiting the Web site: www.suburban-age.org.

The Suburban Area Agency on Aging, Oak, Ill., was founded in 1974 with the mission of planning, coordinating, advocating and funding programs for persons over 60 in suburban Cook County. The agency serves suburban Cook County, an area that is home to over 429,000 seniors, with programs such as home de-

livered meals, in-home services, transportation and elder abuse and neglect intervention. In its Fiscal Year 2002, the Area Agency distributed nearly \$11,000,000 to more than 40 local community agencies to provide this array of services. The Older Americans Act, Illinois General Revenue Funds, local funds and individual contributions support its programs. The Suburban Area Agency on Aging and its network of senior service agencies are the principal source of information regarding senior services in suburban Cook County.

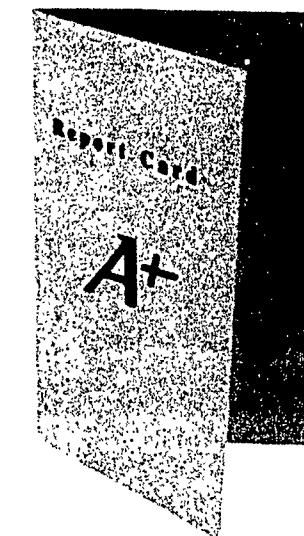

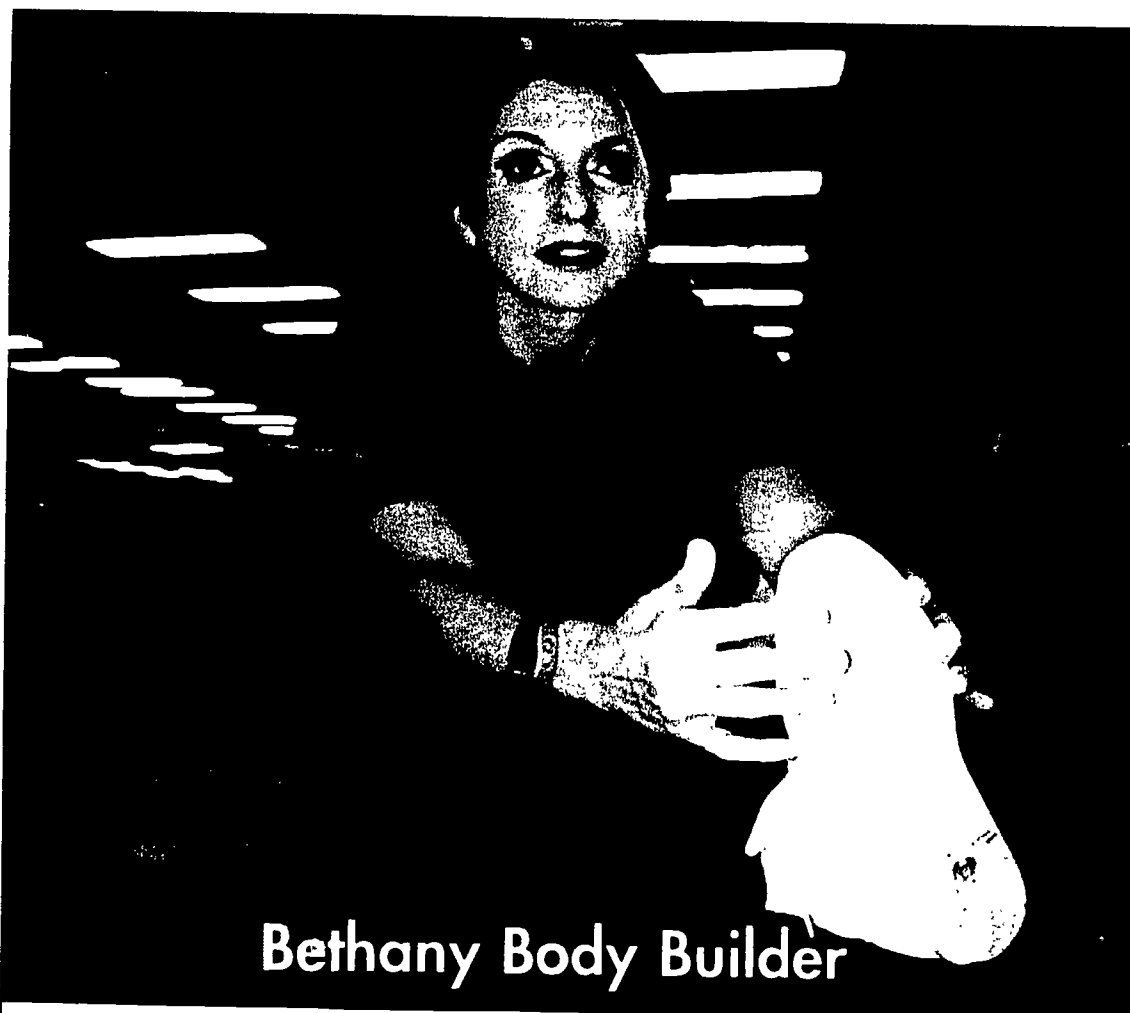

Coated Aspirin Not Giving Blood Thinning Effect

Majority of Patients Taking Low-Dose or Coated Aspirin Are Not Getting Desired Blood-Thinning Effect

The majority of patients who take baby or coated aspirin to prevent strokes are not getting the blood-thinning results they may need to help avoid these health threats, according to preliminary research presented today at the American Stroke Association's 28th International Stroke Conference. The American Stroke Association is a division of the American Heart Association.

While research has established that aspirin reduces the risk of stroke in patients with cerebrovascular disease, the optimal dose and formulation still remains somewhat unclear, according to Mark Alberts, M.D., the study's lead author and director of the Stroke Program at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. "This study is significant in that it points researchers in the right direction - showing how we can maximize the effectiveness of aspirin."

Northwestern investigators collected data on aspirin dose, type (coated or uncoated), demographic factors, and homocysteine level on in-patients and out-patients with cerebrovascular disease, including ischemic stroke, transient ischemic attacks (TIAs) and stenosis - or blockage - of a cerebral artery. Antiplatelet effects of aspirin were measured using a machine about the size of a coffee maker - called a PFA 100 - which can quickly, easily and reliably measure platelet function in response to aspirin.

Researchers collected data on aspirin dosage and formulation in the following groups of patients:

- 39 patients took a baby aspirin (81 mg): 56% of this patient group did not show an antiplatelet effect.
- 87 patients took an adult aspirin (325 mg): 28% did not show an antiplatelet effect.
- 40 patients took coated aspirin: 65% experienced no antiplatelet effect.
- 88 patients took uncoated aspirin: 25% experienced no antiplatelet effect.

This study indicates that adult aspirin produces more blood-thinning results than baby and/or coated aspirin. Results also suggest that age and gender play a role in a person's response to aspirin. Preliminary analyses show that aspirin was less effective at thinning blood in older patients and is more effective among women than men.

A stroke or "brain attack" occurs when blood circulation to the brain becomes interrupted. The most common type of stroke, ischemic stroke, occurs when an artery narrows or a blood clot blocks blood flow in an artery supplying the brain. A clot can form because of sluggish blood flow through a vessel narrowed by fatty deposits. The goal of aspirin is to thin the blood, thereby reducing the risk of blood clots.

The long-term goal of this line of research is to determine if we can better tailor the type and

strength of aspirin to maximize its effects as a clot-busting agent," said Dr. Alberts. "To ensure aspirin is truly helping those that make a commitment to taking it every day, routine testing of antiplatelet effects may be necessary."

Dr. Alberts and his colleagues plan to continue their research of dose-adjusted aspirin and how PFA results correlate with clinical events.

Co-authors include: Deborah Bergman, MS, FNP, Elise Molner, RN, and Jun Teruya, M.D., Northwestern Memorial Hospital; Borko Jovanovic, MS, PhD, and Issei Ushiwata, Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine.

"Certainly we're not advocating that anyone change their dose of aspirin or stop taking their aspirin. They need to consult with their own physician and health-care providers before they do anything. However, it's important that people understand aspirin does not work in everyone. There have been shown to reduce the risk of stroke, which include controlling your blood pressure and diabetes, stopping smoking, eating right and exercising."

The message for patients is clear: do not rely on taking aspirin alone for reducing the risk of stroke. Other things must be done."



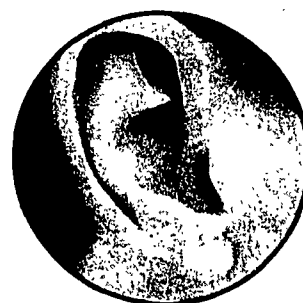
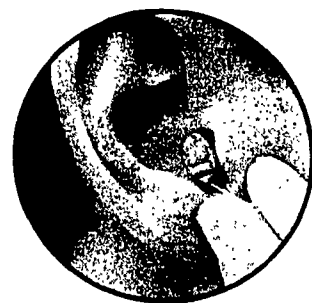

Gas prices at record high for month of February

northern Indiana, gas prices now average \$1.62, which also is up 16 cents from last month and is up 58 cents from last year.

"The unusually high prices for gasoline can be attributed to the oil industry's fear of a war with Iraq," said AAA Chicago spokesman Steve Nolan. "In the event of a war with Iraq, AAA Chicago urges retailers to avoid so-called 'panic pricing' that was seen after the September 11 tragedy. The club also encourages consumers to shop aggressively for the best price on gasoline."

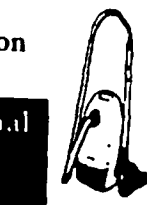

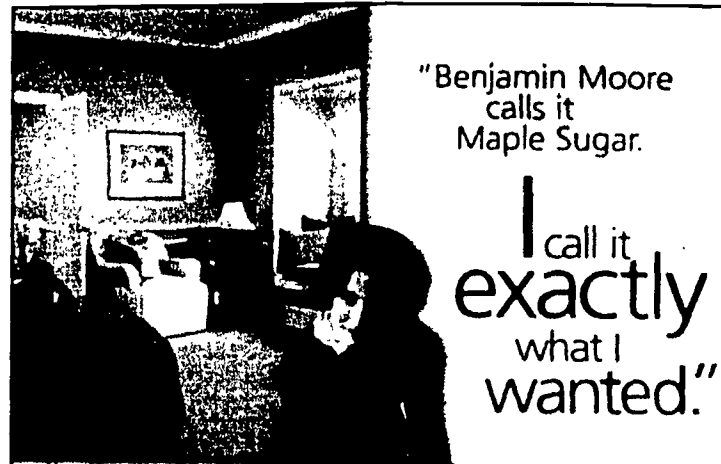

Straight Talk On Going Wireless

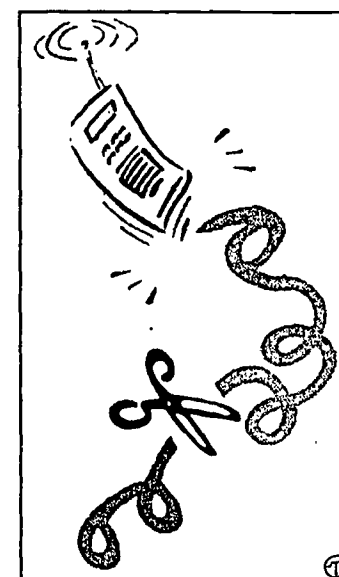
(NAPS)—It's a good call to learn about cell phones before going wireless. Service providers' plans change constantly, making it important to shop around, consider each offer carefully and ask these basic questions:

- How will I use my cell phone? For emergencies or more frequently?
- When will I make most of my calls? During the day, at night or on weekends?
- Where will I be making and receiving calls? Close to home or far away?
- How much can I afford for telephone service, including wireless?

Wireless plans vary. Some provide a specific number of minutes each month—with these plans you may lose minutes you don't use and pay extra if you use more. Other alternatives include prepaid and preset spending plans. These plans may let you use your minutes anytime, or there may be limits for use during "peak time" (usually weekdays) and "off-peak" time (nights and weekends).

Where you use your service matters, too. The phone may not work in all geographic locations. Weather, tall buildings and other factors can also affect service.

Some wireless plans are based on "home areas"; others offer nationwide service. If you make or receive calls while outside of your home area, there may be a "roaming" charge on top of the minutes you use. Even within your home area, some calls may be long distance. Wireless plans may include long-distance calls at the same rate,

Many wireless companies provide Internet access. Some offer unlimited service, while others charge by the minute or the kilobyte. Another popular service is text-messaging, which lets you send small notes to other wireless users.

It's important to know all the terms for wireless service, including the costs, the cancellation policy, and if there's a penalty for breaking the service contract (if you have one).

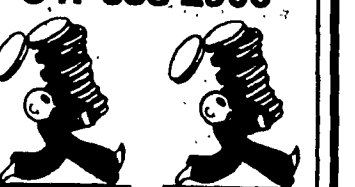

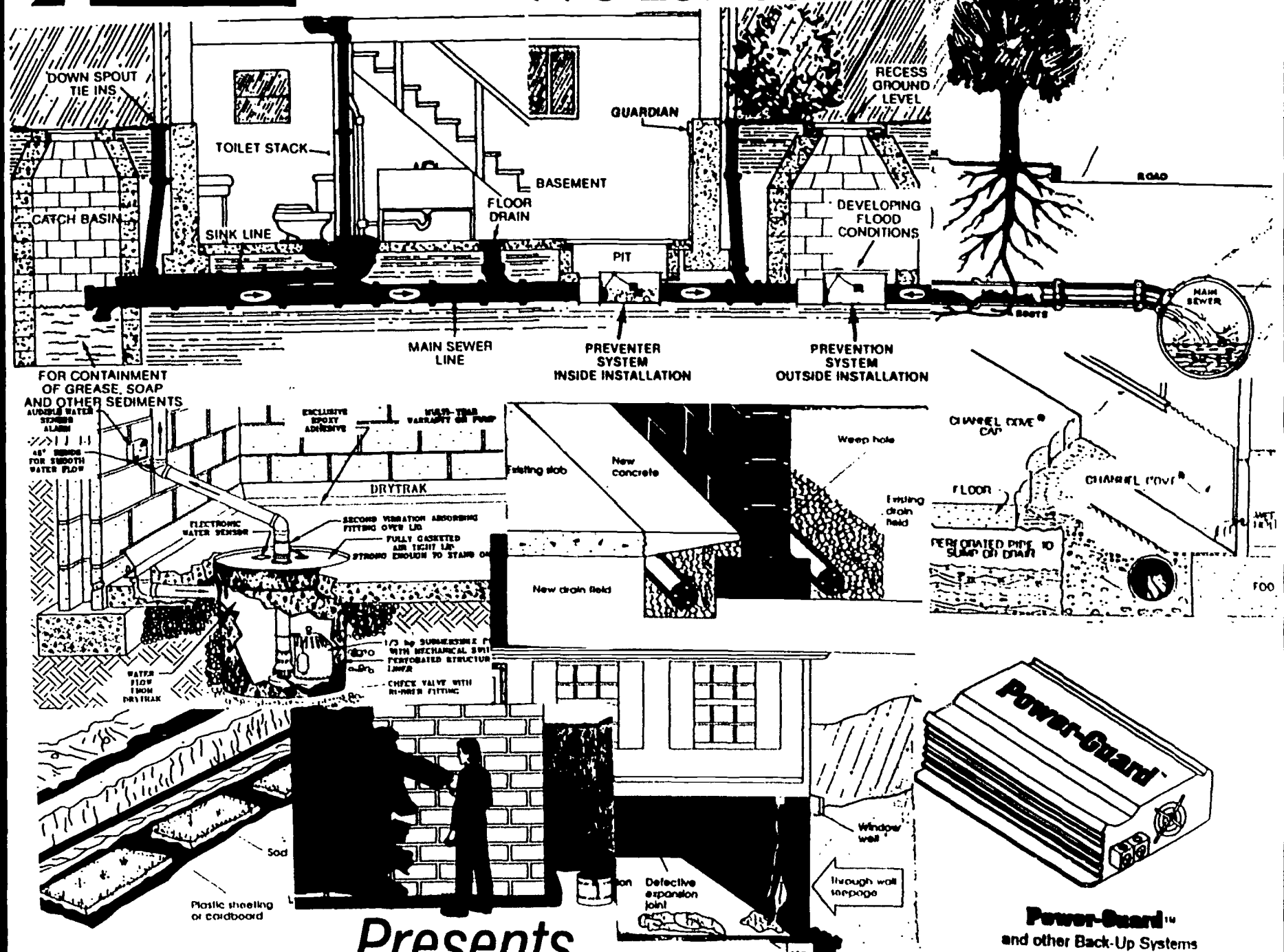
