Man Charged in Fatal Crash

Brian Kruger, 22, of Morton Grove, has been charged with reckless homicide and driving while drunk in the death of Anna Zinsky, 62, of Niles.

The April 15 traffic accident occurred as Zinsky, traveling east on Dempster Street, prepared to make a left turn onto Harlem Avenue. Her car collided with Krueger's who was traveling westbound on Dempster Street.

Zinsky, who was able to speak with rescuers shortly after the accident, died before reach-

County golfers may be offered wine, beer

Cook County golf course concessions soon may be selling alcoholic beverages.

The County Board is expected to vote whether to allow the sale of beer and wine, with the approval of the municipality where the facility is based, at county courses and driving ranges.

Approval by the county board is viewed as likely.

The contract between the Cook County board and Billy Casper Golf, the private firm now managing the county courses, allows the sale of beer and wine.

Alcohol sales may help county courses survive. In year 2000, the courses cost \$4 million to run, but brought in less than \$2.5 million. An audit determined that every round of golf played at a county course cost taxpayers \$4.16.

A Casper official stated that they have, or soon will, apply for licensing to Morton Grove for the Chick Evans course, to Chicago for the Edgebrook, Billy Caldwell and Indian Boundary courses, and to Des Plaines for the Harry Semrow Driving Range.

Morton Grove police pursue leads

The recovery of human remains from under the roof of one-time "La Bomba" restaurant has Morton Grove police going through files from the 1998 investigation and pursuing what leads they find there.

La Bamba owner, Enrico Martin Silva, 52, disappeared in August 1998.

Morton Grove police investigated, but they had no body and no leads.

Then, police were told of a possible Silva sitting in Mexico and they set the investigation aside.

Police now say that two other

men with ties to Silva have also disappeared.

Jose "Pepe" Posada, 34, a Chicago nightclub worker, disappeared in January, 1994. Police believe that Silva and Posada knew each other.

A second individual, Gabriel Lozano who worked at LaBamba, disappeared within a year of Silva's disappearance.

Posada's and Lozano's names were found in the original investigation files.

DNA testing has been done on the found remains; however, police lack DNA from any of the three to use for comparison.

Mayor predicts new suburban alliance

The bonds first issued in January 1996. Voters approved a \$6.9 million bond issue in November for a school addition. In an earlier election, District 71 lost a referendum that would have raised the tax rate.

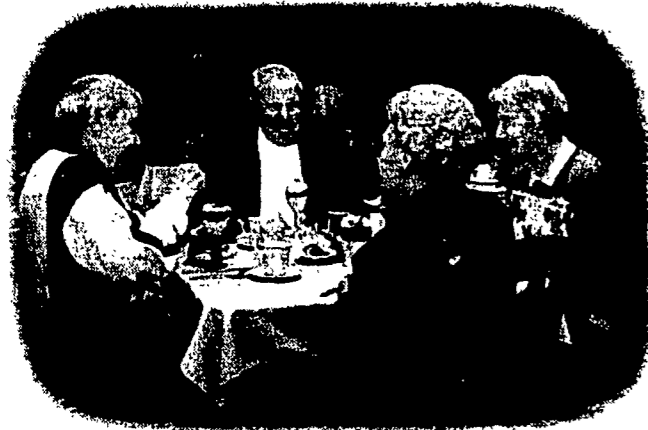

Stricter rules considered for school lunch program

Changes now under debate in Congress would affect how the federal school lunch program is qualified, and some school administrators are concerned that added paperwork requirements could overburden staffs.

Also, certain administrators are concerned that a stricter application process could discourage qualified families from applying.

At present, parents who apply for free or discounted meals for their children are asked the names of all household members and their monthly incomes.

Families registered for food stamps are asked their case num-

ber. School administrators do an annual spot-check to verify household incomes of a sampling of recipients.

The Bush plan will require income verification of all program applicants.

Requiring 100 percent verification would ensure that all recipients are properly qualified and would position schools to qualify for the funding of other income-based programs, according to claims of the Bush proposal.

This school lunch program revision is part of the 2004 budget proposal.

- You can safeguard your children's interest** - When your will is probated, the court sets up a guardianship for your minor children. You can name the guardian in your will, but the court could still appoint someone else. Just as importantly, the court not the guardian - may control the inheritance until your children reach legal age. At that time, they may receive the entire inheritance. But with a living trust, you determine when your children or grandchildren will receive their inheritances. You can even have the money distributed in installments, over a period of years.
- You can retain control of assets, even in cases of incapacity** - When you establish a living trust, you designate a "successor trustee" who can immediately step in for you if you become incapacitated. And your trustee must follow your wishes as far as providing funds for you, and later, for your beneficiaries.

A living trust can help you deal with many issues that relate to your family. But if you want to include a charitable organization in your estate plans as well as make your appreciated low-yield assets more productive, you may want to consider a charitable remainder trust.

If you place appreciated stocks in a charitable remainder trust, you'll receive an immediate income-tax deduction and later an estate tax deduction. The trust can set your appreciated stocks with no immediate capital-gain taxation, purchase an income-producing vehicle and pay you an income stream for life. Upon your death, the trust will pay out the remaining funds to the charity or charities you've chosen.

But if you set up a charitable remainder trust and fund it with appreciated stocks or other assets, won't you be depriving your family of those resources? Yes. But you could use some of the income you receive from your trust to pay the premiums on a life insurance policy on yourself, with your heirs as beneficiaries. To keep this policy out of your estate and avoid estate taxes, you may want to put it in another type of trust - an irrevocable life insurance trust.

Trusts are not suitable for everyone. And they can be quite complex instruments, so, before taking any action, consult with your tax and legal advisers. But if your trusts are correctly set up, they can go a long way toward helping turn your estate plans into reality.

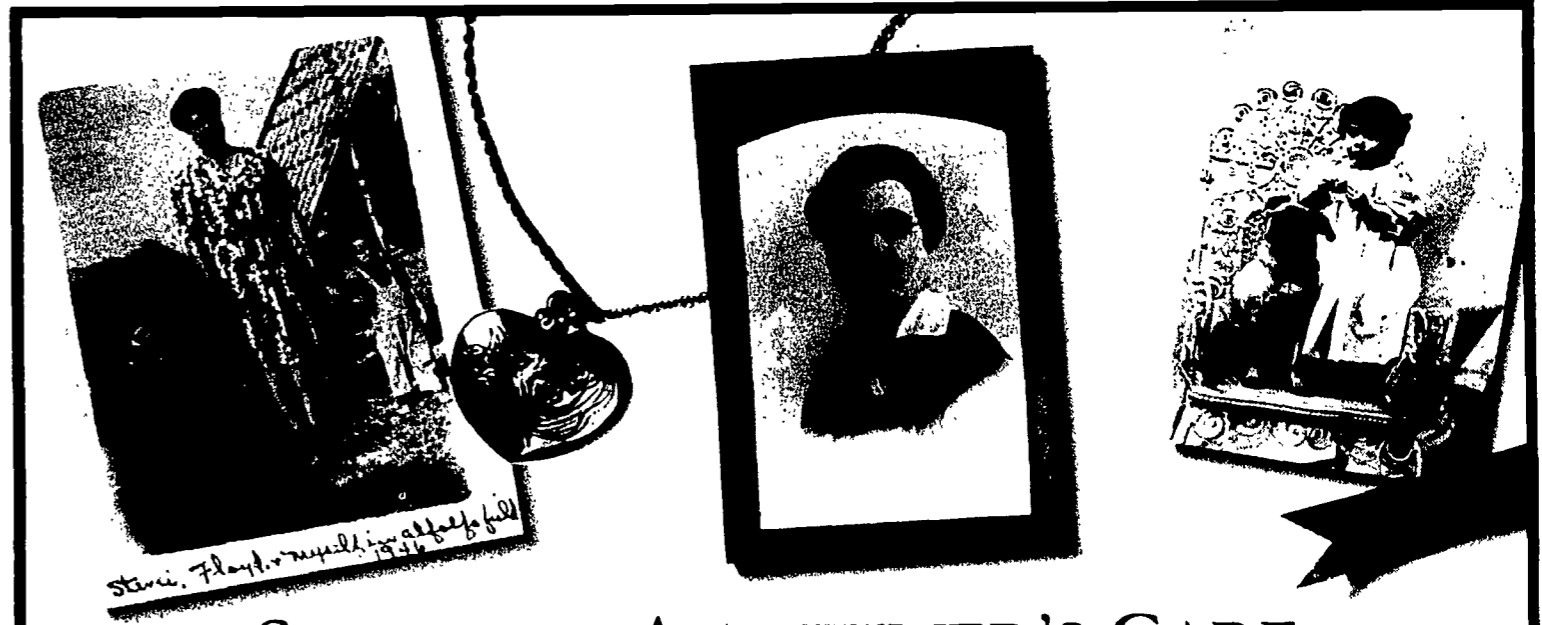

Maine Twp launches new senior cab voucher program

Supervisor Bob Dudycz and the Maine Township Board have established a new subsidized transportation assistance program for Township seniors with limited mobility, disabilities or meet other criteria. The program is being launched this month.

"Our purpose is to provide assistance to our residents who otherwise might not be able to get around," says Supervisor Dudycz. "Eligible residents may travel anywhere as long as the trip starts or ends in Maine Township with the use of our new *Maine-*

Lines travel vouchers for specific transportation needs."

The vouchers are worth \$3 each toward a cab ride and are sold in books of 10. However, seniors only pay \$1 each for them.

Maine Township includes portions of DesPlaines, Park Ridge, Glenview, Morton Grove, Niles, Rosemont, and unincorporated Cook County. The boundaries are within Central Avenue to the north, Devon Avenue to the south, Harlem Avenue to the east, and Mt. Prospect Rd. to the west.

To receive assistance, senior citizens must meet the following criteria:


- 65 years or older with limited mobility or disabilities who cannot mount three bus steps or walk 200 feet unassisted. Doctor authorization required
- 65 years or older and fall within the following income guidelines
 - *Single person at less than \$21,218 annual income
 - *Couple at less than \$28,480 annual income.

Other requirements in the program include:

- Any travel must either begin or end in Maine Township
- Only one ticket can be used per ride
- No tickets can be used for additional passengers
- Tickets cannot be transferred or used by anyone other than the person assigned these tickets
- Tickets must be used within a three-month period.

Free File Still Available for Extension Filers

The IRS expected more than 255,000 Illinois taxpayers to request a filing extension this year to extend their filing deadline to Aug. 15. The IRS said taxpayers who haven't yet filed their 2002 taxes, might still be able to take advantage of IRS Free File to prepare and file their returns electronically at no cost.

"E-file is available until Oct. 15 to accommodate people who received a four-month extension and those who may request an additional two months due to some extenuating circumstance," said Sue Hales, IRS spokeswoman northern Illinois. "Several of the Free File providers who offered free tax preparation software and free e-file through the IRS Web site are also extending their services, so not only will late filers be able to e-file their returns, they may be able to do it for free."

Free File debuted Jan. 16 as a public-private partnership between the IRS and the Free File Alliance, a consortium of tax preparation software companies. Each company sets its own criteria for taxpayer eligibility, generally based on income, age or state residency. Throughout the tax-filing season, eligible taxpayers prepared and e-filed their federal tax returns for free. Hales said 2.7 million people took advantage of Free File, easily surpassing the

IRS' expectations. Hales advised that late filers who failed to get an extension to the IRS by the April 15 deadline should also use e-file or, if eligible, Free File to help reduce the time penalties that are applied when neither a tax return nor an extension request is filed by the deadline.

"The sooner you get your return in the better, and e-file will allow you to file much faster than if you filed a paper return. The penalty that you may end up paying for filing late is ten times greater than the penalty for not paying the taxes you owed on time," said Hales.

The IRS is still available to help people with their taxes. In addition to providing a link to Free File, the IRS Web site - www.irs.gov - has tax forms and publications, answers to tax questions, and much more. Hales said more than 8.3 million computer users visited the Free File content area through April 15, making it the most visited page on the heavily used IRS Web site.

IRS telephone assistance is available Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., by calling 1-800-829-1040. Many IRS offices that offer walk-in assistance are also still open, although some may have reduced their hours of service.

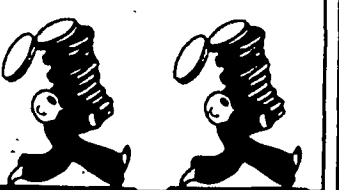

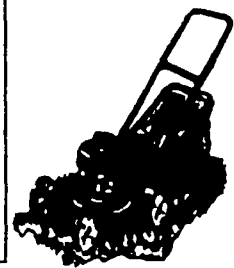

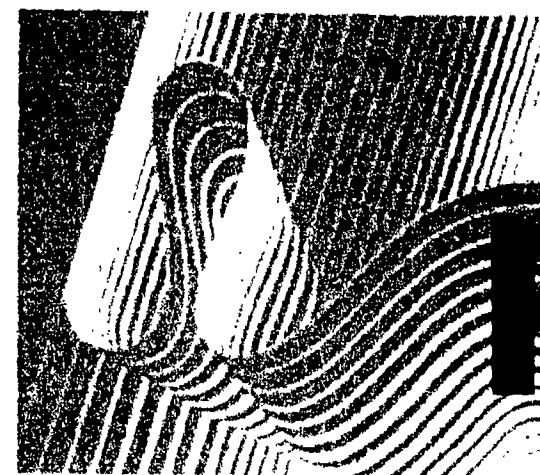
