Four injured in fire truck-van collision

Four people were hospitalized and portions of Howard St. and Milwaukee Ave. were closed following a midday collision at the intersection of Harlem Ave. and Howard in Niles last Thursday. According to police, a van traveling northbound on Harlem ran a red light, striking a fire truck that was traveling westbound on Howard. The fire truck was a 1989 aerial ladder truck that belonged to the North Maine Fire Protection District and was returning to its garage at the time.

"It was definitely not nearing the end of its life," said North Maine Chief Robert Batey. "We probably would have used it for another ten years."

When the van struck the fire truck, its hydraulic system was disabled, causing the drivers to lose breaks and steering. It struck a tree and stoplight at the northwest corner of Harlem and Howard, passed through the adjacent Parkview Bank Plaza, crushed a sport utility vehicle against a building, and continued across Milwaukee, stopping after it hit a parked, unoccupied school bus on the west side of the street.

"I was stopped at a light at Milwaukee when it happened," said one bystander. "I used to live in an apartment that it almost hit. I'm still shaking."

Three firefighters that were in the truck and the driver of the van were taken to Lutheran General Hospital

Our Lady of Ransom School to close

After 43 years of education Our Lady of Ransom Elementary School is closing

Nearly 200 parents and parishioners filled a good portion of Paluch Hall, Thursday night February 26, to hear from school board president Patty Rousch that a study showed enrollment was declining, demographics were changing, and the economics of running a viable educational program at the school were not possible. The school will close at the end of the present school

year. Parents and parishioners quickly turned the meeting into an emotionally charged evening as they shouted from the audience that they never were informed of the poor financial position of the school and that Our Lady of Ransom pastor Fr. John Hall had vetoed any attempts by parishioners to raise money for the school in the past. By the end of the evening a petition was circulated among the group calling for the removal or resignation of Fr. Hall.

"I have no intentions of resigning," said Fr. Hall.

"You made the choice for us without giving us a chance," shouted one person from the audience.

"This is the first time we are

here together," she said.

Some admonished the school board for making the decision without informing parents.

One teary-eyed parent who had graduated from the school more than 20 years ago told Fr. Hall, "all I want to do is see my son graduate from here. I felt it was the best nine years of my life."

"This is a farce," shouted another member of the audience, "Don't trust these people," he said.

Emotional audience members pointed out that over the last three years they had asked Fr. Hall for a dinner dance and silent auction to raise money for the school and that he had vetoed the idea. Yet, they said,

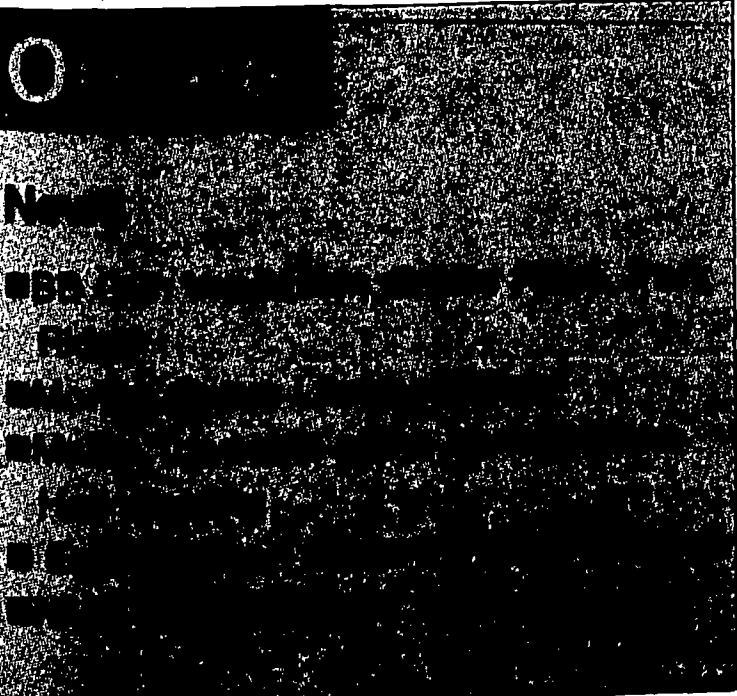
Taste of Morton Grove Tonight

Notre Dame's gym was packed to the gills in anticipation of Friday night's fierce rivalry basketball game. To add to the hysteria, it was senior night and St. Patrick was in town. Unfortunately for the Dons the game did not live up to its billing as St. Patrick dominated, winning 58-31. The

win improved St. Pat's record to 20-5, and 10-3 in the conference, behind only Marist and undefeated St. Joseph.

For the Dons, they finished a disappointing year at 9-15, and 6-7 in the conference. The good news is that the team returns 12 juniors and a freshman that saw limited action against St. Pat's. The Dons were fighting to get over the .500 mark in conference for the last

The Notre Dame Ice Dons lost their Founders Cup semifinal playoff match in the overtime period to the St. Viator Lions 2 to 1. The Ice Dons lost the game but won the respect of the other Chicago Metropolitan High School Hockey League teams by making it to the Final Four from a field of 24 Metro League Founders Cup playoff teams.

The St. Viator Lions scored first, halfway through the first period, as Michael Shaw stick handled the puck into the Notre Dame zone and got a clean shot off for the score. The Lions dominated the first period with their twelve shots on Dons goaltender Pat Pagani. The Dons defense broke up many other St. Viator excursions into Don territory with a lot of poke checking and dives to break up the plays.

In the second period, with the encouragement from the stands of the fans and the Notre Dame Bucket Banging Brigade, the Dons tied the game during a power play opportunity. As the Dons pressed hard for a score around the Lions net, defenseman Brian Brown picked up the puck near the blue line. Brown fired a powerful slapshot at Lions goaltender Tom Mccann. As the puck rebounded off of Mccann's chest, Mike Lushniak got his stick on the puck and flipped it into the net for the Dons score. The second period ended tied 1 to 1.

The third period saw the action pick up for both teams as they skated fast and hard and got off may crisp passing plays, an excellent example of playoff hockey. With two minutes left to play Rick Shanas took a hard

hit at the blue line. As he took to the ice in agony, the Lions pressed Pagani and got the puck into the net as the referee whistled the play dead. The goal was disallowed and after three periods the game remained tied at 1.

In the Overtime period, Pat Pagani made several acrobatic saves against the St. Viator efforts for a goal. 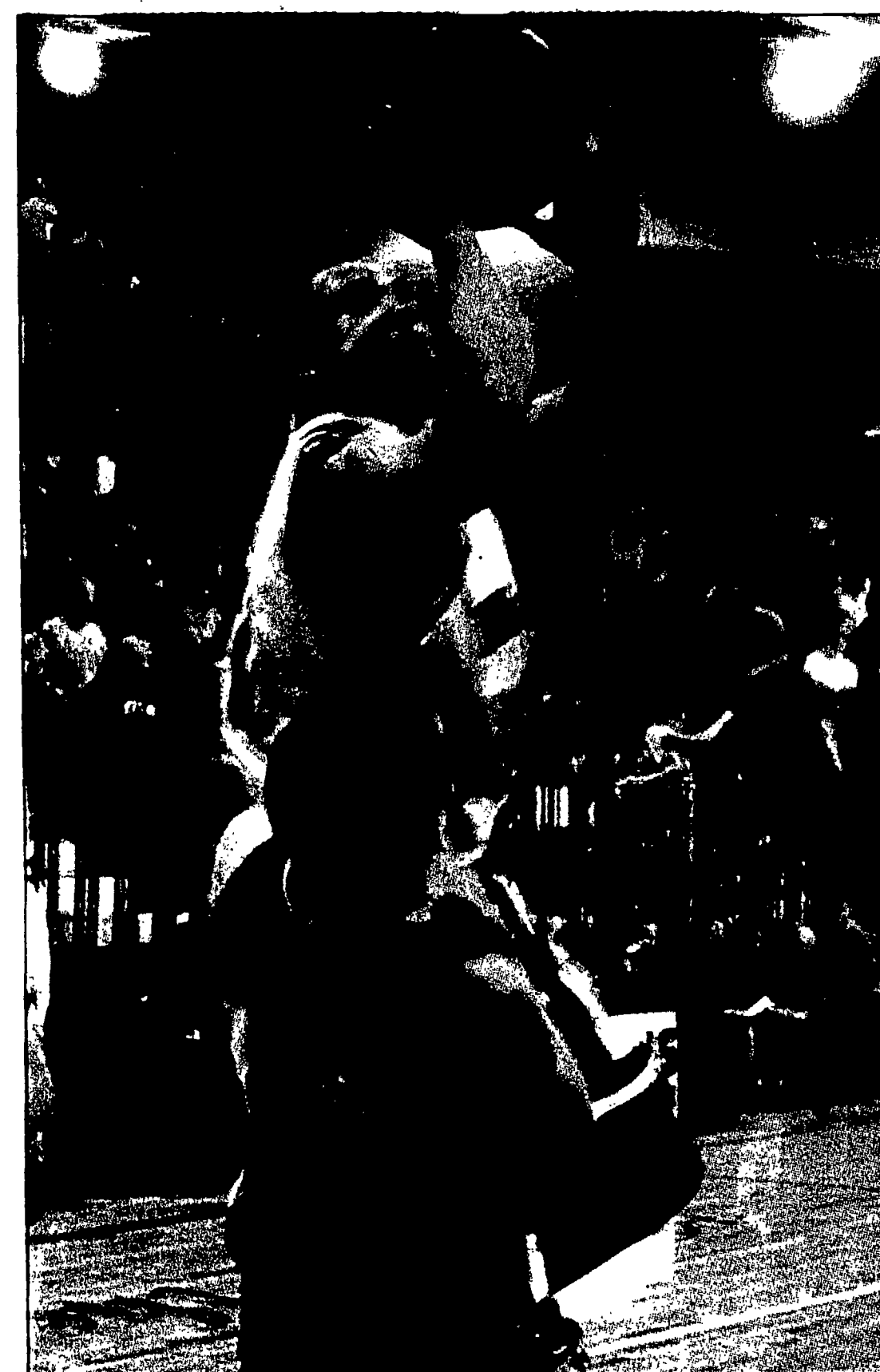
Pat's fans into a frenzy as the student sections exchanged chants throughout the game. The Dons slow start(2-9 FG in first quarter) carried over the rest of the game, as the team could never get in a rhythm offensively.

A nicely designed give and go play from senior Adam Carrabotta to Ryan Finneke and a Finneke three-pointer were all the points Notre Dame could manage in the quarter. Senior guard Matt Marino drilled a three pointer and David Kleinschmidt hit a short jumper before the buzzer give the Shamrocks a 11-5 lead.

"We knew coming in that we had to cut down on our mistakes and play as a team. We didn't play well at all tonight and couldn't get in a rhythm. We were totally out of sync tonight, they just shut us down. We are going to have to bring our A game to beat Loyola Tuesday," said junior guard Jovaughn Mixon, who led Notre Dame in scoring with 10 points.

St. Patrick had the inside, outside game working for the majority of the game. 6'7 forward Daniel Bolger established himself in the paint, scoring 16 points and pulling down six rebounds. Guard Matt Marino controlled the tempo of the game, dishing the ball to Bolger and Haiduc while pouring in 12 points, including two three pointers.

"We didn't make our open shots tonight, and as the game wore on we extended what we were doing defensively, said coach Dennis Zelasko. They proved they were the better team tonight. Once the deficit got down to 12-14 points the floodgates started to open, it was ugly. Early on we had some looks, if

For Morton Grove's Prielozny, bead making is all about color

For Peggy Prielozny it's all about color. Whether it's blue, orange, black or fuschia, Prielozny says color is her absolute favorite element of design when she is creating the glass beads that fill her sample boxes, and sell in bead stores from Boston to California. "I think it's something that's hard wired into me," said Prielozny, who creates her beads at a work table in the Morton Grove home where she has lived since she was 8. Prielozny, a one time actress, messenger, waitress and believer in Chinese Energetic Medicine, was making and teaching wire wrapped jewelry, when her passion for color and creativity led her to a bead making class 11 years ago. "I had no intention of going in to the bead business," said Prielozny. "I was just trying to broaden my palette." She took her wire wrapped jewelry and some of her "very crude" beads to a bazaar not long after, and to her surprise her beads outsold her finished jewelry like gangbusters. These are not the kind of beads you buy by the bulk at your local

dollar store. "Sputnik" is a glass ball covered with small glass protrusions, measuring at least a half inch in diameter. Her "Bouquet Beads" have tiny flowers inside, and her faux Chevrons imitate a classic in the bead world. But the best seller by far these days are her glass heart beads. "The market likes hearts," said Prielozny, who doesn't really have a favorite. "Whatever I'm working on at the time is my favorite." Prielozny starts with tubes of glass and a stainless steel mandrel, a tool that she can build her bead around layer by layer. The finished product sells wholesale anywhere from \$32 to \$180, depending on the bead. She supplements her income by teaching classes in bead making like one this weekend in Lisle. "The Zen of Glass Beadmaking", as she calls it, combines her belief in the Ancient Art of Energetics with the Ancient Craft of Lampworking Glass Beads. Her classes are limited to only a handful of students and take two full days to complete. "I teach technique," said Prielozny. "When you start out the techniques are so simple there's not much room for variation. But as you keep

adding techniques to their palette they start going off in their own direction." She also has two Trunk Shows scheduled this month. The weekend of March 13-14 she will be at "The Place to Bead" in Naperville, and the following weekend at "Lisa's Beads" in Skokie. At both she will give a demonstration in bead making and show off her wares. She has taught classes at a number of art centers, bead and stained glass stores all over the country and would like to do more of it. Prielozny says California is the most bead loving part of the country, but surprisingly enough there are probably more bead stores per square mile in Minneapolis than any other city she's visited. "Right now it's all I can do to keep up with the demand for my beads," said Prielozny, who isn't sure what the future holds. She would love to write a book or two about her work, but knows the unpredictability of the bead world. Popular in the sixties, then again in the mid 80's and now into the next century, the low spots in between can be difficult. Still, she



has taken many paths and found a way. A friend once called her a cardinal in a forest of English sparrows. "We cardinals stand out," said Prielozny. "We can't help it. It's that color thing again."

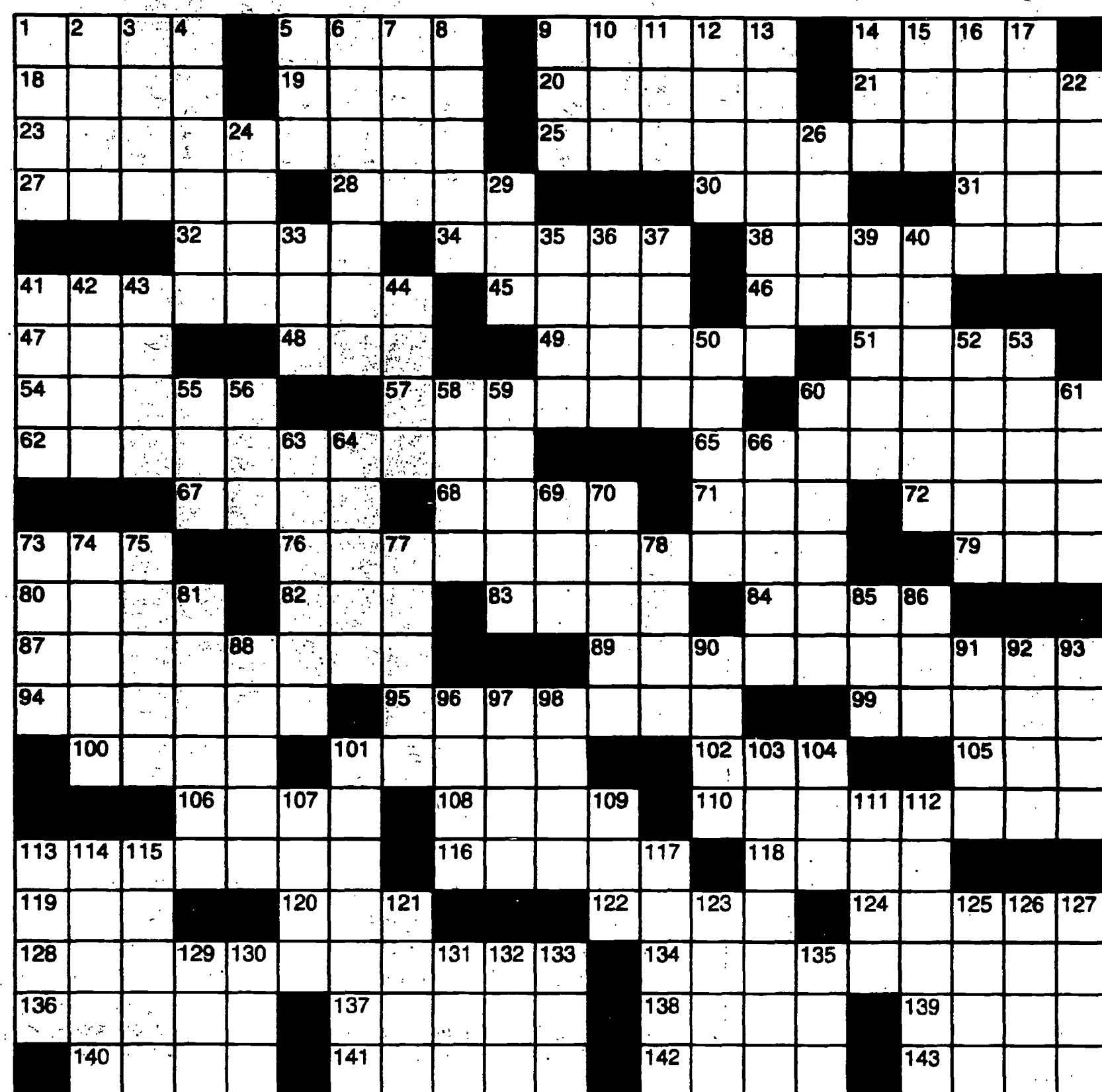

Basic Plumbing Tools

Every homeowner should have a basic set of tools on hand for minor plumbing emergencies, such as stuck drains and leaky faucets. Many of these tools have several different uses beyond plumbing in home repair, so you may already have them. Others are specialized for plumbing issues.

Here's a list of items you should have in your home at all times for plumbing (as well as other) problems.

- **Plunger** — The one thing you can't do without when dealing with a plumbing system, a plunger should be kept next to the toilet. Place an extra one near the kitchen sink for a quick solution to sink clogs, too.
- **Pipe wrench** — This extra-large wrench has an adjustable jaw to

fit a variety of pipe diameters. Buy two, if possible; they can be used in tandem when separating pipes and fittings.

- **Auger** — Also called a snake, this tool clears drain clogs that are located too far down the pipe to reach with shorter equipment. A long coil is fed from one end of the auger down the pipe. On the other end, a handle allows the user to guide the coil to the clog and wind it back in. Two sizes address two kinds of pipes: The smaller hand auger is used for drain lines, while the large closet auger clears tough clogs in toilets.
- **Adjustable wrenches and channel pliers** — Smaller than pipe wrenches, these tools also have adjustable jaws that fit different sizes of nuts or bolts.
- **Ratchet wrench** — With its interchangeable sockets, this tool makes removing nuts and bolts easier.
- **Needlenose pliers** — can grip small objects and reach into confined spaces.
- **Screwdrivers** — both standard flared and Phillips types, of different sizes.
- **Metal files** — These can be used to smooth a variety of materials, including metal, wood and plastic. Use a round file on curved pipes and a flat file on flat surfaces.

- **Hacksaw** — used to cut metal or plastic pipe.
- **Wire brush** — cleans metal pipes without damaging them.
- **Putty knife** — scrapes away old putty or caulk from fixtures.
- **Tape measure** — to measure pipe length, of course.
- **Caulk gun** — to caulk or recaulk when needed.
- **Flashlight** — For every job more complicated than plunging a toilet (and maybe even that), keep this close by.
- **Circuit tester** — This handy little gadget can save your life by indicating a live current traveling through a pipe. Electrical wires can touch pipes in tight spaces, so if you aren't sure, test for a current before beginning pipe work.

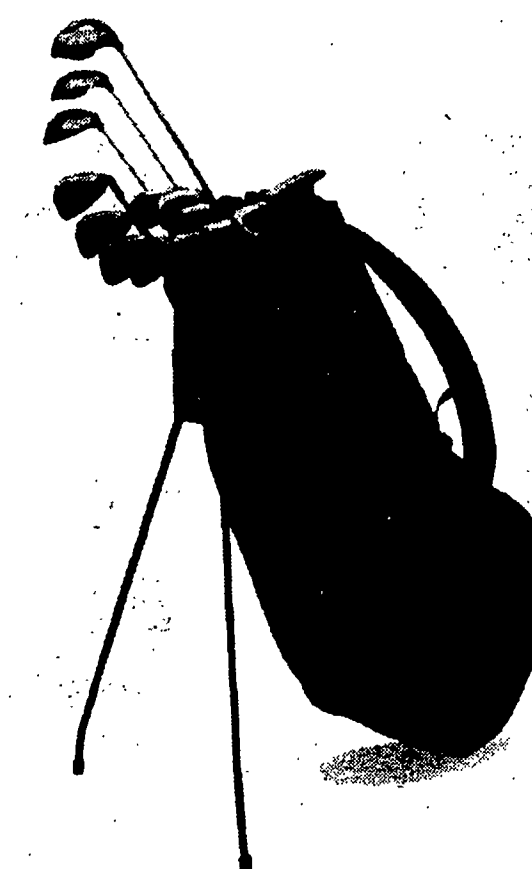
HOME TIP

Consider investing in cordless power tools with a variety of attachments to make plumbing jobs easier. Add a heat gun to your toolkit to thaw frozen pipes.
