## Kraft to close Niles Bakery

**Plant closure means almost 400 lost jobs**



The Kraft Bakery located at the intersection of Howard and Caldwell in Niles will close at the end of the year, according to Kraft Foods, Inc., costing nearly 400 jobs. The closure is part of cost-cutting measures at Kraft, which will eventually eliminate 6,000 jobs and close 20 plants in the next two years.

The plant's closing was a shock to the Village of Niles. Community Development Director Charles Ostman said that the first the Village heard of the closing was last Friday.

"It came as a real shock to us because they were expanding their production line," said Ostman. "They were bringing in more employees and modernizing."

Of the 393 jobs that will be lost when the plant closes,

no figures were available as to how many were residents of the surrounding area. However, Kraft Spokesperson Cathy Pernu said that the plant's closing was beyond the control of the local workforce.

"We have a terrific team at the Niles plant," said Pernu. "They did a great job. It's a terribly difficult thing to do, but the factors that motivated the closing of the plant were beyond their control."

Those factors, according to Pernu, included an excess of manufacturing

capacity in Nabisco-brand cookies and crackers, which were specifically produced by the Niles site and another in Buena Park, California, which will also be closed.

"After careful study we recognized that we had excess manufacturing capacity in crackers and cookies," said Pernu. "We also determined that both the Niles and Buena Park plants were small enough that their production could

## Conversion of former Abt property underway

Demolition is currently underway inside the former Abt Electronics building located at 9010 Waukegan Rd. in Morton Grove.

The building, along with an office building to the south, is being reconfigured to house a variety of different tenants. Illinois Bone and Joint, currently located in the Resurrection Health Care building on Dempster and Menard in Morton Grove will take occupancy in the building's second floor once the

remodeling has been completed.

## Volunteers step forward for Maine Township Garbage Committee

Several volunteers have already stepped forward to volunteer for a committee that will lay the groundwork for a trash collection in unincorporated Maine Township.

"We've had some people come forward," said Maine Township Supervisor Bob Dudycz. "We're planning on a committee of from eight to ten members."

Interested persons should still contact the Township. Dudycz said that, if too many apply, those that have lived in the unincorporated area for the longest length of time would be chosen.

The deadline for applying to be a member of the committee is Apr. 9 and Dudycz hopes to have the first meeting in the week of Apr. 17.

"The committee will have to decide whether they want a Yugo or a Cadillac," said Dudycz. "Or something in between."

After the committee has formed a recommendation, public hearings will be held where other residents of the unincorporated area will be able to have input to the process. After that, an ordinance will be drafted and the contract will go out to bid.

"We've already had one garbage hauler approach us and ask to be put on the list to receive bid packets," said Dudycz.

A referendum authorizing Maine Township to contract with one garbage hauler for the whole unincorporated area passed overwhelmingly in March's primary election, which Dudycz believes is a mandate.

"The referendum was on the last


page of the ballot," he said. "And it got 70 percent. People were looking for it."

The passage of the referendum, Dudycz believes, means lower cost and less aggravation for Township residents.

"Before if someone called us and said someone left two bags of trash in front of their house, we couldn't do much," he said. "Our code enforcement officer would go out and pick through the trash to find an address and then we would fine the person."

But now, with an ordinance in effect, not only will the Township have teeth, but costs could go down for trash collection.

"Not everyone is paying for trash service now," said Dudycz, "but with the ordinance, everyone will be paying and the cost could go down."



### Niles Police move into 'new digs'

Niles Police began moving into their new Police Station at the corner of Milwaukee and Touhy Avenues last week. "Welcome to our new digs," Cmdr. Dennis McEnerney intoned to a recent visitor.

The new station replaces a neighboring building that has housed the Police Department since its construction in 1964.

"You'd be amazed," said Cmdr. John Fryksdale. "We have more space for everything and I've only gotten lost twice."


The new facility makes up for several deficiencies of the old, most notably, in training space.

"We have a new training room where we can use a variety of multi-media," said Fryksdale. The training room looks out over the corner of Touhy and Milwaukee and will be used, not just for officer training, but also for the Department's popular Citizens' Police Academy.

"It's a room with a view," said Fryksdale.

Officers have been moving their files, possessions, and even evidence from the old building.

"We have to maintain a chain of custody," said Fryksdale. Consequently, the evidence officer

has to be present when any of the evidence is being moved. "And because of evidence laws you have to keep everything basically forever."

All the departments of the Police have additional space, which is a real change. There are six new desks for officers to write reports. All necessary forms are nearly within arms' reach.

"Before we had one broken desk where 64 sworn officers would come in to fill our reports," said Fryksdale.

Even the pistol range in the basement is an improvement over the old. The new range is 100 feet where the old was only 75.

"We used to get water in the old range," said Fryksdale. There's enough underground park-

ing to house a large portion of the Niles Police vehicles.

"Gone are the days of scraping off the windshields," Fryksdale smiled.

The new Police building will be open and operational within a week, according to Fryksdale and the Department should be completely moved within a few weeks. Visitors to the station will enter onto a two-story atrium with plenty of natural light.

As for the old building, when the move is completed, it will be torn down and replaced with a parking lot.

The construction of new parking lots and landscaping is all that remains before the building is complete.



readily be absorbed by out other plants in the United States."

Kraft plans to sell which has been operating since 1954 under a variety of different owners after its first owners, Salerno Inc. According to Pernu, Kraft plans to cease production at the site by Dec. 2004 and have the building entirely vacated by spring of 2005.

"Our current plan is to offer the plant for sale once production has ceased and our equipment has been removed," she said. No estimate was available on what an asking price for the facility might be.

Future plans for the 14-acre, 300,000 square-foot facility are unclear at this point.

"We haven't even begun to think about it," said Ostman.

"Whether another manufacturing business moves into the site or its redeveloped into some other kind of use, we're not sure yet."

The closings here in Niles and in Buena Park are the fourth and fifth of this year. Kraft has cut 1,300 jobs this year by closing facilities in New York, Ohio, and Central Europe.

## City Begins Developer Selection Process

The city began the next stage in uptown development Monday night when the first of five developers presented their plan for development in Target Area 2. Following Mayor Michael MaRous' preview, the first developer, Northern Realty Group Ltd. and Wellington Partners, Inc., made their

presentation.

The list began with nineteen development teams and has since been whittled down to five finalists. The mayor emphasized that everyone should remain open minded as the presentations unfolded.

"We're here for the next ten days to learn" MaRous said.

City Manager Tim Schuenke indicated that the plans varied greatly in design, financial packages, mix of retail and

residential, and how their plans related to the rest of uptown.

Northern Realty Group and Wellington Partners were the first development team to present. They looked at the city's goals for the area and came up with six planning goals.

•Create a civic front yard  
•Provide a critical mass of retailers


•Eliminate Surface Parking  
•Provide curbside guest parking  
•Create a network of green space  
•Provide pedestrians friendly streetscapes

To achieve their goals the group proposed a mix of retail and residential buildings that would be connected by a green space corridor of landscaping and fountains.

The team divided their planning area into three tentatively named areas: Uptown Place, Summit Park, and Hinkley Green.

Uptown Place would be placed in between Touhy, Northwest Highway and Summit. This would consist primarily of retailers to complement those already existing in Park Ridge. Four hundred

## Ah, the Pickwick

An interesting sidebar/question is developing in the discussions of Uptown Redevelopment and what else to do about the "look and feel" of Uptown: What do we do about the Pickwick?

The Pickwick theater building, now 75 years old and arguably the icon of Park Ridge — especially of Uptown, is in an ever-decreasing state of repair.

Even though it's on the National Register of Historic Places and even though it's a popular cornerstone of the community, it can't generate enough business both to keep it open and keep it up.

So, what do we do about the Pickwick?

There are only three options: Do nothing. Let it take the course of all businesses — sink or swim on the basis of private support from theater-goers and tenants.

Subsidize it. Treat it as a local treasure and grant tax dollars to the private owners to restore and maintain it.

Take it over. Acquire it publicly and restore and run it as a magnet/destination facility for Uptown and Park Ridge.

In reverse order: The Park Ridge City Council, in their Finance & Budget Committee, is poised to use \$15,000 tax dollars to find out what it would cost to acquire and renovate the Pickwick. Yes, Virginia, we may buy the Pickwick — at a potential cost of \$2-million to get it and another \$x-million to make it whole again.

Take it over: Is that what you want? The Park Ridge City Council is also poised to offer a grant

of \$10,000 tax dollars (per year) to the Pickwick Preservation Society, a group of private citizens interested in keeping art alive in Park Ridge and in the Pickwick by staging shows that use and glorify the Pickwick, with the intent of raising funds to preserve it, perhaps also with restoration grants of public funds to the private owners (which may itself be unconstitutional).

Subsidize it: Is that what you want?

The beauty of capitalism, at least in its pure form, is that business succeeds when it delivers what consumers want, and fails when it doesn't. The owners of the Pickwick can't generate enough business both to keep the building open and keep it up. They choose, as is their choice, to keep it open and keep it up as excess funds allow. The former is barely working; the latter is not.

Do nothing (public): Is that what you want?

You see, the question of what to do with the Pickwick lies squarely on your shoulders, citizens.

If you think Uptown and Park Ridge deserve the Pickwick as a signature piece, then it must become a civic structure in both meanings of that phrase. We, as a people, must buy, restore, and run it.

If you want the Pickwick to remain exclusively private, you must patronize it more. If you don't care what happens to the Pickwick, you won't mind if its owners sell the place to a developer — who will surely tear it down to put more lucrative tenants into that valuable piece of real estate.

So, what do we do about the Pickwick?

below surface parking spaces would be created.

Hinkley Green, next to Hinkley Park and Summit Park in between Hinkley Green and Uptown Place would consist of residential townhouses and condos, with those condos located in Hinkley Green being larger and more expensive than in Summit Park. Parking for those buildings would also be

placed in underground garages.

Bruce Kaplan spoke of the stores their team hoped to attract. Kaplan looked to restaurants, apparel stores, and retail he called "fun stores". He also discussed bringing in food shops that fit into the new fast food genre like Corner Bakery and Cozy's. Kaplan believed that he could draw large retail stores to the new

development.

"Park Ridge has had its challenges attracting high profile retailers," Kaplan said. "The main problem has only been lack of space."

Larry Devito of Northern Realty closed by stressing his connection with the community as a resident.

"To say we would be excited to handle this project is an

understatement," he said. "We would be building this from the heart with our friends and family in mind."

Some Aldermen raised concerns that the plan did not provide any real solution to crossing Touhy and linking the old retail to the new. Aldermen also questioned the large amount of residential development when the main aim was

to generate sales tax.

The Council as well as anyone interested in the community will see the rest of the developers at Emerson Middle School on April 7, 8, and 9. The council will then hold a discussion to debate the merits of each team on April 21st and if necessary time has been scheduled on April 28th and May 11th.







"Volume purchasing power enables you to purchase automobiles for less without the traditional hassle and aggravation normally associated with buying a new vehicle," the Web site states. "And combine that with a low interest auto loan from the credit union, it's the most worry free auto purchase

you can make."

The credit union's main branch is located at 5550 W. Touhy Ave., Skokie. There are also satellite locations at Lutheran General Hospital, 1775 Dempster St., Park Ridge, and Indian Hill Court, 1000 E. Warrenville Road, Naperville. Membership is available to everyone who lives or works in Skokie, Morton Grove, Lincolnwood or Park Ridge. Membership is also open to employees of so-called select employee groups. Some of the credit union's largest select employees groups include Advocate Healthcare, United Healthcare and Lucent Technologies, according to the

credit union's Web site.

One of the advantages of working for a select employee group is that the credit union can arrange payroll deductions that are automatically deposited into a traditional, referred to as a share account, or Christmas savings accounts. ## Like It or Not, It's the Law

Here we are, with the April 15 tax deadline approaching, and I'm still getting mail from people who tell me that they are determined to fight the Internal Revenue

Service's "illegal" taxation on their income. They reject the information in one of my previous columns that the income tax is, undeniably, the law of the land and has been for 91 years — since the ratification of the 16th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution in February 1913. That amendment reads: "The Congress shall have power to lay and collect taxes on incomes, from whatever source derived, without apportionment among the several states, and without regard to any census or enumeration." Hiring people who say they can prove the amendment was never legally ratified, and defend you in front of the IRS is both foolhardy and foolish. Foolhardy because you won't win your

case, and it will cost you a lot of money paid to your advocate to find that out. It's also foolish because you not only will have to pay your taxes, but also hefty penalties and fees. And please, do not send me your "documentation" to back up your claim: It's not worth the paper it's written on. Take every legal step available to help you find allowable deductions, and after that, pay Uncle Sam what you owe.

Note to "New Author" — I have several writer friends who have sent their manuscripts and work notes to educational institutions, and many of them — but not all — were able to claim a deduction for these gifts. And, now that you have your first book on the press-

es, you'd like to know if donating your manuscripts and research notes to your alma mater can be deductible. The fact is, the IRS has tightened rules on deductions for donated intellectual properties and works of art in recent years. So it would be a good idea to work with a tax adviser who is knowledgeable in this area. Keep me posted on what happens, and send me a release on your book when it comes out.

Don't Make These Mistakes in Retirement

When you are starting out in your working life, or even when you're in the middle, you obviously don't want to make costly financial or investment mistakes. However, if you do, you'll generally have time to recover from most of them. But when you're entering retirement, or you've been retired for a while, you clearly have less margin for error. What are these missteps? Here are a few of the more serious ones:

• Not investing for growth — You can reasonably expect to live two or even three decades in retirement. And during all those years, inflation, even if it's relatively low, will erode your purchasing power. For example, if you start out with \$1,000, and we experience even a 4 percent inflation rate for the next 15 years, your purchasing power will shrink to just \$549. So, just to break even, you'd need your investments to earn at least 4 percent.

But even in retirement, you should earmark an appropriate portion of your portfolio for growth, based on your risk tolerance, time horizon and goals. How? By looking for high-quality stocks — those with strong earnings records, solid management and competitive products. Of course, even these stocks will fluctuate in value and are subject to market risks, but if you make them part of an investment mix that contains bonds, CDs and government securities, you can help smooth out your portfolio's overall volatility. Remember, though, diversification does not protect against market loss.

• Underestimating expenses — Many people assume that their expenses will drop drastically during retirement. But that's just not true. While some work-related expenses may indeed go down, other costs will fill the

void. You may decide to travel, remodel your home, buy a vacation home — the list is endless. Also, as you move further into retirement, your medical costs will almost certainly rise. If you do underestimate your living expenses, you may be forced to dip into your savings and investments more than you'd like. Furthermore, you might have to increase your taxable retirement-plan withdrawals — a move that could bump you into a higher tax bracket. The solution? Put a realistic "price tag" on your retirement — well before you retire.

• Withdrawing money from the "wrong" source — By the time you retire, you will have probably accumulated sizable sums in both taxable accounts (stocks, bonds, etc.) and tax-deferred accounts (IRA, 401(k)). When you start taking the money out, you may want to withdraw funds from the taxable accounts first, so you can let your tax-deferred accounts continue the opportunity for growth as long as possible.

• Taking a 50 percent late withdrawal penalty — Sooner or later, you'll have to take withdrawals from your traditional IRA or your tax-qualified retirement plan, such as a 401(k) or 403(b). If you don't start taking required minimum distributions (RMDs) once you reach age 70-1/2, you'll be penalized 50 percent of what you should have taken, plus ordinary income tax. However, at least in the case of your IRA, you do have a possible escape clause from taking RMDs. By converting your traditional IRA to a Roth IRA before you're 70-1/2, you'll pay taxes at the time of the conversion, but you won't have to take RMDs.

To avoid these and other problems, you may want to work with a financial professional to develop a plan that spells out, among other things, how much you'll need to accumulate for your chosen retirement lifestyle and where the money will come from. By taking action early, you can put yourself in position to enjoy all the possibilities that retirement offers.
