



The end of an era

Demolition begins on former Niles **Police Station**

The former Niles Police Station will be completely demolished in three weeks time, ending a forty-year period in the history of the Niles Police Department.

After the building is demolished, the rubble will be separated and hauled off for recycling. The soil will then be compacted to a density highenough to support a paved parking lot for the new building. The employee entrance and handicapped access ramps to the building will then be completed.

"We cannot finish the new building until the old one is demolished," said Niles Deputy Police Chief Dean Strzlecki. "We plan to have the parking lot and the new building totally complete by the end of June."

Niles Police watched the old

building's demolition begin this week with a mixture of nostalgia and hope for the future.

The police are getting acclimated to the new building, which is different from the old in more subtle ways than just

Village approves landscaped parking at MEC

Parking on the landscaped area around the Muslim Education Center (MEC) in Morton Grove will continue to be allowed through January 2005.

At their last meeting on Monday, Apr. 25, the Village Board decided that the parking that has been allowed on the grassy areas surrounding the MEC has been acceptable. The policy has been unpopular with some neighbors of the MEC who regard the grassy area as green

space for the community.

Parking will only be allowed on the landscaped area during Friday prayer services between 12:30 p.m. and 3:15 p.m.

"We've talked with the staff at the MEC and they've proven that they've instituted policies as to when it's appropriate to park," said Village Administrator Ralph Czerwinski. "They have people who monitor the landscaped area and they assess conditions before they allow parking."

Czerwinski said that, while the village has said it will allow parking on the landscaped area until January, that policy is open to review if it proves to be a problem. "If, for instance, they park on the landscaped area when it's wet and we start getting mud on our roads," he said, "then we may have to review the policy."

But he was confident that the MEC would act responsibly regarding the green space. "They don't want a rutted, muddy area either," said Czerwinski.

While parking is allowed for the prescribed hours, that doesn't mean those residents who are frustrated by the policy have to tolerate cars that are parked in violation of it.

"If residents see a car parked on the landscaped area and it's not during the prescribed times, then they should call the police," Czerwinski said. "They will write a report. The MEC would then be cited for a zoning violation."

Niles increases water rates New cell tenant

esidents of Niles will see an starting this June.

The Niles Village Board voted to increase water rates from \$3.33 per 1000 gallons to \$3.43 per 1000 gallons effective June 1. The money will cover increased cost of providing the water.

"The rate increase is necessary increased the price," said Niles Trustee Bart Murphy. "Even at the increased cost we still have one of the lowest water rates of the surrounding communities."

The village's water fund is a approximate \$10 a year break even fund which means that increase in their water bills the rates are only as high as necessary to cover the cost of purchase "What we charge for the water

covers the price of the water coming in and the delivery to the individual homes," said Assistant Village Manager Steve Vinezeano. "Some towns use their water servbecause the City of Chicago has ices as a money-maker but when we pass a rate increase we do it to make sure that the system pays for itself. Our policy is to provide residents with the lowest priced water

Public Activity Bond option extended

he Niles Village Board passed an countries ordinance at their meeting Tuesday, April 27 extending their right to issue Private Activity Bonds (PAB) until the first of the year.

When the village grants an PAB it essentially allows industry to borrow money at their low interest rate. The village does not have to guarantee any such loans nor does it lend any money

PABs are basically tools that municipalities employ in order to aid industries that might otherwise decide to leave either for other towns, states, or even ipality, or an industry.

"They basically help us lower the cost of financing for industry," said Village

Finance Director George Van Geem. Each year, municipalities can either sell their PAB option, issue it to a business, or grant their rights to another municipality.

The village's ability to issue PABs would have expired without the ordinance. The village has never had to pass an ordinance before because, by this time of year, the PAB option had already been exercised by them, another munic-

new tenant for a Nextel cellular phone tower behind the Niles Public Works Building on Touhy could bring as much as \$21,000 per year to the vil-

The current tower was built in 2001 by Nextel. Nextel rents the land for the footprint of the tower. Under a proposed plan, cellular phone provider T Mobile would lease space on the tower from Nextel. Land for a footprint would be leased from the vil-

No final rate has been agreed upon for the rent and because of the difference in the current Nextel and the proposed T Mobile agreement they won't be exactly the same, but Assistant Village Manager Steve Vinezeano said that they would receive a "very fair price" for the lease.

He added that it could be roughly comparable to the Nextel lease which nets \$19,331 per year.
