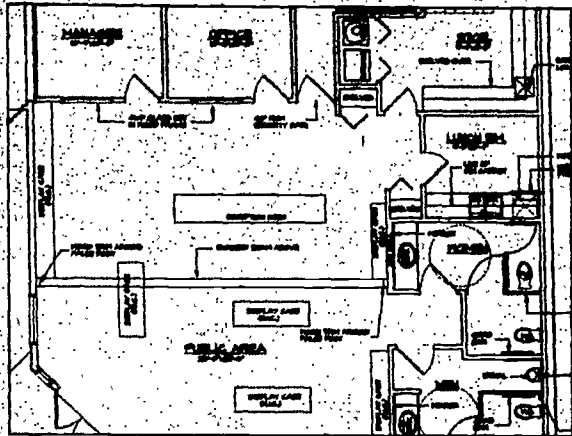

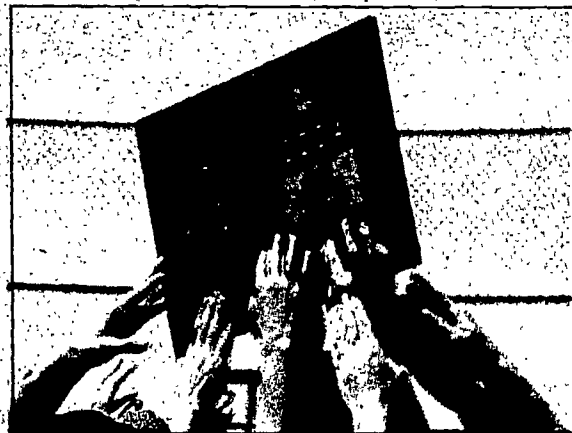

## District 63 tries again

### Voters asked for 40-cent increase in November

East Maine School District 63's Board unanimously approved a resolution that will put a referendum for a tax increase on November's ballot at their last meeting Thursday, June 3.

The referendum will ask voters for a 40-cent tax increase for every \$100 of Equalized Assessed Valuation (EAV). According to numbers generated for the failed March referendum, that will amount to about a \$130 per year increase for homes valued at \$150,000 and a \$278 per year increase for homes valued at \$300,000.

"There was some discussion as to the amount," said District 63 Director of Business Services Stacey Mallek. "But we're going with the 40-cent increase."

The same tax referendum was proposed on a ballot last March that failed to pass by a slim margin. Resulting cuts have, according to District 63 staff, significantly impacted students by increasing class size to 30 students, eliminating the band program, bi-lingual programs, and all extra-curricular activities including athletics, student council and battle of the books.

If the referendum is approved, the District will see an increase of \$3.9 million in their revenue. This will allow them to reinstate some of the program, Mallek said, but will not raise them to the level of services offered before cuts were made.

"Even if the referendum had passed we needed to make \$800,000 in cuts," Mallek said. "When considering what programs to reinstate the board will have to look at those programs that most directly affect the students."

The first to be considered, Mallek thinks, would be a decrease in class size.

## Village, MCC reach settlement for mosque, 201 parking spaces

### Right-of-way to be paved, equal land banked on Menard

The Village of Morton Grove and the Muslim Community Center (MCC) announced a settlement Tuesday that will allow the MCC to expand its school located at the corner of Theobald and Menard in Morton Grove to include a mosque that will accommodate approximately 525 worshipers. Under the settlement, the number of worshipers has been reduced from the originally proposed 598 and the size of the footprint has been decreased.

"With the increased parking and the reduced size we think it's a good match," said Village Administrator Ralph Czerwinski.

The new mosque/school called for in the settlement would have 201 parking spaces, 20 of which would be tandem. The tandem parking, Czerwinski said, has been moved away from the residential areas and will be used, primarily, by MCC staff.

"The original site planned called for the tandem parking to be placed adjacent to residences," said Czerwinski. "We think the new location is better."

Land will be banked for an additional 23 parking spaces should they be necessary at a later date. The parking plan projects that about 30 cars will be parked on the neighboring residential streets.

"That's an acceptable number," Czerwinski said. "Experience has shown us that the streets can handle it."

The land banked parking will be paved if the number of cars parked on residential streets exceeds 50 for four consecutive Fridays.

"We're all interested in

having more green space," said Czerwinski. "But we want to have a good parking plan as well."

In order to accommodate the parking, the village will allow the MCC to pave over the disputed Capulina right-of-way that some neighbors have been suggesting should be kept as green space. Under the settlement, land located off Menard equal to the square footage of the right-of-way will be set aside until the right-of-way's ownership is determined.

"If the courts decide that the right-of-way belongs to the village, then we'll do a land swap," said Czerwinski. "If they decide it belongs to the MCC, then the land on Menard will be theirs."

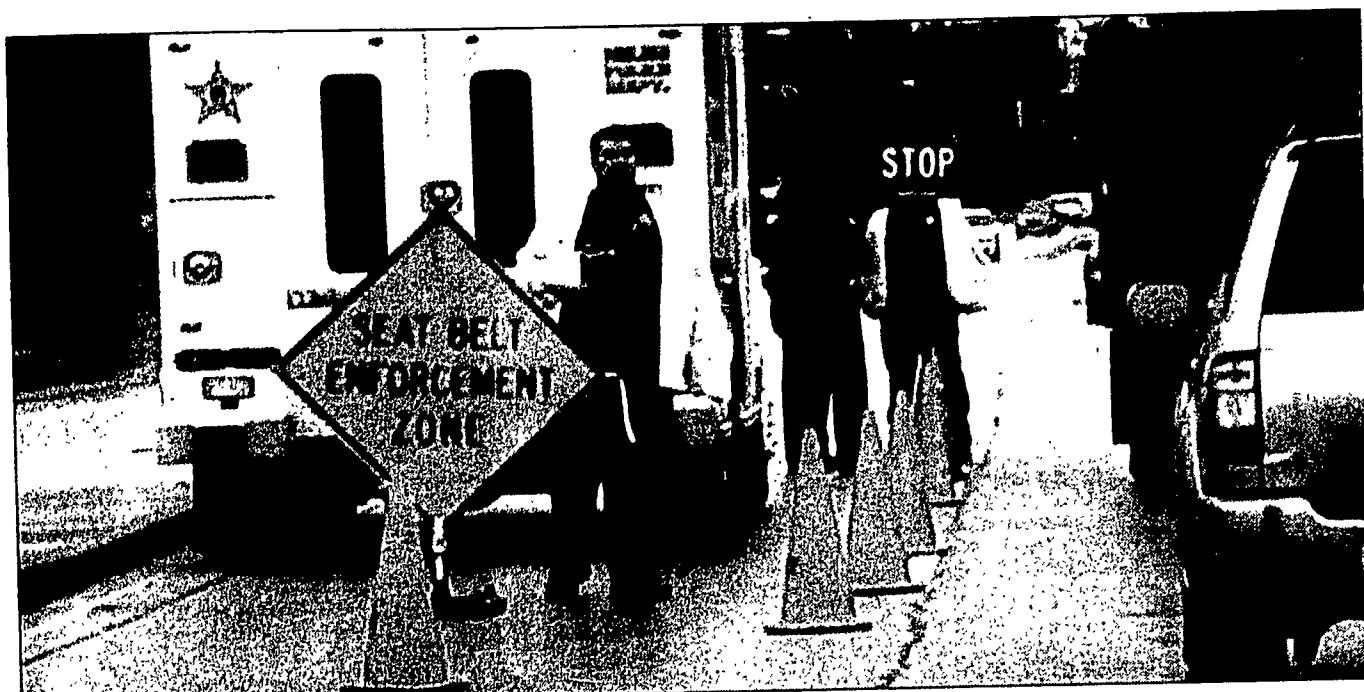
Czerwinski added that the MCC will allow the use of the green space by their neighbors.

While opponents have been calling the settlement a "done deal" for the last

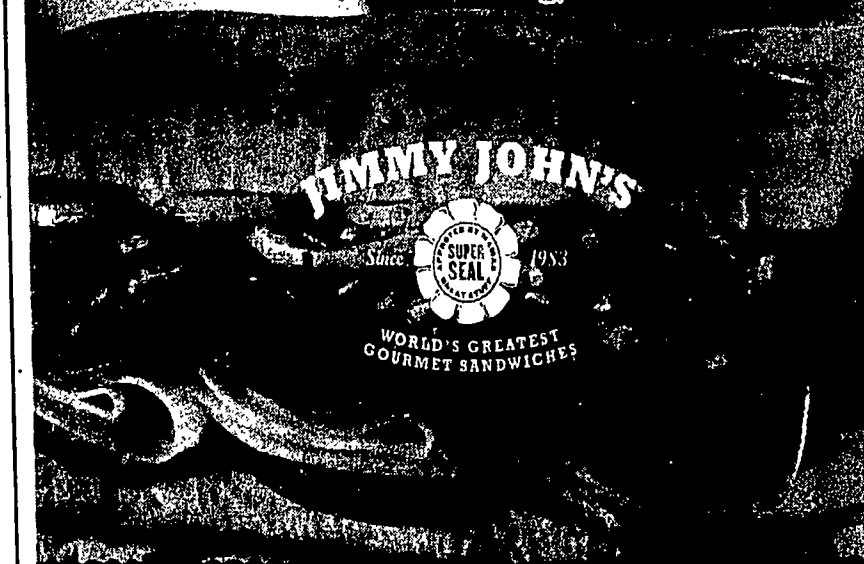

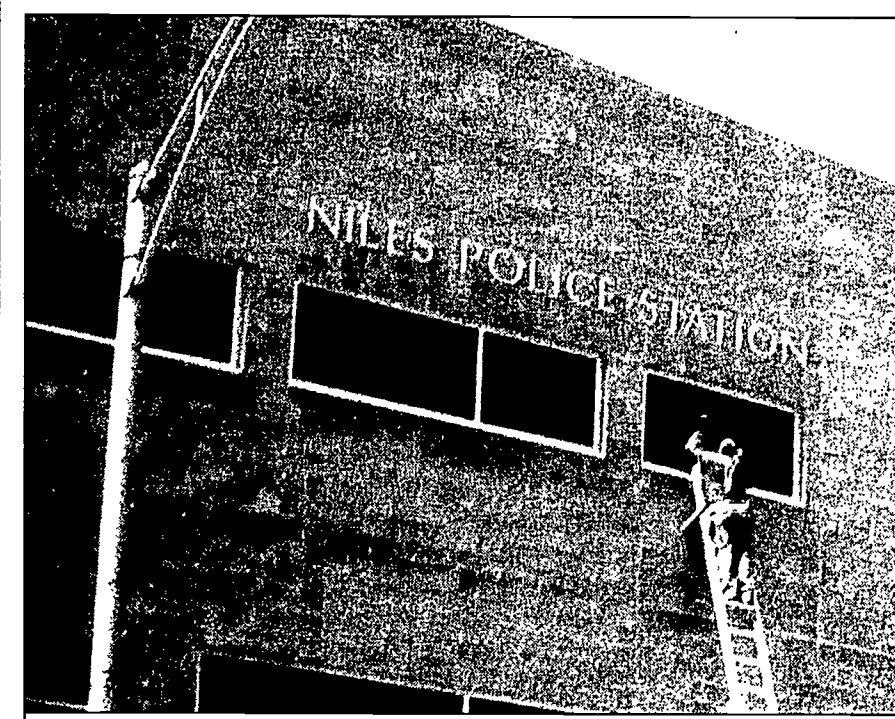

## Parks deploy AEDs

The Niles Park District has deployed life-saving Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) at three different sites. AEDs, which are currently being deployed throughout the country, deliver an electric shock to the heart, hopefully resuscitating victims of heart failure.

Each unit costs \$1,250. They are being deployed by the District at the Tam Golf Course, Oasis Water Park and Iceland Pool.

"The Board of Commissioners has approved the immediate purchase of AED Heart Defibrillators for Tam Golf Course, Oasis Water Park & Iceland Pool," said Park District Executive Director Joe LoVerde. "We have taken the first step to provide additional protection for our users at our heavily used locations. We will add several units each year, at a cost of \$1,250 each until we have a Defibrillator in every facility." The AEDs have saved lives at other Park Districts in the United States.

## Thanks for help with flooding

Dear Editor,

People who work in government are often taken for granted and are generally invisible to the public. They go about their jobs and work unnoticed until a natural disaster upsets the community and the preparedness of your government is tested. This was the situation when last month Maine Township was in the path of an unstable river. The ground was saturated by days of rain, causing the Des Plaines River to threaten us with damage to property and hazard to life itself. To the North, our Wheeling Township neighbors worked feverishly to stem the river's water by stacking thousands of sand bags along the river's banks. Their collective efforts ultimately averted disaster but meanwhile, the specter of flooding in our down river township

quickly loomed as a probability. The Mayor of Des Plaines, Tony Arredia, wasted little time as he called together a defense force to prepare for the cresting of this potentially dangerous waterway. His leadership and sheer will prepared Des Plaines for the worst. We salute his clear-headed guidance. However, even though their preparations for flood control were in place, history has shown that flooding often extends beyond the city of Des Plaines. The danger of flooding in other communities in our township set into place several historical actions. Notably, our township building became the command center for many agencies who gathered to share knowledge, assets and manpower. Representatives from various governmental levels and service organizations formed to battle the smaller tributaries of the Des Plaines River that back up in such circumstances. The Cook County agencies were available to all. The Sheriff's office was at the forefront of flood control and their personnel were at most sites filling and stacking sand bags, controlling traffic and

addressing public safety issues. The coordination of bags and sand distribution by Mike Menelle of the Cook County Highway Department to all affected municipalities was monumental. The Cook County Emergency Management Agency, under the direction of Kevin Phillips, showed a professionalism that inspired confidence in others. The Cook County Health Department was supportive and on hand to protect us from various dangers caused by polluted waters. The Cook County Forest Preserve personnel had boats available for rescue missions and the office of Cook County Commissioner Liz Gorman was at our disposal to expedite difficulties. We had the assistance of Ron Carlson from the Illinois EMA, Jon Duddles from the City of Des Plaines, Scott Saewert from Wheeling Township and Chief Rob Batey from the North Maine Fire Department. The Salvation Army was on the job, delivering sustenance to flood control volunteers and residents. They were all prepared for every eventuality. Several times each day, we received phone calls of sup-

port and offers of assistance from our legislators. They were in Springfield for Spring session yet our safety was a primary concern. A special thank you to State Senator Dave Sullivan and State Representative Elaine Nekritz for their encouragement. Locally, we cannot say enough about the preparedness of our Maine Township Staff, our EMA volunteers, CERT (Citizen's Emergency Response Team) volunteers and Maine Township Highway's workforce who took extraordinary measures to avert disaster. We recognize the tenacity of Maine Township EMA Director Bob Cohen and people such as EMA's Marv Michnik when he worked non-stop over several shifts. We are inspired by the energy of local CERT volunteers such as Dagmar Rutzen as she helped her neighbors. A special thanks goes out to Don Anderson, James Coursey, George Lampiers and George's son for their help. We specifically acknowledge the unsung heroes of our Highway Department. Pete Douvalakis, Mike Iacullo, Vito Selvaggi, Bill Yates and Foreman Robert Brzezinski

are the men who stepped up the pace and worked 24-hour shifts in preparation for any eventuality. These groups distributed approximately 400 tons of sand and 47,000 sand bags. The number of man-hours expended by everyone is incalculable, but the sense of community was tangible. Fortunately, the river receded and there was minor property damage in Maine Township but it showed us that we were prepared for this type of crisis. Like never before, our community came together to protect residents and property. We are gratified to be a part of such a dedicated group of professionals. In these times of public cynicism for government, we acknowledge, through this letter, the true guardians of the public. When it comes to self-sacrifice and dedication, public recognition for local heroes is called for. In these circumstances, the list of their names should never be too long or our gratitude too reserved.

The building that was built primarily to keep our Public Works truck warm and dry in the winter?

(And the then new Niles Public Works building wouldn't have had anything to do with that, would it?)

Doesn't this sound just like the Library space argument (that you rejected so soundly in November 2002 - when you WERE asked what you thought; but by a citizens referendum, not by the Council)? And that new-Library-based-on-space-needs wouldn't have had anything to do with the then new Niles Library expansion, would it? What are these folks thinking? Niles?

Whatever they're thinking, they're thinking they can get away with all this spending - in your name - because you're not saying a thing about all these "choices". Everything on this shopping list has been aired "in public". Everything has been passed in the clear light of day - but with the silence of the lambs.

I think we don't need no steenkin' new Police Station. What we especially don't need is to take yet more taxable property off the rolls.

What we DO need is more technology applied to law enforcement and public safety - more money, but much less than the cost of a new Police Station, and much better spent.

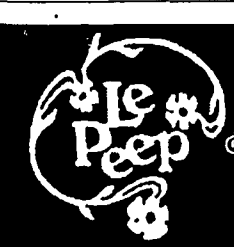

# Sheriff's Police charge two in home invasions

Bond has been set at \$750,000 each for two men charged by Cook County Sheriff's Police in a week-long crime spree in Maine Township that included a burglary and shootings during two home invasions, Sheriff Michael Sheahan announced today.

Juan-Carlos Vargas, 18, of 9612 Greenwood, Maine Township was charged June 2 with three counts of home

invasion, two counts of aggravated battery with a firearm and one count of residential burglary. Felipe Cantu-Solano, 34, of 8801 N. Dee, Maine Township was charged June 4 with three counts of home invasion and two counts of aggravated battery with a firearm.

The charges against the two men stem from three separate incidents in Maine Township, the most recent occurring,

police said, shortly after midnight on May 20. On that date, three men entered an apartment in the 8800 block of North Northshore, stealing a camera and two purses. When the 44-year-old male resident of that apartment confronted the men he was shot once in the chest and the offenders fled.

On May 17 the men entered an apartment in the 8900 block of Parkside shortly after

midnight, tied up the elderly couple living there and put them in a bedroom closet. One of the offenders shot at the floor near the couple and the woman's arm was grazed when the bullet ricocheted off the floor at her. The offenders stole jewelry and a small amount of money during the incident, police said.

According to police, on May 14 the two men admitted to breaking into an apartment in

the 8600 block of Golf and stealing a handgun, knife and stereo equipment. In this case, however, no one was home when the break-in occurred.

As of last Friday afternoon, a third person was in Sheriff's Police custody, pending charges in these same three incidents. Vargas and Cantu-Solano are scheduled to appear again in Court at the Skokie Court House on Friday, June 11 at 1:30 p.m.

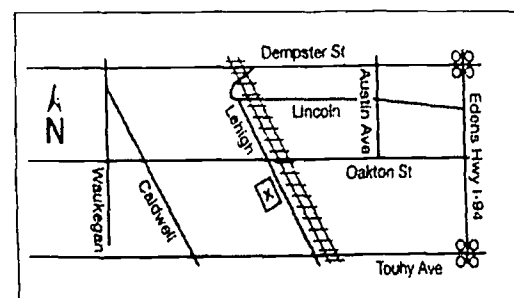

## Dollars and sense

### Record-Keeping Advice

One of the most prevalent questions found in the mailboxes of most financial columnists involves how long one should keep records of financial transactions. Here is what the experts recommend for the following four transactional areas:

1. Your Tax Records: The overall rule here is to keep them for as long as they may be needed in the event of an audit. Generally, the IRS has three years after your return has been filed or is due to examine it and assess whatever additional tax may be required. This is known as the three-year statute of limitations.

The statute expands to six years to cover a major error, such as not filing a return or omitting more than 25 percent of one's gross income. There is no statute of limitations for deliberately fraudulent

filings or failure to file at all. Uncle Sam can get you on this at any time.

Keep copies of all your tax returns permanently. Other documentation such as checks, income statements, deductions, etc., should be retained at least seven years after filing. Longer is better.

2. Investment Records: Keep them until the investment is completely liquidated — PLUS seven more years. Again, longer is fine.

3. Real Estate Investment Records: Keep them: PERIOD. That would include everything that involves property transactions, including purchases, sales, appraisals, tax depreciation schedules and substantiation for improvements to the property.

4. Individual Retirement Accounts: Keep all copies of Forms 5498, 8606, 1099R until money has been withdrawn from each of your accounts, plus three years — a length of time I call the "just in case" period. Remember: It's important that you have back-up documents to avoid being taxed on nontaxable withdrawals.

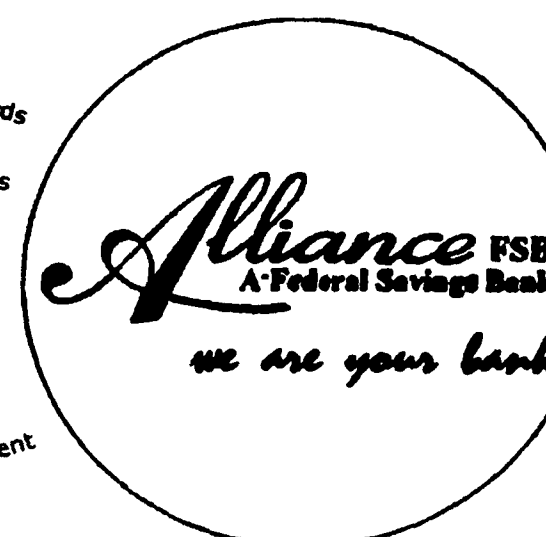
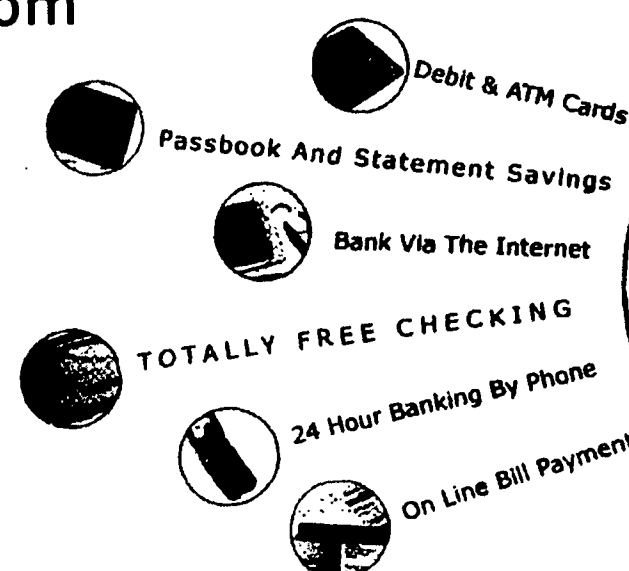

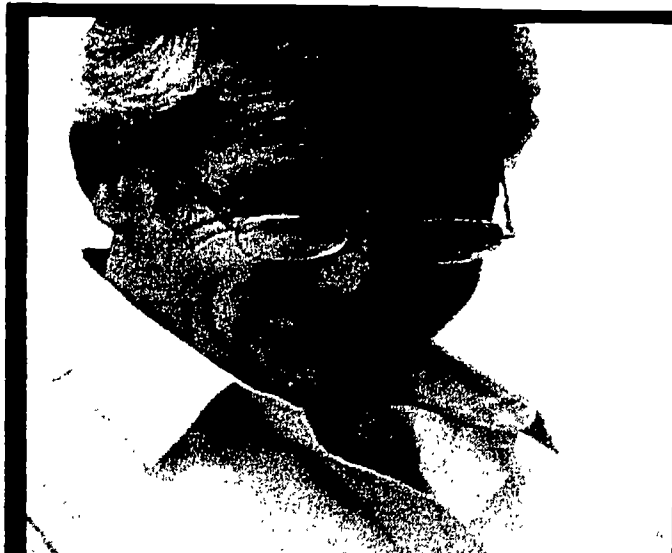

"We're already operating at a significantly decreased level," she said. "We're still strong in academics, but class size impacts that. I think that'll be something the board looks at if the referendum passes."

But the extra-curriculars are also important, Mallek said, as those programs attract residents to the area.

"Parents look at the academics and the extra-curriculars when they're selecting a place to live," she said. "They expect some of these

programs for their children and they could be a determining factor in whether a parent chooses to move in this area or the area next-door."

If the referendum passes in November, the District will have to wait until April to see the increased funds. That will allow them to reinstate some services for next year, but not for this year. Mallek predicts that an approved referendum would keep the District in sound financial condition through 2010.

## Dons forge on to State Finals

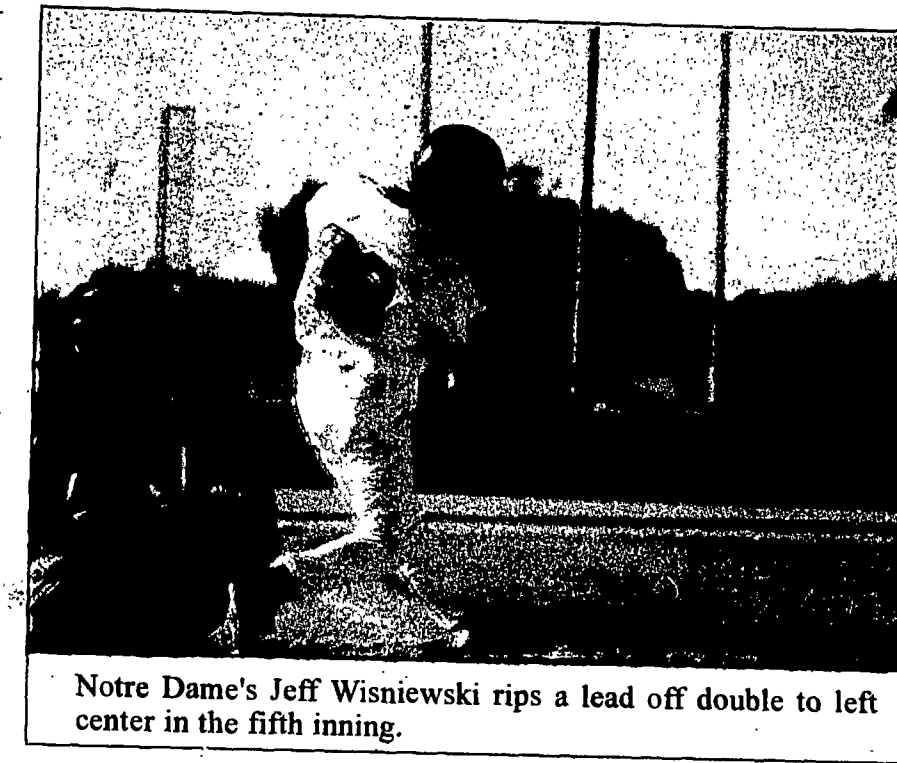

It is the second week in June and the Notre Dame Dons are still playing baseball for the first time in their school's history. The Dons knocked off traditional baseball power Oak Park 4-3 Monday at the UIC supersectional to advance to the state quarterfinals for the first time. An improbable playoff run, that included victories in the last five days against Loyola, Evanston and Oak Park has an ecstatic Coach Bob Kostuch and staff preparing for a Friday morning quarterfinal game against Normal.

Behind a spectacular pitching performance by junior Matt Kudlik, the Dons held off an Oak Park team that had threatened in the sixth inning, scoring three runs to make it a 4-3 game. Like he has done all year, Kudlik (9-2) didn't panic and threw strikes, striking out the last two hitters as he got stronger later in the game. A 12 strikeout, six hit, no walk performance by Kudlik was one of the best playoff performances by a Notre Dame pitcher.

"Kudlik was great on the mound again for us today. He had a no-hitter going for us up until the fourth inning and pitched another complete game. We scouted Oak Park's hitters after our sectional win and came in knowing we had to work their hitters away. Matt kept his curveball down and caught the corner with his fastball, striking out half of the players looking. Keenan Long had a great game behind the plate, those two really work well together. It was a well played game by both teams," said Kostuch.

The Dons got on the board first in the second inning as Joe Pauley hit a leadoff double and scored on Long's infield single. They scored their last three runs in the fourth on a John Kolakowski single that drove in Jason Infusino. Infusino led off the inning with a double.

Centerfielder Dean Cademartori followed that up with a two-run double to that staked Kudlik and Co. to a four run lead.

The key play defensively took place in the fifth inning as Kudlik turned a 1-6-3 double play to end another Huskie scoring threat, said Kostuch. "Matt's pitch count was getting high but we felt confident leaving him in there and our defense had played solid all game," he said.

"Their pitcher Rivera threw a great game, but we adjusted the second time around the order and hit the ball the opposite way. One through nine our hitters came up big today. We had a lot of fans that came out and supported us today and got behind Matt. The sophomore and varsity football teams cheered us on. It is just a wonderful feeling to be the first Notre Dame team to go to state," said Kostuch.

The Dons advanced to Monday's supersectional game by virtue of a 12-2 five-inning victory against an Evanston team that had knocked off previous No. 1 New Trier. Cademartori (9-1) picked up the complete game victory, allowing

five hits, seven strikeouts, and one walk. Pauley and Infusino had three hits a piece, and Pauley also had three runs batted in.

On a day that the wind was blowing in, the Dons defeated Loyola 5-2 in the sectional semifinals as Kudlik once again went the distance, striking out seven. The Ramblers left the tying run at the plate as Kudlik induced a deep fly-out that was 10 feet away from tying it up, thus sending the Dons to their first sectional final. The game was scoreless until the bottom of the fourth inning when the Dons touched home plate three times, once on a Kevin Mitchell single over second on a drawn in infield. Mitchell then scored on a Long fielding error at shortstop for a 3-0 advantage. Kudlik had four strikeouts of his last six outs to take the air out of the Ramblers.

The Dons are three wins away from their first baseball state championship this weekend at Elfstrom Stadium in Geneva. First pitch is at 11 a.m. Friday against Normal. If they win, they could face a rematch with Carmel in the state semifinals.

## Local Architect volunteers at Culver

The artwork on display at the Niles Fitness Center catches everyone's eye, but it led to more than just a passing interest with local architect Barbara Feldman. When Nakanishi saw the point-of-view drawings hanging in the center and realized they were the work of students at nearby Culver School she called up art teacher Barbara Feldman and offered her services.

"Her timing was perfect," said Feldman, "because I teach architecture in the fourth quarter." Nakanishi spent five days at the end of April teaching 28 eighth graders at Culver the art of architecture from a professional's point-of view. "If you're not in the profession there are a lot of terms you don't understand," said

Feldman. "I have some books on the subject, but having her here gave me more support to keep it going."

Nakanishi gave the students some special graph paper and asked them to draw the floor plan of their own home from memory. She acquainted them with the plans for the typical Niles bungalow that many of them know well, and she started them off working on plans for a log cabin. "She showed them all the tools of architecture like the drawing board, and special pencils and erasers, and the T-square," said Feldman. More than half the class created their own floor plans during the five day experience.

But it wasn't just her own profession that Nakanishi shared. The 27 year veteran of airport architecture urged all of the 8th graders to begin thinking about what they want to be when they grow up. As a child she

had no formal architectural training, but she told the class that when she played with her dollhouse she always wanted to put in a staircase. It bothered her that there was no way to go from floor to floor. That was her first clue that architectural drawing was in her future.

"Some of these kids have dads in construction or contracting or civil engineering," said Feldman. "So they could relate to the idea of building, but it was unusual for them to see a woman in this role." Nakanishi urged them to brainstorm career ideas and open up the possibilities as they move in to high school.

"It was wonderful the way she was willing to give her time like that," said Feldman. "It's hard to find good lessons in architecture. It's an area really neglected in art education."

## Build a Redwood Fence In Five Easy Steps



(NUI) - Fences are built for many reasons. Fences keep children or animals in the yard and define property lines. Fences also provide security and privacy, and complement other backyard amenities, like pools, spas and decks.

Redwood is often the material of choice for fences because it is durable, looks good, and resists warping, splitting and checking.

Many homeowners save money by building their own redwood fence. Fence building isn't difficult. Here are some tips for successful fence building from the California Redwood Association:

1. Designing the fence: Most redwood fences are variations of a simple post, rail and board design. The post and rail support structure is made of standard dimension lumber, while fence boards of different shapes and sizes give a fence its individual style.

2. Choosing quality materials: Most redwood fences are built with knot-textured "garden grades" of redwood. These rugged grades are economical and provide the best combination of performance and value. It is important to use noncorrosive nails and hardware to avoid

unsightly stains.

3. Setting redwood posts: Setting posts is the most critical part of the job. They must be straight and evenly spaced, which requires patience and lots of measuring. Construction Heart grade redwood is the right choice for fence posts because it resists decay and insects.

4. Attaching redwood railings: Two or three horizontal rails run between the posts, depending on the fence height. Upper rails should rest on the tops of the posts for support. Bottom rails can be toenailed into place, but the preferred method is to place a block underneath the joint for extra support. Use metal hardware, such as "L" brackets, to secure rails to posts.

5. Nailing redwood fence boards: Nailing the fence boards in place is the easiest and most

satisfying part of building a fence. Near the ends of the board, predrill holes before nailing to avoid splitting. For fence boards four inches wide or less, use one nail per bearing. For wider fence boards, use two nails.

But after a couple of days I noticed that the bat was back. One day, I had my vacuum cleaner in the area. I pulled out the hose attachment and put it up to the bat. He's never been back since. Between the sound and the unusual vacuum feeling, I don't think the bat will return — at least not to that window vent. I thought you might use this tip in your column. — Darlene W., via e-mail

A: That's a heck of a tip, Darlene! I've been fortunate not to have to deal with bats, although I've evicted quite a few mice, bugs, raccoons and snakes from houses in my lifetime. Bats, like other wildlife, can be difficult to chase away once

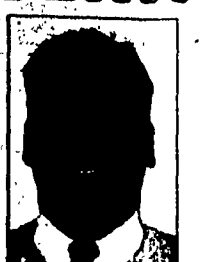

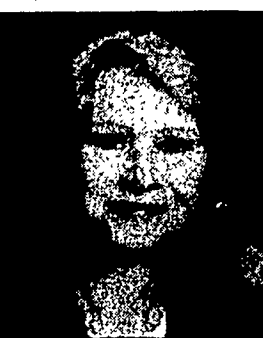

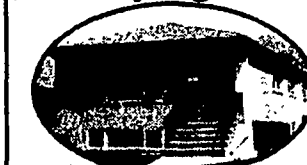

they've settled in. For these little guys, professionals will typically use either a chemical repellent to make the environment an undesirable one to live in, or an ultrasonic device that just annoys the heck out of the bats until they leave. A vacuum cleaner, while not ultrasonic, may produce sound vibrations that bats don't like. Of course, prodding them with the hose attachment might

speed things along, too.

However, I wouldn't recommend touching wildlife, except as a last resort. Small creatures like raccoons, squirrels and bats are just as likely to bite in self-defense as run away, and rabies is a danger, among other things. If common deterrents (like locking down garbage can lids and spritzing ammonia on surfaces commonly visited) don't

work, then removal is the next option.

Contact a wildlife removal specialist to handle unwelcome visitors. The professional will come out and set traps (usually "live traps," which capture the animal unharmed) and take away the offending varmint.

Some homeowners are determined to trap wildlife themselves — which is just fine as

long as one is willing and able to handle a cage containing a snarling raccoon or a hissing snake — and find a safe (and distant) place to release the creature. However, the fee charged by a licensed wildlife specialist is probably small in comparison to the time it takes to do this yourself, not to mention the risks.

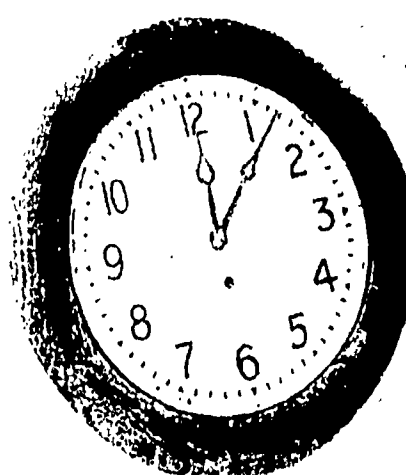

### Edward Jones What Do Falling Bond Prices Mean to You?

If you invest in bonds, you've probably gotten a rude jolt when you looked at your brokerage statements during the past month or so. That's because bond prices have fallen — fast and far. Should you be concerned? Maybe not as much as you'd think. In fact, if you're investing in bonds for the right reasons, you may have little to fear from falling prices.

**A little background**  
Two factors are largely responsible for the sudden drop in the bond market. First, big gains in employment have been reported in the past couple of months. The financial markets saw this hiring surge as the last major piece of an economic recovery that already included growth in retail sales, manufacturing, housing starts and consumer confidence. Historically, stronger economic growth has typically led to higher inflation — and higher inflation erodes the value of fixed-income investments, such as bonds. Consequently, bond prices have fallen in anticipation of rising inflation.

The second factor behind the slide in bond prices is the market's perception that the Federal Reserve will seek to combat inflation by raising interest rates, perhaps as soon as this summer. And when interest rates rise, bond prices fall. That's because existing bonds, with their lower interest rates, are less attractive to investors, than newly issued bonds paying higher rates.

**Reasons to hold bonds**  
Clearly, bond prices have fallen due to economic forces — not necessarily because there's anything "wrong" with your bonds. But that may not make you feel much better over the recent price decline. Should you sell your bonds to avoid further losses? Actually, you've got some good reasons to hold your bonds. Here are a few to consider:

• Return of principal — When you purchase high qual-

ity, investment grade bonds, you can expect to receive the principal amount (called "face value") back when the bonds mature.

• Regular interest payments — If you bought your bonds for the income, you have little reason to sell. Your interest payments will stay the same throughout the life of the bond, no matter if prices rise or fall as long as the bond issuer does not default.

• Portfolio diversification — If you're over-concentrated in one type of financial asset, your portfolio is vulnerable to big downturns if that one asset class takes a big hit. So, if your holdings are getting too stock-heavy, you'll want some bonds to lower your risk level.

**Build a bond "ladder"**  
As we've seen, you can achieve significant benefits by keeping your bonds. At the same time, you don't have to be victimized by ever-changing market interest rates. Instead, you can work toward building an "all weather" portfolio by creating a "ladder" of bonds with varying maturities.

When you construct a ladder, you can take advantage of all interest-rate environments. If market rates are low, you'll still have higher-yielding, longer-term bonds working for you (be aware of possible call features, though). And when market rates rise, you can reinvest the money coming due from your short-term bonds at the higher rates. Ultimately, a well-constructed ladder can help you smooth out your bond portfolio's yield.

**Look beyond your statement**  
You don't like to see the value of any of your investments decline. But by realizing that the reasons you bought your bonds are still valid, and by diversifying your bond portfolio through a ladder, you can look beyond the seemingly bad news of your monthly statement — and stay on track toward your important financial goals.

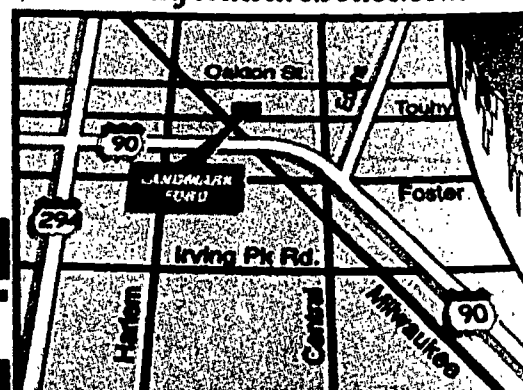
